Regulations of the Club

- Any boy or girl between the ages of 10 to 18 years, inclusive, may enter.
- 2. Enrollments close November 1.
- 3. Each club shall consist of at least five
- Each member shall procure a purebred broodsow of his own selection, breed and care for her and her litter according to instructions.
- Each member will receive instructions each month from the assistant state club leaders and extension specialists relative to the care and feeding of the sow and litter.
- Each member does his work, follows instructions, keeps a record, and makes reports. At the close of the project he makes his final report and writes a story.
- An exhibit shall consist of two pigs from the litter, same sex, accompanied by record, reports, and written story.
- With the same exhibit a member is entitled to compete for community, county, and state honors.
- Community or county sales will be held on or before December 1st to dispose of surplus stock.
