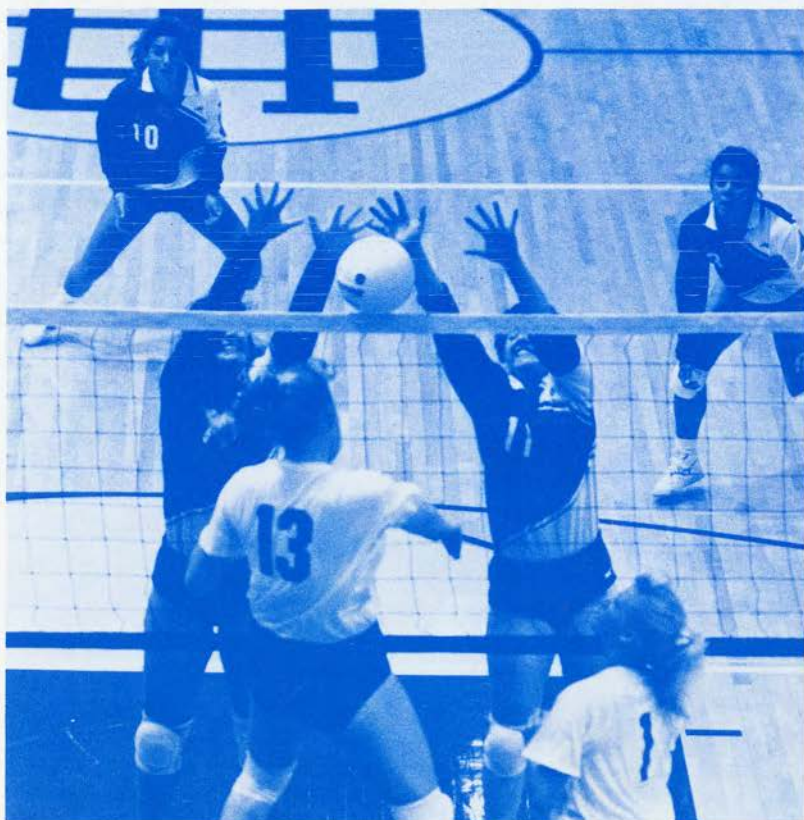

Al Schneider In Second Season As Head Coach

Al Schneider became South Dakota State's seventh volleyball coach when he was appointed to the position last August.

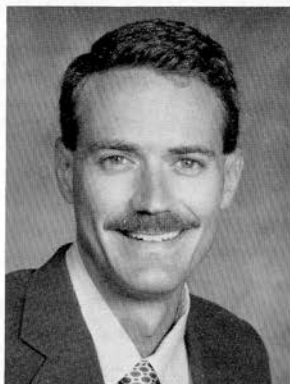
The Baylor University graduate brings a wealth of volleyball background and knowledge to the SDSU program.

He came to SDSU from Midwestern State University. In two seasons at the Wichita Falls, Tex., university, Schneider's teams had a 56-19 record. He earned NAIA South Region Coach of the Year honors in 1990 and was also NAIA District 8 Coach of the Year in both 1989 and 1990.

Schneider graduated from Baylor in 1988 with a degree in management and a minor in finance. He's now completing his Master's Degree in Physical Education.

Schneider has worked at all levels of volleyball from organizing a USVBA Junior Olympic club to preparing scouting tapes and reports for the USA men's Volleyball team prior to the 1988 Olympic games.

Ball control tops the list of his priorities when it comes to winning volleyball matches. His philosophy is simple - "If the other team can't put the ball on the floor, they can't win."



Sudbeck Back For Second Year As Graduate Assistant

Former Augustana standout Kim Sudbeck is in her second season as graduate assistant coach for the Jacks.

Sudbeck, an Augustana graduate, was on the Viking softball team which won the NCAA Division II national championship in 1991.

A Sioux Falls native, she coached high school volleyball for four years while attending Augustana.

Sudbeck's sister, Julie, is an outside hitter for the Jacks in volleyball and starting rightfielder on the 'Rabbits softball team.

Both Sudbecks were named to the all-North Central Conference and all-North Central Region softball team in 1991.

JACKS RETURN EIGHT LETTER WINNERS, ADD FOUR RECRUITS

Al Schneider's first season as head coach at South Dakota State University had a helter-skelter start.

He wasn't named head coach until after practice was scheduled to begin in August. Consequently, it was an on-the-job-training situation from the start.

Now, he has a year in the system, eight returning letter winners, and four new recruits to start his second season.

Graduation claimed two four-year starters from last year's 16-17 team, setter Gail Ahlquist (honorable mention all-North Central Conference 1990 and 1991) and hitter Shannon Kalbfell.

While Kalbfell led the team in kills last season, freshmen April Swanson and Sarah Storms were second and third with 253 and 246 respectively.

And Kalbfell's loss could be offset by the return of Lisa Freichels, who led the team in kills, with 409, as a sophomore in 1990, then missed last season with an injury.

Replacing Ahlquist won't be easy. She holds all the school records for assists and had 1,092 of the 1,184 assists by the Jacks last year. Senior Linda Fusco is a three-year letter winner at setter while the incoming freshmen include 5-8 Jenni Dold, from Tracy, MN.

Swanson, at 6-1, is the only returnee over six-foot, but Schneider's first recruiting class landed two more at 6-1, Amy Fottrall from Cedar Rapids, IA, and Ericka Mollner from Plymouth.

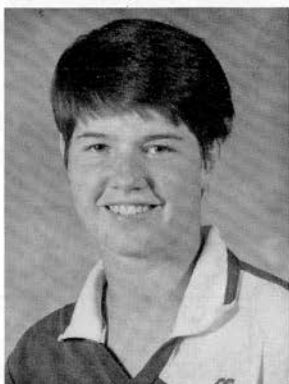

SDSU Is Charter Member Of North Central Conference

South Dakota State University is a charter member of the North Central Conference, an NCAA Division II league with ten members spread over five states.

The league was formed in the fall of 1921 when representatives of colleges and universities from South Dakota, North Dakota, Minnesota, Iowa and Nebraska met in Chicago to consider the formation of a conference. First official competition had teams from South Dakota State, University of South Dakota, North Dakota State, University of North Dakota, Nebraska Wesleyan, Morningside College, Creighton University, College of St. Thomas and Des Moines University.



Early competition involved just three sports: football, basketball and track. The NCC now determines championships in 20 sports including ten for women. Women's championships are decided in cross country, golf and volleyball in the fall; basketball, indoor track and swimming in the winter; softball, outdoor track and tennis in the spring.

Athletically, the league has enjoyed tremendous success in a variety of sports. Last year, two NCC teams qualified for the NCAA Division II Elite Eight in volleyball, North Dakota State and Northern Colorado. In 1991, conference members won four NCAA Division II national championships including softball and basketball for the women. SDSU has won two national titles in women's cross country.

Noel Olson, former athletic director at St. Cloud State, became the league's fourth commissioner during the summer of 1984. The NCC provides weekly statistical reports. During the past summer, the NCC hired its first full-time assistant commissioner, Melanie Heitman.



About South Dakota State University

South Dakota State University was founded by the Territorial Legislature on February 21, 1881, and is currently the largest college or university in the state with an enrollment of 8,090 for the 1991 fall semester.

SDSU is one of 68 Land Grant colleges and universities in the United States, a designation stemming from the Morrill Act of 1862. The purpose of this so-called Land Grant College Act are:

"...the endowment, support and maintenance of at least one college where the leading object shall be without excluding other scientific and classical studies, to teach agricultural and mechanical arts, in order to promote the liberal and practical education of the industrial classes in the several pursuits and professions of life."

The Enabling Act, approved February 22, 1889, admitted the State of South Dakota to the United States and provided 120,000 acres of land be granted for the use and support of the Agricultural College. By the Enabling Act of 1889, Congress also granted South Dakota an additional 40,000 acres for the Agricultural College in lieu of a grant that had been made to new states in 1841.

The first building was constructed in 1883 with classes beginning on September 24, 1884.

In 1923, the Institution's instructional program was organized under five divisions: Agriculture, Engineering, General Science, Home Economics and Pharmacy. In 1956, the sixth undergraduate division, Nursing, was created, and in 1957 all graduate study was organized into a graduate division.

The "University" organization was formally recognized when the Legislature changed the name from South Dakota State College to South Dakota State University on July 1, 1964. At that time, the following colleges were created: Agriculture and Biological Sciences, Arts and Science, Engineering, Home Economics, Nursing and Pharmacy, as well as the Graduate School.





In 1974, the College of General Registration was established to provide assistance to students who were undecided as to major, are pre-professional or who want a one or two year general personal studies program.

In 1975, the Division of Education was created to provide greater recognition of the part the University plays in preparation of teachers, counselors, and administrators for primary and secondary school systems and higher education.

SDSU also carries out a vigorous program of research through the Agricultural Experiment Station, organized in 1887 under the Hatch Act of Congress, and has an ambitious program in continuing education through the Cooperative Extension Service. Federal funds are appropriated through the U.S. Department of Agriculture, which cooperates with state colleges of agriculture and counties in conducting planned programs of Extension work. In addition to a state staff of specialists, county offices are maintained throughout the state to provide information concerning agriculture, home and family, 4-H Club work and the community.

Control of the education institutions of the state is vested in the Board of Regents, while financial support comes from the state Legislature.

Brookings, the home of SDSU, celebrated its 100th birthday during the summer of 1979. A growing community located in East Central South Dakota, Brookings has a population of 16,000. It is located 20 miles west of the Minnesota border about halfway between the Nebraska and North Dakota borders. The city is named after Wilmot W. Brookings, a native of Woolwich, Maine, who helped settle the area ... although he had returned east when the community named after him sprang up.

If you are a hunting enthusiast or just a lover of the outdoors, you will find some of the finest waterfowl and upland game hunting plus nature areas just a few miles from Brookings. The Lake Whitewood region, to the west, is considered a goose hunting haven. Other game birds in the area include South Dakota's famous ringneck pheasants and Hungarian partridge. Several nearby lakes as well as the Sloux River provide splendid fishing opportunities and are also excellent for canoeing, practicing your wildlife or nature photography, or simply observing the song birds, small animals and deer in their native habitat.

ROBERT T. WAGNERPRESIDENT

Dr. Robert T. Wagner became president of South Dakota State University in May of 1985 and has demonstrated extraordinary leadership skills. Wagner had been vice president of Dakota State College in Madison when he was named to head SDSU. The 54-year-old Wagner is a native of Sioux Falls, a graduate of Washington High School and Augustana College (1954). After attending Augustana, he earned a degree in theology and education from Seabury Western Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill., and is an ordained Episcopalian priest. He was rector of the Holy Apostles Episcopal Church in Sioux Falls and later the Trinity Episcopal Church in Watertown before joining the SDSU staff in 1970. He spent 14 years at SDSU and from 1981 to 1984 was assistant to the vice president for academic affairs. He earned a Doctorate in sociology at SDSU in 1972. He has done extensive research on the elderly in South Dakota and on population projections for the state. Wagner's wife, Mary, is a Republican state legislator from Brookings County. The couple has two grown children.



FRED OIENATHLETIC DIRECTOR/HEAD OF HPER

Dr. Fred Oien became the 11th athletic director at South Dakota State University July 1, 1990. Oien earned his Bachelor's Degree at SDSU in 1972 and has been on the SDSU staff since 1979, serving as athletic business/ticket manager since 1981. Oien is a 1968 graduate of Baltic, SD, High School. He added a Master's Degree at SDSU in 1975, then completed his doctorate (Ed.D) at the University of Massachusetts-Amherst in 1979. Oien taught physical education and health at the Brookings Middle School 1973-76, during which time he was varsity golf coach for both boys and girls, and middle school basketball and football coach. His golf teams won state championships for both boys and girls. Oien was also women's golf coach at SDSU, guiding the Jacks to one North Central Conference championship. The SDSU women's golf team of 1982 was voted South Dakota Women's College Team of the Year. Oien, and his wife, Mary, have two children.



MARGARET AMUNDSONATHLETIC TRAINER

Margaret is in her fourth year as assistant athletic trainer in charge of women's athletics at South Dakota State. A Dell Rapids native, she attended SDSU, graduating in 1979, then added a Master's Degree in physical education, specializing in sports medicine, from Indiana State in 1980. She was head women's athletic trainer at Bemidji State from August, 1981, until she became head athletic trainer at Augustana College in August, 1982. She worked at the Brookings Sports Medicine Center until joining the SDSU staff in August, 1988. Amundson was an athletic trainer at the Olympic Sports Festival in Baton Rouge, LA., in 1985, and was physical fitness director at Sioux Valley Wellness Center August, 1982, to July, 1984. Margaret's father, Jim Schmidt, is a member of the Jackrabbit Sports Hall of Fame and her husband, Mark, was a two-time North Central Conference medalist in golf. Mark is now director of the Brookings Sports Medicine Clinic. The couple has one son.
