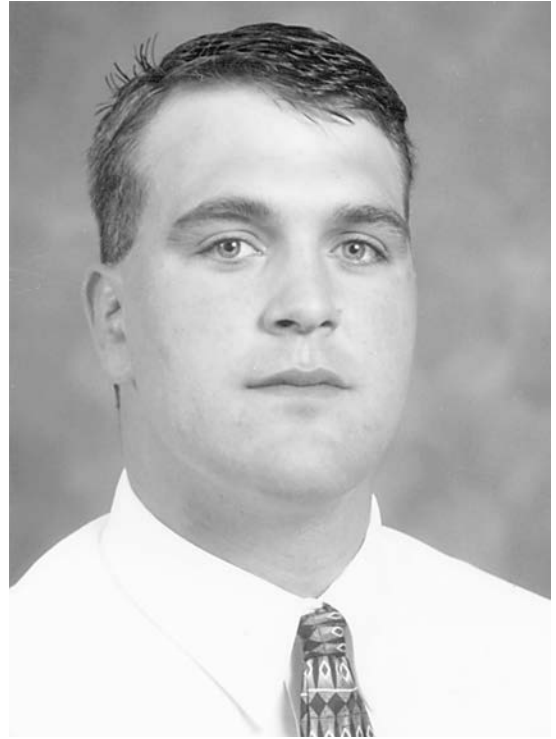


• JACKS FACTS •

Pat Dorn, a two-time national champion at SDSU, and Greg Schmidt are the only Jackrabbit wrestlers to earn All-America honors in Division I. Dorn placed seventh in 1988 and Schmidt placed fifth in 1970.

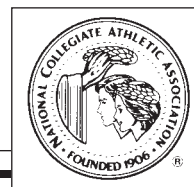

SDSU has had more athletes, 35, than any other team in the country selected Academic All-America since the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches Association began selecting the team in 1986.

• JACKRABBIT COACH JASON LILES •

Where Jason Liles has gone, success has followed.

After winning two NAIA national championships at Montana State University-Northern (formerly Northern Montana), he was named head coach at South Dakota State prior to the 1993-94 season and has promptly established SDSU as one of the powers in NCAA Division II.

And the Jacks are still climbing the upward ladder.

Last season, SDSU finished third in the conference and second in the nation — the school's best finish ever. The Jacks cruised to a 17-4 record, which tied a school record for most victories in a season. In addition, the Jacks had two individual national champions (Ryan Resel and Travis King) and five All-Americans.

Under Liles' reign, the Jackrabbits have been second, fourth, fifth, fourth and fourth at nationals.

In the 1996-97 season, SDSU won the NCC title — the first since 1980, as Liles was named Coach of the Year in the conference. After coming within 1.5 points of NCC champion Nebraska-Omaha a year earlier, the Jacks eliminated the suspense early in the '97 putting six wrestlers in the finals of the conference tournament in Grand Forks. It translated to an 80-65 victory over the runner-up Mavericks.

In 1993-94, Liles took over the South Dakota State wrestling program and promptly guided the Jackrabbits to a fourth place finish in the NCAA Division II tournament. That marked the highest national finish for the Jacks in 25 years and the first time ever that SDSU had two individual national champions (Chad Lamer at 177 and Justin Blasius at 190) in the same season.

Liles, known for his intense work ethic, came to SDSU after a nine-year stay at MSU-Northern in Havre, MT. During his tenure there, he guided MSU-N to the very top of the NAIA wrestling world.

Over the last four seasons at Northern, his teams sandwiched back-to-back national championships (1991 and 1992) around a pair of national runnerup finishes (1990 and 1993).

His teams at MSU-N won NAIA District 12 championships in 1988, 1990, 1991 and 1992. During his career at MSU-N, he coached six individual national champions including the wrestler voted Outstanding Wrestler at the 1990 national tournament, and produced 48 All-Americans.

And his teams produced eight academic All-Americans, with the team showing a 3.00 cumulative grade point

average for 1987-1993.

In dual meet competition, Liles' teams were 89-33 while competing against such teams as the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Purdue University, University of Wisconsin-Madison, and NCAA Division II powers North Dakota State, University of North Dakota and Nebraska-Omaha.

Prior to joining the staff at MSU-N, Liles was assistant wrestling coach at Miami University in Ohio (1981-84). He played an integral part in developing three NCAA Division I All-Americans. Miami won the Mid-America Conference title in 1984 and had an alternate to the 1984 USA Olympic Freestyle team.

Liles was head coach Arcadia High School in Arcadia, Ohio, for two seasons, producing back-to-back Blanchard Valley Conference championships in 1980 and 1981 when his teams were 20-6 in duals.

Liles is a 1979 graduate of Bowling Green State University in Ohio where he was chosen Most Valuable Wrestler his last three seasons (1977-79). A four-year letterman and starter, he left Bowling Green as the winningest wrestler in the university's history. Liles added a Master's Degree from Miami University in 1982.

He is married to the former Holly Dees of Kremlin, MT. They have two sons, Walker and Hunter.

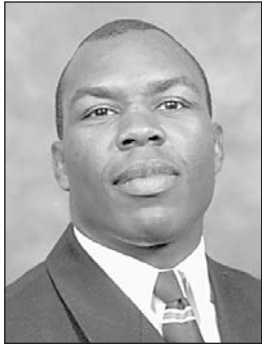

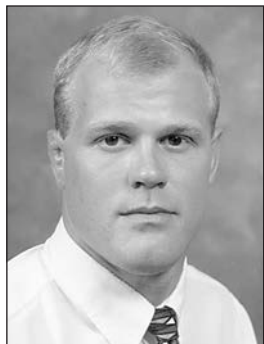


Pat had an outstanding career as a Jackrabbit wrestler, capping his career off last season with a third-place finish at the NCAA Division II wrestling championships.

The Huron native compiled a 83-42 record at SDSU, placing at nationals twice. As a freshman, Timm placed fourth in the North Central Conference tournament, and he

followed that up with a second-place finish as a junior and a third-place finish last year as a senior.

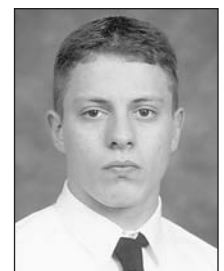

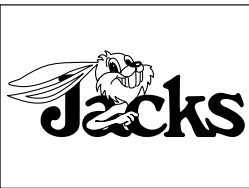

Wrestlers aim to continue winning ways

The South Dakota State University wrestling team had a breakthrough year last season, but that seems to be an annual achievement for the team.

The Jackrabbits expect this year to be no different.

"I think it was a huge step for our program last year," coach Jason Liles said. "We just had so many successes, with two national champions, five All-Americans, second place in the nation."

The Jackrabbits finished the season 17-4, which tied a school record for most wins in a season. The team punctuated its stellar dual season with a third-place finish in the North Central Conference and a second-place finish at nationals — the best finish ever by an SDSU wrestling team.

Gone from last year's team are Travis King (national champion at 150), Pat Timm (third-place All-American at 177), Howard Fullhart (13-9), Troy Risdal (13-5), Nathan Godfrey and Glen Peterson (14-7).

But the Jackrabbits return a host of experienced wrestlers who will make SDSU one of the top teams in Division II. The Jackrabbits aren't talking about how they hope to finish in March, however.

"We don't talk about conference titles. We don't talk about national titles. We talk about individual performing and doing the best they can to compete," Liles said. "It's understood that that's the goal (national championship) of the program. It doesn't have to be talked about."

The Jackrabbits have three returning All-Americans in Ryan Resel, Chad Wickman and Paul Konechne. Resel could easily shatter a handful of school records this season, while matching former SDSU wrestler Chad Lamer's achievement of winning three straight national titles.

"He can blow away almost all the records — almost every career record that Lamer has," Liles said.

Wickman won another conference title last year and took fourth at nationals with a 37-6 record this year. Wickman has a legitimate shot at winning a national title at 125. Konechne was only the fourth wrestler in school history to place at nationals as a true freshman. The Kimball native will once again be a force this year at 141.

Liles hopes juniors Lance Thury and Elbert Andress will rise to the occasion this season. Thury was 16-5 as a 177-pounder last season, while Andress was 13-9 at 190. Thury will start at 174, with Andress starting at 184.

"Those are two juniors that we hope will step up, which will help our cause," Liles said.

Liles also is expecting good things from senior Aaron Althoff, who was 12-18 last season but came on strong at the conference meet and finished sixth.

The Jackrabbits picked up transfer Scott Braun, who left the University of North Dakota after the school dropped its wrestling program. Braun would have been a conference and national champion in 1997, but former SDSU wrestler Adam Feldman beat him in the championship match of both meets. Braun will start at 133, but sophomore Ryan O'Connor had a great freshman season and will see some time in that class.

Sophomore Curt Brown, a transfer from Iowa State, and freshman Aaron Veskrna from Gregory will battle it out at 149. A trio of freshmen, Kayle Dangerud, Toby Bryant and Ryan Yoder will compete for the starting spot at 157. Freshman BJ Jones has the starting spot at 197.

"Because we have some new guys in there, I foresee with our toughness of schedule, we're going to take some lumps early in the year, but hopefully by January we'll see some improvement," Liles said.

The Jackrabbits' schedule is as tough as they come, with duals against three Division I schools, Iowa, Nebraska and Wyoming. "It's probably our toughest schedule since I've been here. We have been so fortunate to dual Iowa three times out of the last four years," Liles said.

And SDSU's overall schedule is about as difficult as its North Central Conference competition.

Nebraska-Omaha returns everyone from last season's team that finished second in the conference and sixth at nationals. The Mavericks also have the luxury of hosting nationals this season. Liles also expects North Dakota State and Mankato State to be top conference teams.

"Our conference could potentially have four to five teams in the top seven (at nationals)," Liles said.

• SDSU WRESTLING TRADITION •

'98-99 marks the 50th year of SDSU wrestling

South Dakota State University wrestling is 50 years old this year, and the program's tradition is as rich as anywhere in the conference.

Consider what Jackrabbit teams have done since they started competing in NCAA tournaments in 1964. They have been top-10 finishers 27 times, dating back to Warren Williamson's 1964-1965 squad. That is more than any school in the nation.

The Jackrabbits have had 99 All-Americans, and they are the only team to have two wrestlers achieve All-American status four times. Mike Pankratz and Brian Loeffler both became four-time All-Americans in 1992-93.

The Jackrabbits also have won more individual conference titles than any other school in the league.

The list of Jackrabbit standouts — past and present — is long. The Jackrabbits have had national champions in the last four decades, starting with Dee Brainerd in 1963. Since then, wrestlers like Rick Jensen, Jeff Hohertz, Pat Dorn and Ryan Resel, to name a few, have added to SDSU's tradition.

In recognition of a half-century of rich tradition, the SDSU wrestling program and sports information office has come up with an All-Time SDSU Wrestling Team. The wrestlers in bold are starters; the rest are honorable mention. Two wrestlers, Chad Wickman and Ryan Resel, have a chance to add to their national-tournament resume this year.

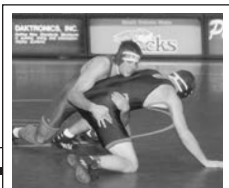

• ABOUT SDSU •

EARLY HISTORY

South Dakota State University, the state's land grant institution, was authorized in 1881 by the Territorial Legislative Assembly. Territorial council member John O'Brien Scobey, failing to obtain the penitentiary for Brookings, managed to secure Dakota Agricultural College for his city.

Although allocations fell short of the actual cost, the school was able open in the fall of 1884 because the president, George Lilley, was willing to advance \$500 (one third of his salary) to finish three rooms in the new Central building. "Old Central" was soon joined by South (1885) and North (1887), forming the nucleus of campus activities for a decade and a half.

DEVELOPMENT

During the first year of operation, only preparatory classes were held. College classes started in 1885 with 5 teachers and 17 freshman and 61 preparatory students. Growth was slow and erratic for many years, but by the turn of the century there were 242 students. By 1990 SDSU had an enrollment of over 9,000 students with nearly 8,100 at the Brookings campus. It has granted over 46,500 degrees since the college was chartered in 1881.

COLLEGES ESTABLISHED

The structure of the college became more complex as enrollments increased. The first nine chairs of instruction established in 1884 included agriculture, science, mathematics, English, modern languages, military tactics, veterinary science, practical business, political and domestic economy, and music. By 1907, the year the name of the institution was changed to South Dakota State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, there were 22 departments on campus. Reorganization into the five divisions which formed the basis for the designation of colleges was completed under President Charles W. Pugsley in 1923. In 1964, when "State College" was renamed South Dakota State University, there were six colleges - Arts a Science, Agricultural and Biological Sciences, Home Economics, Engineering, Nursing, and Pharmacy and a Graduate Division. A seventh, General Registration, was added later. In 1975 the Division of Education was created, which became the College of Education and Counseling in 1991.

271 ACRE CAMPUS

South Dakota State University has grown from a campus of eighty acres when the institution was founded by the Territorial Legislature in 1881, to a 271 acre campus with facilities worth over \$220 million. The University owns or leases another 15,000 acres of land for research throughout the state.

SOUTH DAKOTA'S LARGEST

With 8,162 students registered for the Fall of 1997, enrollment at SDSU continues to be the largest of all the state's institutions of higher education.

More than 200 majors, minors and options are available with more than 2,500 different course offerings. Master's degrees are offered in more than 30 areas, and doctorates are available in eight fields. The University also offers degree programs through the Sioux Falls Center for Public Higher Education. Evening, RDTN, Internet, and off-campus courses are available through the Office of Academic Affairs and Outreach.

Seventy-five percent of entering freshman are in the upper-half of their high school graduating class and 40 percent are in the top 25 percent. Seventy percent are residents of South Dakota, 20 percent come from 46 states and 41 international countries.

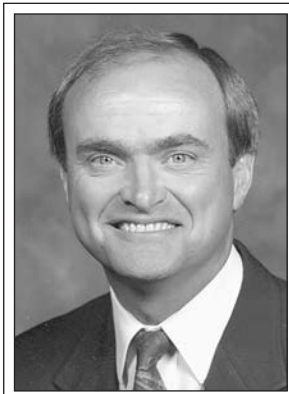


PEGGY GORDON ELLIOTT

Peggy Gordon Elliott became South Dakota State University's eighteenth president on January 1, 1998 following the retirement of Robert T. Wagner.

Before becoming president of SDSU, Elliott was a senior fellow and acting vice president for Academic and International Programs at the American Association of State Colleges and Universities in Washington, D.C. She has extensive higher education leadership experience at The University of Akron, where she served as president from 1992 to 1996, and Indiana University Northwest, where she was chancellor from 1983 to 1992.

Elliott earned her doctorate in secondary education from Indiana University, her master's in English and secondary education from Northwestern University, and her bachelor's in English from Transylvania University. She taught high school in Gary, Indiana, and moved into various teaching and administrative positions in the Indiana University system. She amassed a broad range of national experience and made extensive contacts in the Washington community.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR/HEAD OF HPER

Dr. Fred Oien became the 11th athletic director at South Dakota State University July 1, 1990.

Oien earned his Bachelor's Degree at SDSU in 1972 and has

been on the SDSU staff since 1979, serving as athletic business/ticket manager since 1981.

Oien is a 1968 graduate of Baltic, SD, High School. He added a Master's Degree at SDSU in 1975, then completed his doctorate (Ed.D) at the University of Massachusetts-Amherst in 1979.

Oien taught physical education and health at the Brookings Middle School 1973-76, during which time he was varsity golf coach for both boys and girls, and middle school basketball and football coach. His golf teams won state championships for both boys and girls.

Oien was also women's golf coach at SDSU, guiding the Jacks to one North Central Conference championship. The SDSU women's golf team of 1982 was voted South Dakota Women's College Team of the Year.

Oien, and his wife, Mary, have two children.
