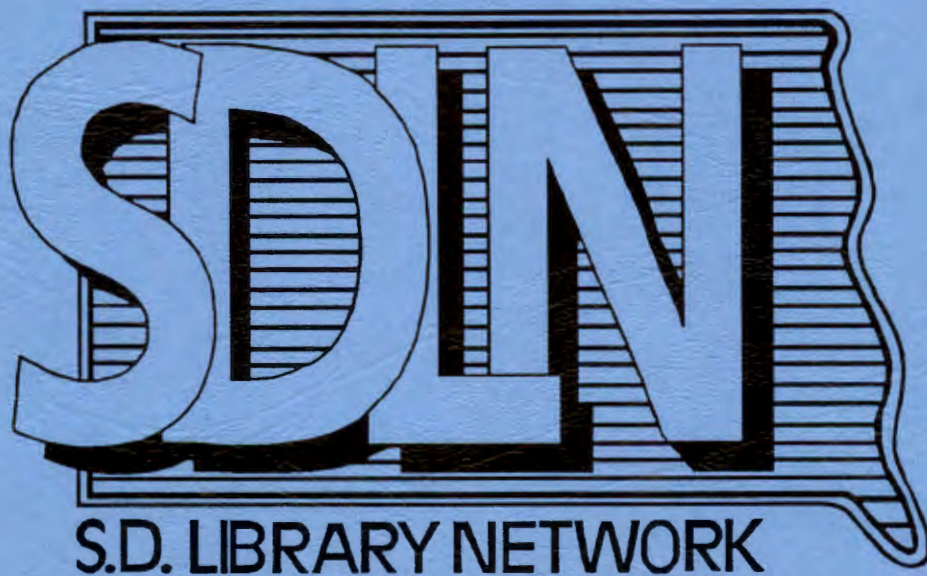

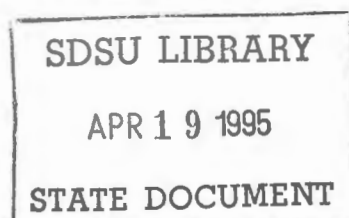

SDLN Highlights of 1994

- Added seven Full Member Libraries, from 33 to 40 . . . an increase of 21%.
- Averaged over 2,000,000 transactions per month, an increase of 28%.
- Added five new reference databases, providing access to periodical indexes in addition to books.
- Began providing Internet access to four additional library collections including the Library of Congress and the University of Minnesota.
- Investigated ways to improve access to South Dakota information, including the addition of the *Sioux Falls Argus Leader Index* to the SDLN System.
- Laid plans to begin using the Internet to reduce costs and speed up data transmission of SDLN.

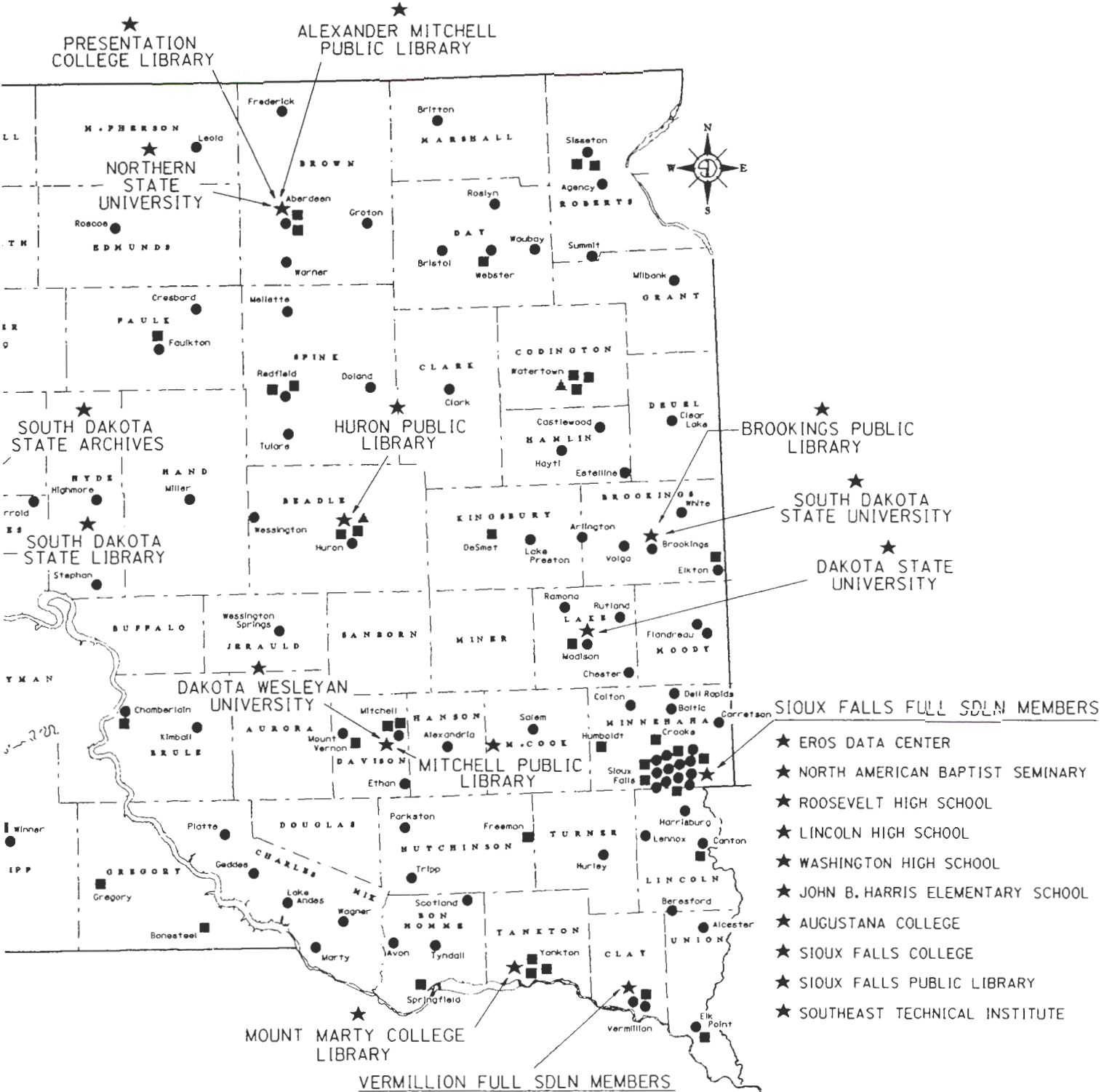

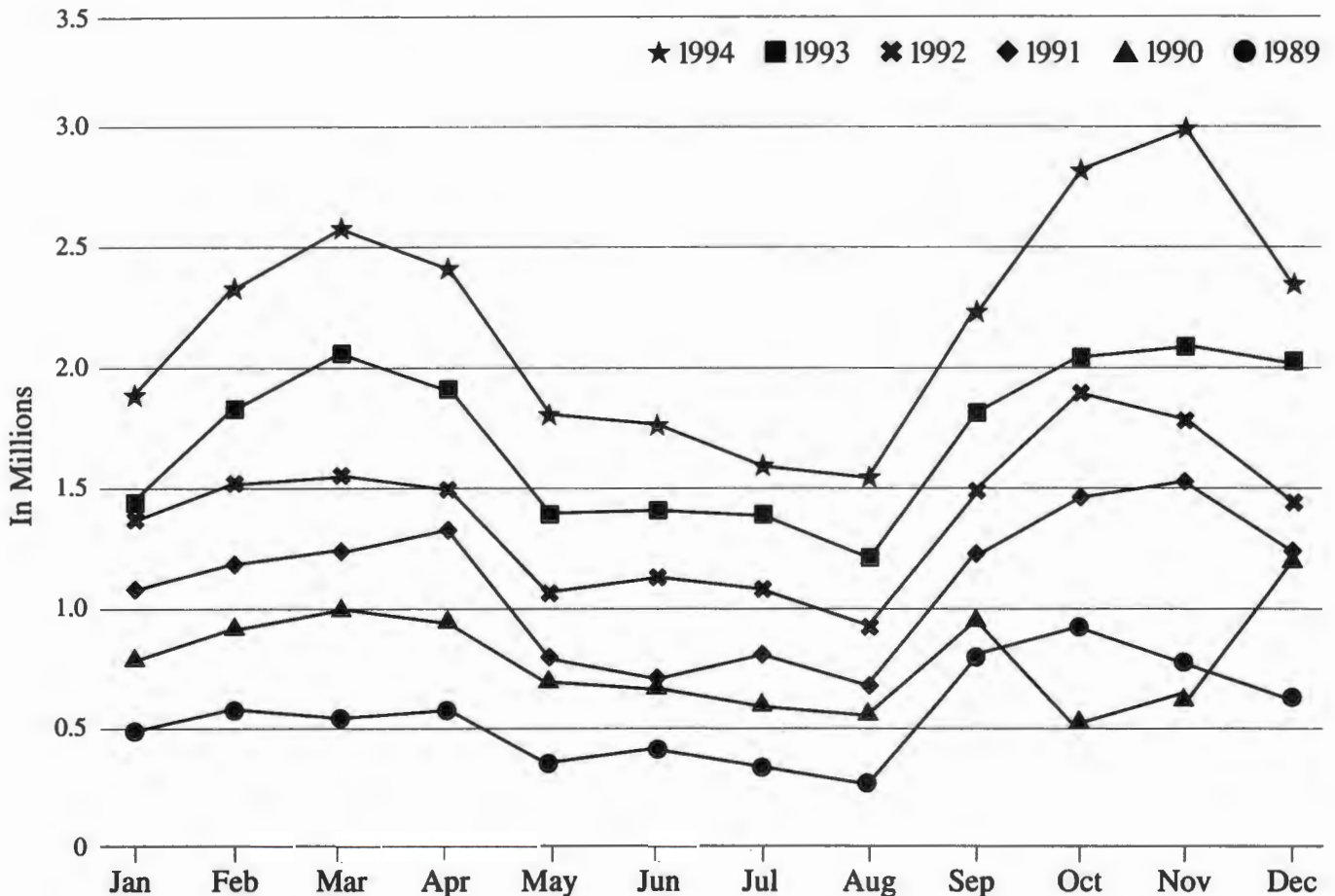

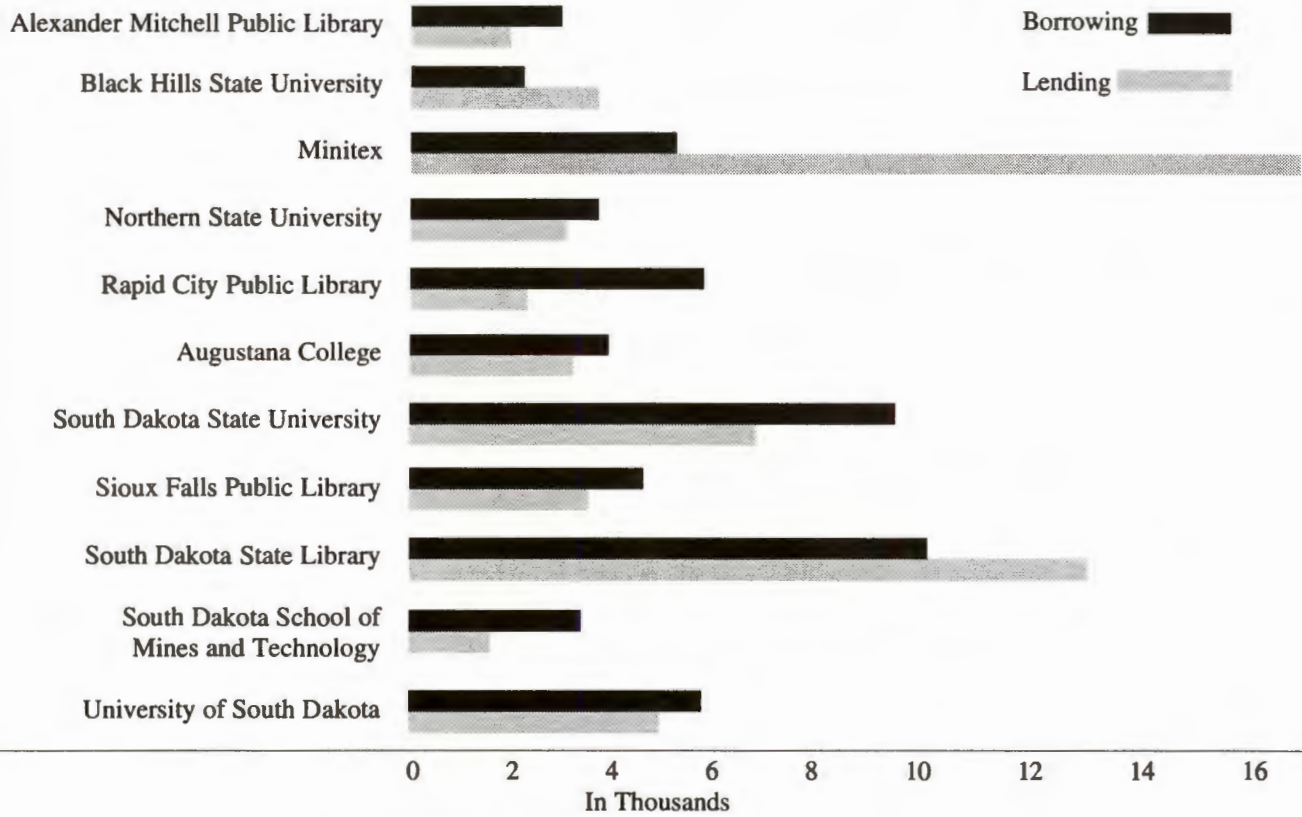

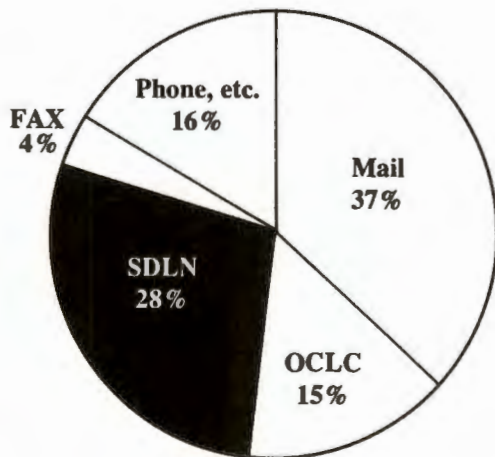
FY94 SDLN Interlibrary Loan Statistics*

FY94 Statewide Library Lending Statistics

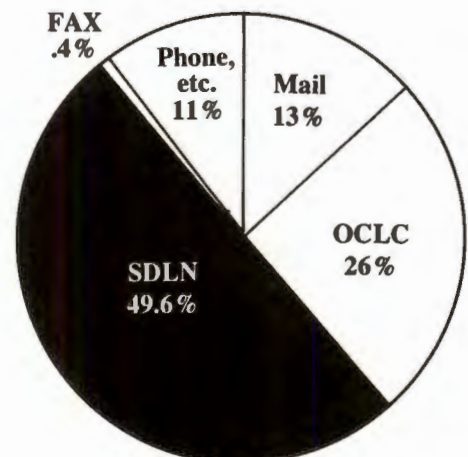
Requests Received By



28% of all statewide interlibrary lending and nearly 50% of all borrowing are done through SDLN.

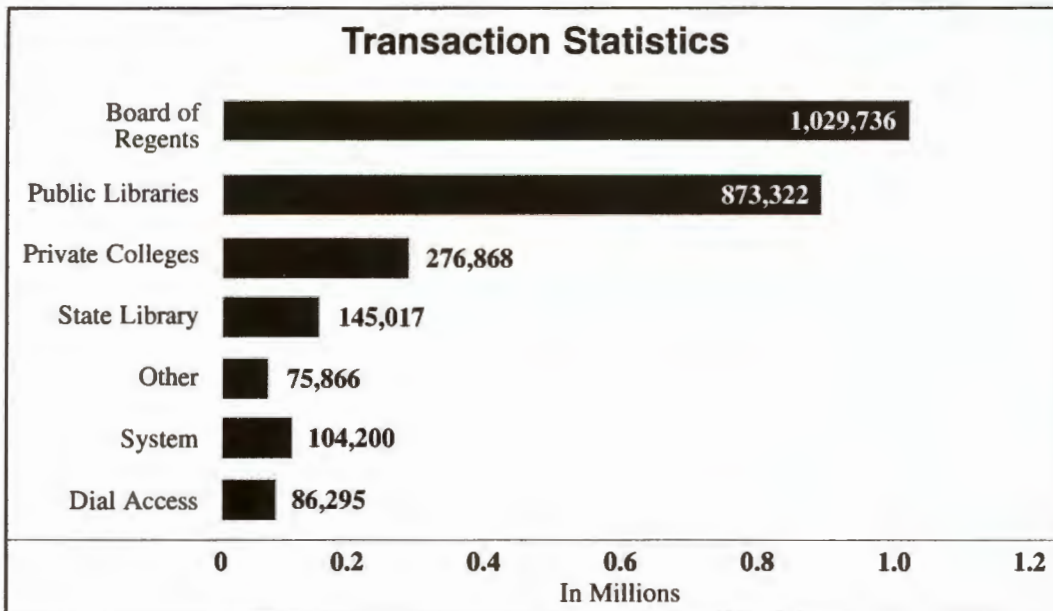
FY94 Statewide Library Borrowing Statistics

Requests Sent By

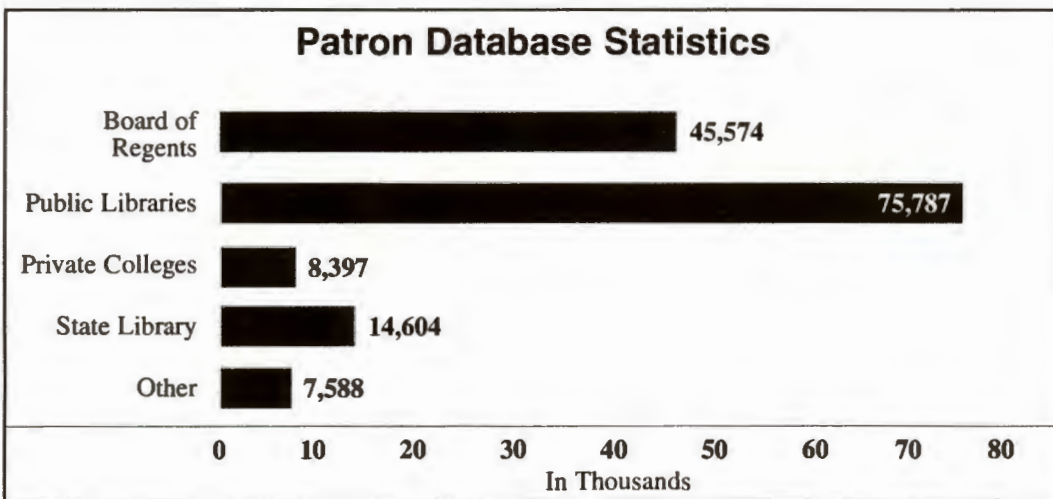

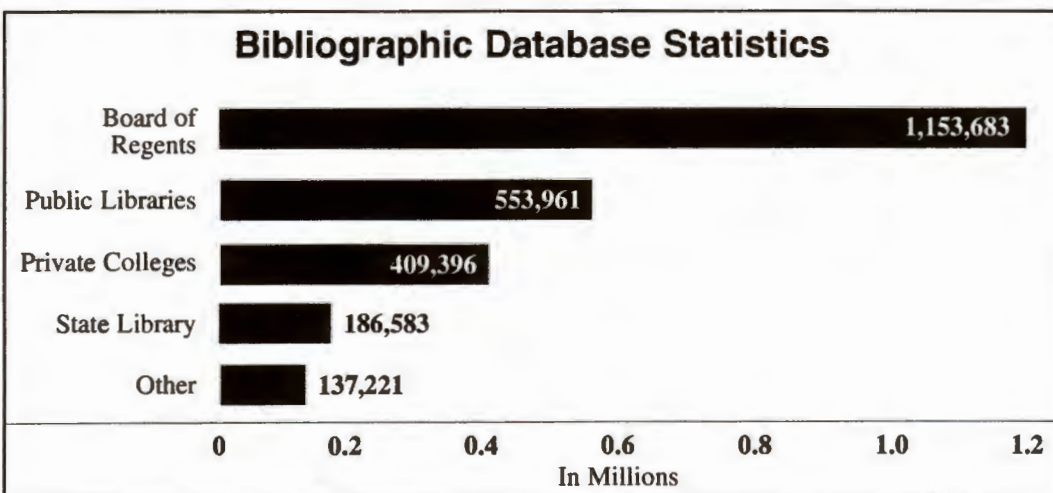
SDLN Member Statistics by Type of Institution



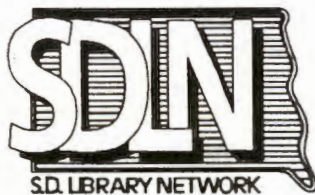
Transaction statistics shown at left cover the period, January 1 through December 31, 1994

The Network

The South Dakota Library Network (SDLN) is a statewide automated library system of 40 member libraries with more than 2.5 million items in its database. It was created by the State Library under South Dakota Codified Law (SDCL) 14-1-48 to establish, maintain, and operate a computerized library network in order to promote statewide resource sharing among libraries and to increase access to libraries and information for South Dakota citizens.

In 1994, the Network was expanded to include periodical indexes. They are Magazine Index, Expanded Academic Index, Business Index, Corporate Profiles, Health Index, and Journals in Education.

Member libraries include public, school, hospital, governmental, and both private and public college and university libraries. SDLN is a comprehensive automated library system which allows libraries to search the holdings of all the member institutions, as well as to perform the basic library functions of circulation, acquisitions, serials control and inventory, and to facilitate interlibrary loans between institutions. In 1991, the SDLN was expanded to provide linkage to the libraries in the Minnesota State University System (MSUS), Traverse de Sioux (TDS) Public Library System in Minnesota and North Dakota's Online Dakota Information Network (ODIN).



The Vision*

In the year 2000, the South Dakota Library Network (SDLN) will reach into every school, public, academic, and special library, and into every state and local government office in South Dakota. Electronic gateways will provide access by businesses and community organizations to SDLN. Network databases will be accessed via terminals in member libraries or dial-up modems and via Internet/NREN (the National Research Education Network). Internet/NREN gateways will allow users of SDLN to access library catalogs worldwide. A sixth subsystem to permit online reference assistance will be added to the existing five — the catalog, circulation, serials, interlibrary loan, and acquisitions. Additional databases (bibliographic, full-text, and multimedia) will be added to the options available on the online catalog. Shared collection development information will enable member libraries to maximize capital resources expenditures. Improved hardware and software will lead to the inclusion of digital audio and video image technology. SDLN will be linked using the high-speed fiber optic backbone of state, regional, and federal telecommunication networks.

As community networks evolve, SDLN will be utilized by people at home and on the move via computers, sophisticated televisions, and smart phones to create an information environment. This environment will not supply needed information but will engage the user in learning. When fully evolved, this information environment will work on many levels, be multi-sensory, multi-modal, and capable of being personalized to the individual, to curriculum, or to business needs. In this environment, the library world will be part of a virtual world where learning is accomplished via stimulation.

The South Dakota Library Network is both a backbone and a beginning to support the information services that will be demanded by the citizens of South Dakota in the future.
