## SUMMER EXHIBITIONS

**The American Collection.** Thomas Hart Benton, Marsden Hartley, Robert Mangold, and Ulfert Wilke are among the 16 artists represented in this exhibition. Hartley (1877-1943), a pioneer of American modern art, was introduced to European modernism at Alfred Stieglitz's 291 Gallery in New York and had his first solo show there in 1909. He worked in Europe during 1912-16, where he showed with the Blaue Reiter group in Munich and Berlin. He returned to Europe after the war and became interested in the work of French painter Paul Cezanne. His 1923 lithograph in this exhibition, "Pears and Apples," a gift of the Brookings Fine Art Club, shows the influence of Cezanne.

**Harvey Dunn Paintings.** The son of South Dakota homesteaders, Dunn (1884-1952) studied with Ada Caldwell at South Dakota State University, at the Art Institute of Chicago, and with Howard Pyle in Wilmington, Delaware. By 1917 he was recognized as a leading American illustrator and one of the most charismatic teachers in the field. His last work was a series of paintings about the homesteaders in South Dakota, produced mainly during the 1930s and 40s, and well-represented in this exhibition. He was elected an associate member of the National Academy of Design in 1935 and an academician in 1945.

**Oscar Howe Paintings.** Born at Joe Creek on the Crow Creek Reservation in South Dakota, Howe (1915-83) became one of the most successful graduates of The Studio at the Santa Fe Indian School in New Mexico, winning such prizes as the Philbrook Art Center's Waite Phillips Trophy for Outstanding Indian Artist in 1966. A Yanktonai Sioux, he became interested in the old Sioux pictographic style of painting, and

and the more decorative Santa Fe style into a unique kind of synthesis. Like Harvey Dunn, he was a charismatic teacher and was particularly influential as artist-in-residence at the University of South Dakota in Vermillion during 1957-81.

**The Marghab Collection.** Marghab hand-embroidered linens were made in Madeira during 1934-78, sold through such fine stores as Georg Jensen in New York, Neiman-Marcus

in Dallas, and Bullock's Wilshire in Los Angeles, and are represented in such collections as the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. The complete collection of articles and designs, over 1,800 pieces, was given to the Museum in 1970 by the founder of the enterprise, Vera Way Marghab of Watertown, South Dakota. The collection has been featured as a "Travel Treasure" in *Home & Away*, the magazine of the Midwest American Automobile Association.

**Native American Tribal Art.** Arikira, Coastal Salish, Kiowa, Ojibwa, and Sioux material is featured in this exhibition. Among the treasures is the eagle feather headdress of Frank Fools Crow, the great Sioux spiritual leader, a gift of Arthur Amiotte of Custer. Also included is the ceremonial pipe that was given by the Leader Charge family to Claude Whitlock when he became superintendent of the Rosebud Reservation in 1936. It came to the Museum from Whitlock's daughter, Pauline Whitlock Jennings, who was born on the Cheyenne River Reservation in South Dakota. A recent acquisition is a Sisseton Sioux drum from about 1900, given by Joanita Kant Monteith of Watertown. The drum is a section of cottonwood tree trunk, and its head is painted rawhide salvaged from a rawhide case called a *parfleche*.

**South Dakota Artists.** Arthur Amiotte of Custer, Ada Caldwell (1869-1938) of Brookings, Dana Crooks of Volga, Palmer Eide (1906-91) and Carl Grupp of Sioux Falls, Myra Miller (1882-1961) of rural Eden, Martin Wanserski of Vermillion, and Dennis Guastella, who taught at South Dakota State University during 1975-80 and now lives in Michigan, are represented by 23 works in this exhibition. Among Wanserski's works in the exhibition is the 1980 figure group of cast epoxy resin, "Moonlight Becomes You," given in memory of Ruth Revell by her family and friends. He developed his skill at modeling the human figure while a diorama sculptor for the Field Museum of Natural History in Chicago. He has taught at the University of South Dakota since 1975.



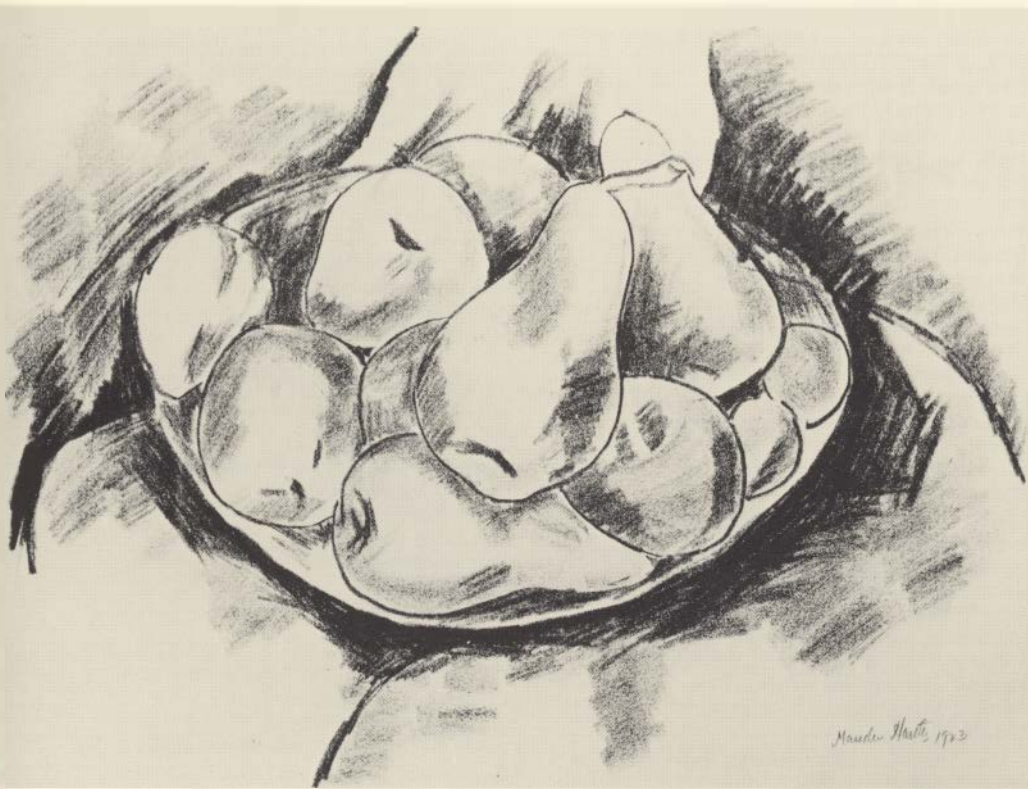

Harold Shunk

**Harold Shunk**, who lives in the Black Hills near Rapid City, South Dakota, was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Public Service degree by South Dakota State University this spring. A Yankton Sioux Indian, Shunk served with the Bureau of Indian Affairs during 1933-68, retiring as superintendent of the Rosebud Reservation in South Dakota. Over the years he has given 81 articles of mainly Sioux tribal art to the Museum. His most recent gift includes a pair of moccasins made for his daughter in 1937 by Smoky Woman of Cherry Creek, South Dakota, who at age 16 had witnessed the defeat of Custer at the Little Big Horn.

**Walt Reed**, owner of Illustration House Gallery in New York, and wife Mary were recent visitors to the Museum. He is the author of such books as *The Illustrator in America 1880-1990* and is planning a book on Harvey Dunn, an artist represented in the Museum collection with 94 works. The Museum's painting by Dunn, "Crossing a Pontoon Bridge," about 1918, was purchased from Reed. It was painted in Europe during the First World War while Dunn was serving as an artist with American Expeditionary Forces.

## RECENT ACQUISITIONS

**L.D. Andrews**, a member of the Museum Board of Trustees since 1982 and president of the Board during 1987-89, resigned this spring following an illness. Andrews was chair of the Museum Collection Committee and the donor of a number of important works by such South Dakota artists as Larry Green, Ole Running, and Henry Rezac. Andrews is a trust officer and vice president of Norwest Bank in Sioux Falls.

**Kay Romans** was elected president of the Museum Guild at its April 28 annual meeting. Margy Chamberlin was elected vice president, Coral Blickstead secretary, Cecilia Beirne treasurer, Larry Stine historian, and Naomi Gilkerson and Dee Kirkbride members-at-large. All are from Brookings. The Guild is responsible for visitor reception, guided tours, the Museum's Art in the Schools program, and raises funds for Museum acquisitions through its annual benefit.

The family of Alice Berry (1916-91), professor emeritus of art at South Dakota State University, has given 17 works by Berry and artists from her collection to the Museum. Among the South Dakota artists represented in the gift are painter Dana Crooks of Volga, ceramist Richard Edie of Brookings, painter Kenny Kinyon of Plankinton, printmaker Gerald Kruse and painter Signe Stuart of Brookings, and ceramist William Wold of Vermillion.

Don Boyd of Mount Vernon, Ohio, who taught sculpture at South Dakota State University during 1974-86, has given one of his most important works, "Fluxus Mini-Museum." The case with its assorted memorabilia was begun in 1986 and was included in "South Dakota Selects," a touring exhibition of work by artists who had received South Dakota Arts Council Fellowships.

Three paintings by Ada Caldwell (1869-1938), who was head of the Department of Visual Arts at South Dakota State University during 1899-1936, have been transferred from the Department to the Museum. "Estes Park," "Ozark Cabins," and "Yellow Roses" were all included in

her 1941 memorial retrospective at SDSU.

A model for M. Crete Kendall Miller's 1933 sculpture in Sylvan Theatre at South Dakota State University, "Tetonkaha," has been transferred to the Museum from the State Agricultural Heritage Museum in Brookings. Miller was born in Brookings and was a 1903 graduate of SDSU. According to legend, the Sioux woman Tetonkaha warned a soldier friend stationed near Oakwood Lakes of an impending attack by the Sioux. As punishment for her treachery, she was thrown into the lake, where she drowned.

## SOUTH DAKOTA ARTS COUNCIL SUPPORT
