### Highlights of 2004-2005

- After several years' search for a new Integrated Library System (ILS), SDLN selected the Aleph product from ExLibris. SDLN libraries converted from the previous ILS, PALS, to Aleph in a two year long project. The PALS system was shut down at the end of March 2005. For a more complete discussion of this effort, see page 3.
  - o Several features of the new system will make work easier for patrons and librarians of our member libraries. These include:
    - § Book jacket covers and other content is now available for patrons to use.
    - § Easier copy-cataloging from Library of Congress and other sources.
    - § Easier navigation in the Circulation client, which allows for better and faster service to patrons as they are checking out or returning materials.
  - O As a part of the new ILS, SDLN implemented a Kids Catalog, a simplified way to access the online catalog. The Kids Catalog uses graphics and easy-to-understand words to guide young children through the search process. SDLN was a development partner with ExLibris for KidsCat.
  - o A new Interlibrary Loan module was developed by ExLibris. SDLN beta-tested this module before implementation.
- · SDLN hired a trainer, whose primary duties are to prepare and deliver instruction in the use of the ILS to staff of member libraries.
- · A new library was added to SDLN. Hoven School District became an SDLN Associate Member. They are the first new library to join SDLN on Aleph.
- Access to a new suite of databases was implemented. The primary product now available to staff and patrons of our member libraries is EbscoHost, with a substantial complement of databases for Kids from Gale. These databases are listed on page 4.
- · Increased collaboration with other Aleph users world-wide, through the election of Gary Johnson, SDLN Operations Director, to the Steering Committee of the North American Aleph Users Group (NAAUG). This has provided for increased visibility for SDLN with Ex Libris.
- · Linda Allbee was appointed to the International Consortium of Aleph Users (ICAU) InterLibrary Loan Task Force.

### Project: Migration from PALS to Aleph

The South Dakota Library Network has moved to a new Integrated Library System (ILS). This was accomplished with the investment of many hours of work by the dedicated staff of SDLN and its member libraries. SDLN has moved from "PALS", a product of the Minnesota State University System to "ALEPH", a product of ExLibris Incorporated.

#### **Timeline**

The effort to move to a new ILS actually began many years ago. In 1999, it was clear that a new system was needed. Unfortunately, at that time no vendor had a system that would adequately serve a shared system such as SDLN.

In 2001, the effort to find a new ILS was resumed. The major milestones of the selection and implementation are listed here:

· 2000-2001	"Request for Proposal" (RFP) developed by the SDLN functional user groups.
· November 2001	RFP Issued.
· December 2001	Proposals received from seven (7) vendors.
· Jan - Feb 2002	SDLN user groups reviewed the vendor proposals.
· Apr – June 2002	Top four vendors gave product presentations in Pierre.
· September 2002	Visited the top two vendors.

	o Endeavor (Voyager) at the University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point
· October 2002	SDLN Advisory Council voted to select ExLibris as our new vendor.
· May 2003	Contract signed.
· May 2003	Kick off meeting held for SDLN Project Team and ExLibris staff.
· May 2003	Ordered hardware.
· July 2003	Installed hardware and software.
· July - Sept 2003	Training conducted for the Project Team.
· October 2003	Hired Linda Allbee as our Instructional Librarian.
· Feb – July 2004	Trained staff of SDLN's member libraries.
<ul> <li>July – Nov 2004</li> </ul>	Switched to Production (all modules except ILL.
· March 2005	Switched to Production (ILL).
· March 31, 2005	Terminated use of PALS system.

The project was a difficult one for several reasons. The complexity of Aleph is much greater than that of PALS. The vendor was not prepared with qualified staff to provide appropriate project management and training for SDLN. And SDLN staffing was not sufficient for the workload. In the end, the migration was successful, due to many hours of work by dedicated staff at SDLN and at our member libraries.

Significant improvements have been provided to SDLN member libraries. We are now using a product that is being used by many of the most prestigious libraries in the world. It has ongoing support and continuing development by the vendor. Some specific improvements for our users include:

- · Online Catalog: book jacket covers and other added content is now available.
- · Online Catalog: many features have been customized to meet the specific needs of SDLN libraries.
- · Kids Catalog: an easy-to-use interface for young children is now available.
- · Cataloging: seamless cataloging with OCLC, Library of Congress, and other sites is now possible.
- · Circulation: easier navigation for staff when working across the circulation desk with their patrons.

SDLN is actively involved in national and international user groups. We are members of NAAUG (North American Aleph User Group) and ICAU (International Consortium of Aleph Users). Gary Johnson was elected to the Steering Committee of NAAUG for a two year term beginning June 2004. Linda Allbee is on the ICAU Task Force to help ExLibris develop the next version of Interlibrary Loan, and Gary Johnson is on the NAAUG Focus Group to help define the improvements needed for Aleph permissions. Such involvement will result in an improved product for the libraries and library patrons of South Dakota.

### Membership Benefits

The mission of the South Dakota Library Network is to enable all libraries within South Dakota to provide the State's residents with the information they need, when they need it, and where they need it.

### SDLN Membership Benefits

SDLN provides current information technologies, services, and resources that most South Dakota libraries would not be able to afford independently. SDLN is funded solely by member libraries cooperating to share resources among more than 200 school, public, private, academic, tribal, medical, government, and corporate libraries.



### South Dakota Library Network - Goals

- GOAL 1: The South Dakota Library Network will provide a basic set of information resources to every library in the state, regardless of size or type.
- GOAL 2: The South Dakota Library Network will facilitate the collaboration and cooperation of libraries of all types to form groups for the purpose of obtaining access to specialized information resources.
- GOAL 3: The South Dakota Library Network will provide an information structure to support seamless education from elementary through post-secondary.
- GOAL 4: The South Dakota Library Network will work to improve South Dakota libraries' ability to provide interlibrary loan of books, magazine articles, and other materials.
- · GOAL 5: The South Dakota Library Network will expand and integrate access to high-quality, fee-based information services from commercial suppliers.
- · GOAL 6: The South Dakota Library Network will leverage existing State resources and will comply with no less than the minimum State standards for information technology.

### SDLN Membership Categories

The South Dakota Library Network (SDLN) is funded through membership fees paid by participating libraries. All membership fees are used to pay for the services provided for the libraries and their patrons. SDLN operates under SDCL 1-45-37 and a subsequent Memorandum of Understanding among the South Dakota Board of Regents, the South Dakota Department of Education and Cultural Affairs, and the South Dakota State Library Board. SDLN is a non-profit organization whose mission and vision statement can be viewed at the following URL: http://www.sdln.net/?mode=about&page=mission.php.

#### Member Fees


Member libraries have access to all services and all library management modules of SDLN. The library management modules include the online catalog, cataloging, acquisitions, serials, interlibrary loan, circulation, and course reserves. Members have access to all reference databases, including full-text. For a list of member libraries, see pages 8-13.

A formula determines ongoing (annual) fees paid by member libraries, and is based upon the numbers of titles, volumes and patrons in that library, as well as annual usage. The formula includes a base fee, which is determined by the way the library is configured in the Aleph ILS. This fee is \$250 per sublibrary and \$1,500 per administrative unit (ADM). The formula also includes a usage fee, which is based on each library's percentage of each of these record types in the database of the ILS:

bib records (35%) item records (20%) patron records (35%) serial subscription records (5%) acquisitions order records (5%)

There is also a one-time start-up fee paid by new member libraries, which covers the implementation planning and setup for the new member library. This fee is based upon the number of branch libraries (or schools) and the estimated numbers of patrons, titles, and volumes in the library.

This start-up fee is:
\$500 per building with a library
\$0.015 per patron
\$0.035 per title
\$0.01 per volume


