The top selling animal was Lot 5 SDSU 7050, a ram lamb sired by Wheaton 6-189, for \$2,000 to Fryman Farms in Kentucky. The sale attracted Hampshire breeders from more than 12 states. The SDSU Hampshire flock goals over the past 10 years have been to create a medium-framed sheep with excellent structural soundness,

added core muscling characteristics as well as the growth performance expected from Hampshires. The SDSU Hampshire flock is the oldest established flock of Hampshire sheep in the U.S. Thank you to manager **Ann Kolthoff** and the undergraduate students employed at the Sheep Education and Research Unit for the excellent presentation of the consignment for the on-line auction.

**Dr. Bradley C. Johnson**, former member of the SDSU Animal Science faculty (1997-2000) who is currently



the Gordon W. Davis Regent's Chair in Meat Science and Muscle Biology in the Texas Tech University Department of Animal and Food Sciences, was recently selected to a five-year term on a prestigious committee that evaluates the safety of food additives. The Joint Expert Committee on Food Additives (JECFA) is a collection of international food safety experts from around the world that not only ensures

the safety of food additives but also includes evaluating contaminants, naturally occurring toxicants and residues of veterinary drugs in food. The JECFA is administered by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations and the World Health Organization (WHO). Johnson brings more than 25 years of experience to the committee, working with veterinary drugs used for global meatanimal production.

well-known anti-hunger advocate, to speak on campus April 12. 
# Research and Creative Activity Day
