The advanced piece of equipment will primarily process corn to be added to feed but is adjustable to produce feed in different textures. It has the ability to crack corn, crimp grain, roll oats and grind corn and barley to fine microns. The SDSU Feed Processing Facility processes more than 1,250 tons of feed per year for six educational and research units with the

swine and ruminant nutrition units requiring the highest feed volume. This grinder will improve consistency and increase production of high quality feed for all the units. Two undergraduate students are typically employed at the facility on a part-time basis. Student hands-on experience with this modern piece of equipment will prepare them for careers in the feed industry. The SDSU Meats Judging Team finished the Fall 2017 season at the International Meat Judging Contest in



Dakota City, NE in November. This contest is considered the national championship and we are proud to say we finished 6th out of 17 teams. Highlights of the day included 3rd place in specifications with **Cassidy Wulf** leading the team with a perfect score of 100 but taking 8th place in specs after a tie breaker; 3rd place in placings with **Shaye Jungwirth** leading the team placing 8th individually with a score of 484 out of 500; 4th in pork judging with **Paige Binger** also placing 4th individually with a score of 277 out of 300; 5th in beef judging with **Paige Binger** placing 9th and

Shaye Jungwirth placing 10th both with a score of 275 out of 300; 7th in reasons with **Paige Binger** placing 8th individually with a score of 206 out of 250; 7th place in overall beef, and 9th in both beef grading and lamb judging. Rodeo Team

As the 2017 fall season came to a close in October, the SDSU Women's rodeo team is ranked 7th in the nation and 2nd in the Great Plains region. Individual standouts are Madison Rau ranked #1 nationally in Barrel Racing and Jacey Hupp 5th in the Women's All Around and 7th in the Goat Tying. The men's rodeo team is ranked 4th in the Great Plains Region of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo

Association. Both teams compete at five rodeos in the fall semester and five rodeos in the spring semester in the surrounding five-state region. Overall, the teams travel over 5400 miles during the school year to the 10 regional rodeos and add another 1300 miles if they qualify for the College National Finals Rodeo in Casper, WY the third weekend in June. SDSU has qualified 78 rodeo team members to the College National Finals Rodeo in the past eight years.
