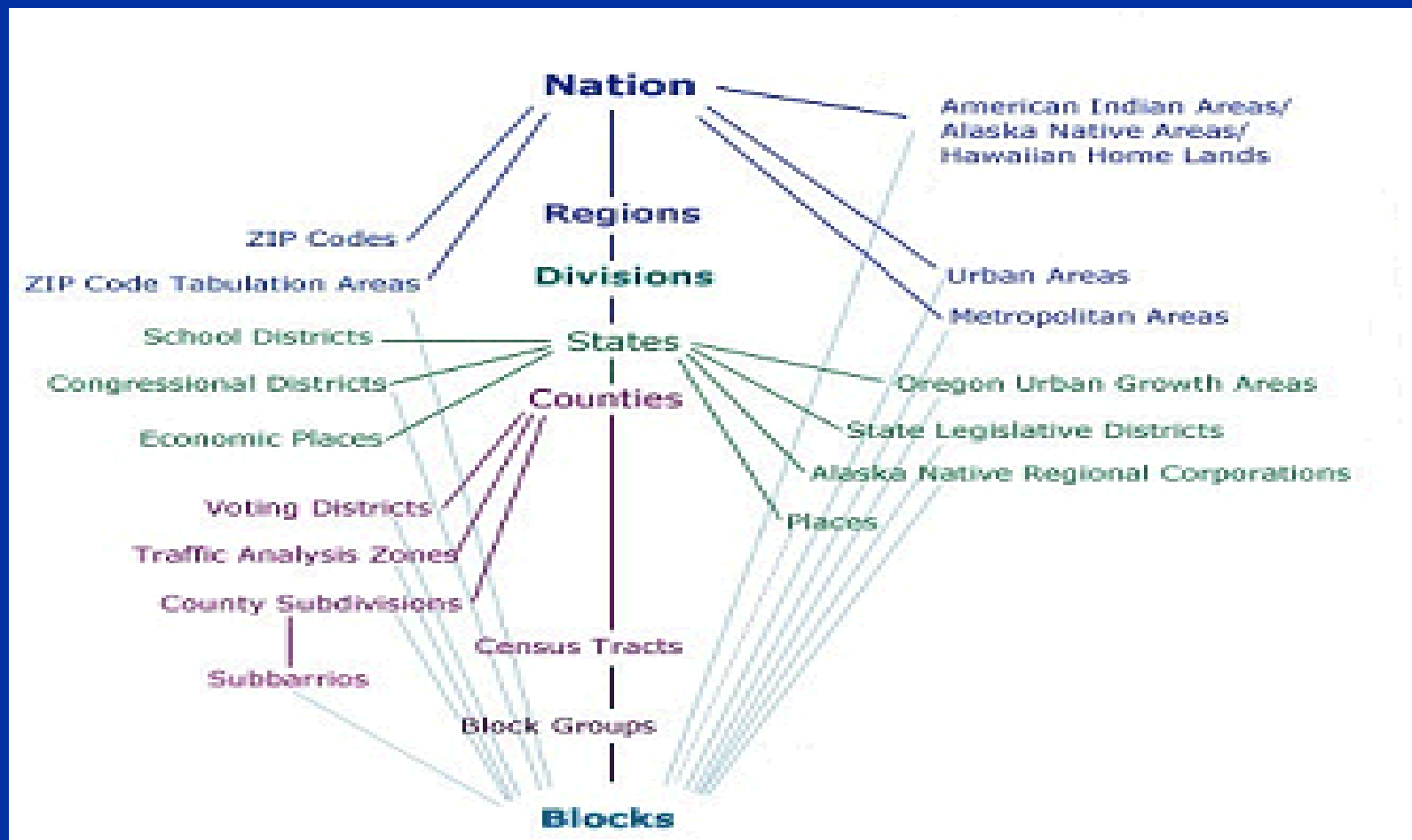

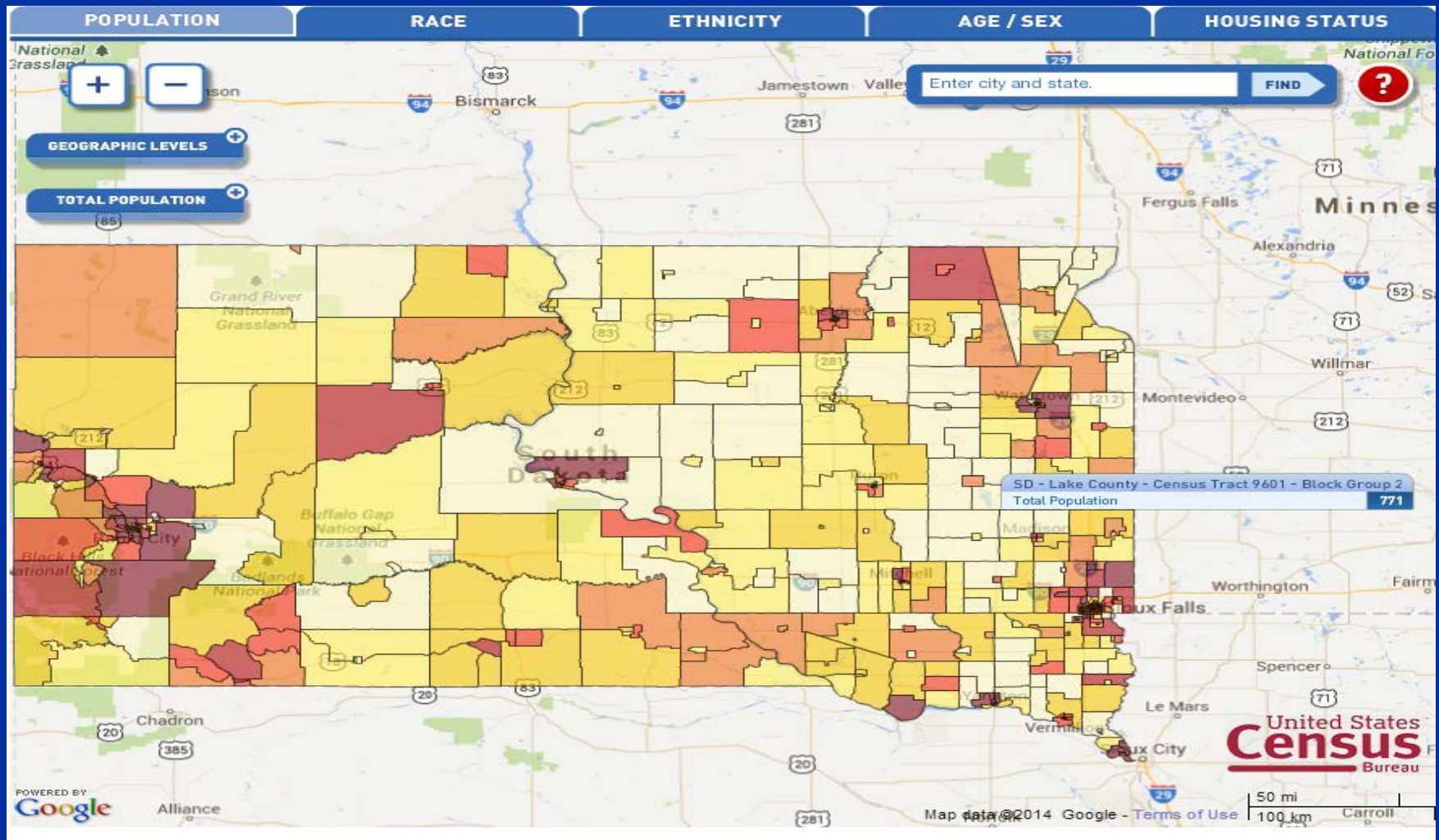

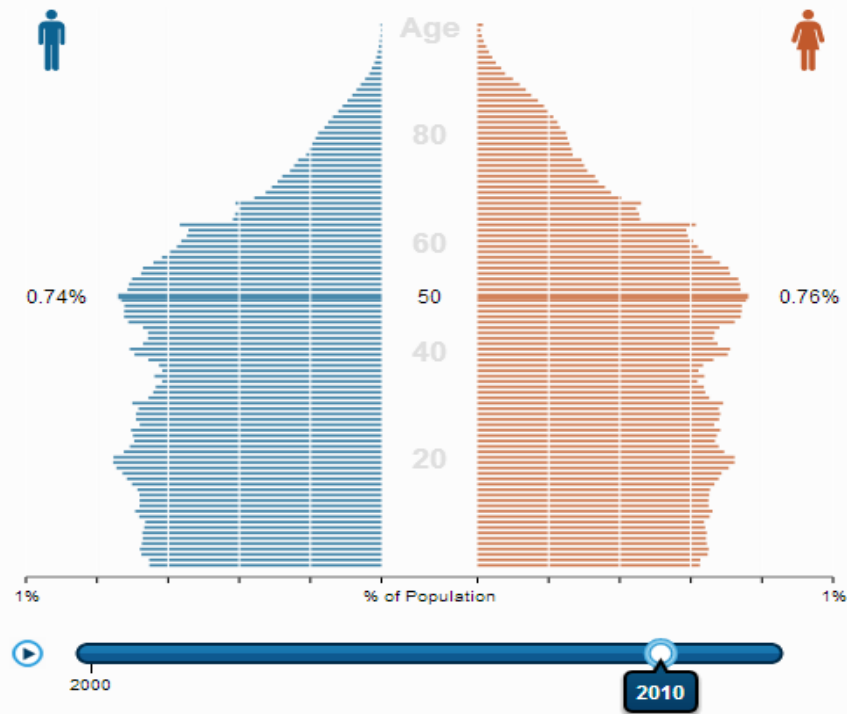
# United States Regional Population by Year
