Portrait of South Dakota: 2010






Population Projections


- Influencing Factors:

 - o Human intervention




South Dakota Population Pyramids
















- ■By 2030, Nearly 1 in every 4 people projected to be over the age of 65

o 65+: 23.2%

o 85+: 5.5%
