## CITATION FOR THE HONORARY DEGREE DOCTOR OF SCIENCE

Clarence Mortenson, a retired Stanley County Rancher, was born in Pierre, South Dakota, on August 3, 1929. A registered member of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe, Mortenson was born to a Danish American rancher father and to an American Indian mother, whose family tree includes French fur traders. It is that Indian heritage, Mortenson believes, from which his strong feelings about the balance of nature and harmony with the environment spring. "The Indians' belief was that the earth was your mother," Mortenson says.

A horseback ride to visit an old cowboy neighbor in 1942 changed young Clarence Mortenson's life. The friend told him, "Young man, when I came here, I could cross Foster Creek anywhere at a trot with my team and buggy; it was tree-lined and grassy-bottomed, and it had water holes about every mile that never went dry." But from where they stood, there was not a tree within miles, only barren hills and a big gash in the ground seventy feet wide and twenty feet deep. Initially doubting the old cowboy's accuracy, Mr. Mortenson later studied historical records and discovered that his friend's story was true.

This ecological vision has directed the management of the Mortenson Ranch since 1950. Through the construction of small sediment-trapping dams on gullied creeks, a rest-rotation grazing system, and deferred summer grazing in riparian areas and woody draws, the Mortenson ranch now resembles the old cowboy's story. Cottonwoods, willows, beavers, and dense mats of prairie cordgrass have returned to Foster Creek. Fruit-bearing shrubs now grow thickly with riparian trees in numerous woody draws. Much less soil and water now leave the ranch. Wildlife has returned in impressive numbers. Ecological improvements also have benefited the ranch's fiscal bottom line – the Mortensons report that their land management practices have increased both profits and sustainability.

The ecological restoration efforts at Mr. Mortenson's ranch have been recognized by dozens of organizations in South Dakota, the Great Plains, and the Nation. Honors and Awards include: Outstanding Young Farmer Award, Pierre, SD, Jr. Chamber of Commerce, 1959; Soil Conservation Award, Stanley County, SD, 1972; Rangeman of the Year Award, South Dakota Section of Society for Range Management, 1977; Environmental Stewardship Award, South Dakota Stockgrowers' Association, 1993; Good Steward Award, National Arbor Day Foundation, 1994; Volunteer Citizen Conservation Award, Chevron-Times Mirror Magazines, 1994; South Dakota Governor's Environmental Excellence Award, 1994; Environmental Stewardship Award, National Cattlemen's Association Region VII, 1995; National Wetlands Award, Environmental Law Institute and five cooperating U.S. federal government agencies, 2002; and the Full Circle Award, U.S. Society for Ecological Restoration, 2002. Mr. Mortenson and his sons have received nearly every award possible for improvements made to their ranch over the past half century. Most recently, the ranch is being featured in the traveling exhibit produced by the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History, "Listening to the Prairie: Farming in Nature's Image," presented at libraries throughout the United States from 2001-2004.

Mr. Mortensen's collaborations with SDSU have been extensive and long-standing. Beginning in the 1980's, range extension specialists and researchers from the West River Agriculture Center began using the ranch as an example of best rangeland practices. South Dakota State University faculty from both the Animal and Range Sciences and Horticulture, Forestry, Landscape and Parks Departments have had close working relations with Clarence and his sons for nearly twenty years resulting in research projects and student tours. He has personally given dozens of

tours to classes from SDSU and has visited campus many times to educate students in holistic management and conservation ethics. Thus he has fostered the research, extended the results to the public via seminars, guidebooks, and videos, and educated students. He has done so clearly in the spirit of the land-grant university mission.

Clarence Mortenson has generated more publicity and recognition for the rangelands of South Dakota than any other individual, organization or agency over the last quarter of the 20th century. Mr. Mortenson's legacy will continue to inspire people both at South Dakota State University and in the general public for many years to come.

To show our appreciation for and recognition of his extraordinary contributions to ecological restoration, South Dakota State University, and to the State of South Dakota, South Dakota State University confers on Clarence Mortenson the honorary degree, Doctor of Science.

## PATRICIA S. FISHBACK

## CITATION FOR THE HONORARY DEGREE DOCTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE

Patricia S. Fishback earned her Bachelor's Degree in Foreign Languages from South Dakota State University in 1966. She received her Master's Degree in Social Work in 1969 from Tulane University in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Mrs. Fishback has a long and distinguished record of public service to the community, the campus, and the local schools. Among some of Mrs. Fishback's significant contributions are: Work to create the Brookings Main Street Program; President of Downtown Brookings Inc.; Co-Founder Brookings PTA, Brookings PTA Council, and PTAs in each of Brookings five schools; served as President and Vice President of the State of South Dakota's PTA and on the National PTA Board of Directors; Chair, Brookings School District Long Range Planning Task Force; Chair, Brookings Historic Preservation Commission (BHPC); Member, SDSU Master Planning Task Force; and transitional work with the new city council.

While presiding as President of the Brookings PTA, Mrs. Fishback worked to develop a program whereby SDSU television students would broadcast monthly School Board meetings on the local cable access channels. This project not only afforded valuable experience for the students, but also served as an effective information tool on issues affecting education in the community.

Mrs. Fishback has been an active member and leader of the Brookings Historic Preservation Commission for many years. Her efforts in historic preservation have demonstrated her commitment and service to the Brookings Community, South Dakota State University, and the State of South Dakota. She has worked on several projects involving SDSU and historic preservation issues. She served on the SDSU Master Planning Task Force which created a plan for the growth and development of the SDSU Campus over the next 50 years. While the goal of the Task Force was to chart the future of the university facilities, Pat consistently connected that planning to the historical roots of the campus and surrounding neighborhood. She was a force in shaping the plan into a design that looked at new development, while preserving the historical context of the campus and its buildings. Pat went far beyond preservation issues in looking for ways to enhance the relationship between the University and City in the master planning effort.

Communities privileged to have universities within their boundaries are often faced with unique preservation challenges within and adjacent to the educational community boundaries. However, Pat's insistence that town and gown relationships are crucial has helped forge a cooperative spirit between Brookings and SDSU.

The University has appreciated her input into their attempts to save Solberg Hall, one of the oldest structures on campus. During her tenure as chair of the Brookings Historic Preservation Commission (BHPC), the University received the Mayor's Award for its renovation of the Sylvan Theater, an outdoor amphitheater located in the historic campus core. What appeared to be a certain loss of two bungalows near campus slated for removal resulted in a successful partnership between the BHPC, the SDSU Foundation, and the local Habitat for Humanity Organization.

For these reasons and for the countless other projects related to Historic Preservation, Education and Community Development which bear the stamp of Pat Fishback's personal attention and devotion, it is most appropriate that South Dakota State University confer the Honorary Doctor of Public Service degree upon Patricia S. Fishback.

## DAVID J. SCHINGOETHE

## DISTINGUISHED PROFESSOR OF DAIRY SCIENCE

Dr. David Schingoethe has been a member of the Department of Dairy Science in the College of Agriculture and Biological Sciences at South Dakota State University since 1969. He has demonstrated exceptional performance in teaching, scholarship, and service functions throughout his career.

Dr. Schingoethe is a prolific publisher and has authored or co-authored hundreds of research publications which have been recognized nationally and internationally. This is evidenced by invited lectureships at many conferences, invited authorship for book chapters, and an outstanding publication record in refereed journals.

Through his research efforts, he has made significant contributions in his area of expertise, dairy nutrition. He has been very successful at obtaining external grants for funding his research and graduate students. Dr. Schingoethe has distinguished himself as an outstanding research scientist and a true scholar.

Dr. Schingoethe also has an outstanding service record to the College, the University, and to the Brookings Community as well as to his profession. He has served on numerous university committees, including the Academic Senate and other governing organizations. Service to his profession is most noteworthy, having served in various capacities, including President of the American Dairy Science Association. He was recently named president-elect of the Federation of Animal Science Societies and is serving as an editor of the Journal of Dairy Science. Being elected to this leadership position documents the great respect of Dr. Schingoethe's peers. Between July 2001 and November 2002 he served as the interim head for the Dairy Science Department, while still performing his other faculty functions.

Dr. Schingoethe has been and continues to be a role model for students and faculty members of the Dairy Science Department. Over the past 30 years he has established a reputation as a dairy scientist and nutritionist that has the respect of the national and world-wide dairy industry and has attracted some of the best and brightest students to SDSU. Many of these students have started illustrious careers under his guidance, going on to become today's leaders in industry and in academics.

Dr. Schingoethe has exhibited characteristics that exemplify the role of South Dakota State University in teaching, research, and outreach. In recognition of all his achievements, South Dakota State University wishes to recognize this truly dedicated and outstanding individual with the title of "Distinguished Professor of Dairy Science."

Dr. Donald E. Arwood is a dedicated scholar and outstanding instructor. His dedication to his students and their learning is exemplary.

Not only do Dr. Arwood's courses consistently receive strong ratings in student evaluations, but many students add comments remarking on his patience and effort in helping them learn. As one student commented, "He doesn't give up until he is sure that we understand." Students consistently cite many general strengths and specific examples of how Dr. Arwood facilitates and enhances the quality of student learning experiences. He has a unique ability to break down complex subject matter to a level that is easy to understand. Especially remarkable is that many of these comments come from students in the required Research Methods courses that he teaches at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Often students reflect on the trepidation with which they entered these courses and how Dr. Arwood's efforts turned that around for them, resulting in an enjoyable as well as challenging learning experience. It is not uncommon for students to write (or relate in their exit interviews) that, while they dreaded taking the required methods course, it turned out to be one of their favorite courses. They consistently attribute this to the attention Dr. Arwood devotes to them in helping them understand and master the subject matter.

Dr. Arwood has served on advisory committees of a number of graduate students and is much sought after as a thesis/dissertation advisor. The students he mentors are very complimentary and appreciative of Dr. Arwood's guidance, expertise, and professionalism.

Although he has a 100% teaching appointment, Dr. Arwood is very active and productive in professional and scholarly activities. He has published research findings in scholarly journals and presented findings at professional society meetings. Much of this scholarly activity is related to teaching and student development. As a continuation of his efforts to design learning experiences that are meaningful and beneficial to the students, Dr. Arwood coordinates SDSU's contribution to a national project called Integrating Data Analysis (IDA). The IDA Program is designed to aid instructors in integrating methods of data analysis into undergraduate curricula.

Dr. Arwood enjoys the respect of his students, peers, and supervisors. He has demonstrated a high level of quality in all aspects of his work at South Dakota State University.

## Delmer E. Lonowski

#### SDSU AWARD FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

Dr. Delmer E. Lonowski encourages students to be internationally aware, socially responsible, and able to envision change in their communities and the country. Students understand that they will not be allowed to be passive observers in Dr. Lonowski's class. He does not regard his responsibility as a great communicator of facts to the students, but instead he views his challenge as one of prompting his students to-read and discuss complex subject matter in an intelligent manner in order to foster a better understanding of issues, concepts, and directions.

Professor Lonowski's teaching does not stop at the classroom door. Through encouraging student journal writing over the Internet, he not only enhances the individual student's understanding of the material and use of technology in education, but also establishes a one-on-one connection that is invaluable in education. At a time when disgruntled students nationwide complain of being treated like "just a number," Dr. Lonowski carries on a personal dialogue with each student through his comments and responses to journal entries.

Dr. Lonowski's most unique course is the Model United Nations Course he facilitates each spring semester. His initiative was the reason for SDSU first becoming involved in the multi-state Arrowhead Model UN. This simulation asks students to role play various countries in interaction with international actors. Each year he personally seeks funding for continued participation of an SDSU Model UN Team. He meets on evenings with the team members to review their research on countries assigned and offers advice for improving their research. There is no way of overstating Dr. Lonowski's contribution to this international learning experience for our students. Without his commitment in the form of a non-compensated overload, SDSU would not be participating. Moreover, our students regularly bring home awards for Best Delegation, Outstanding Individual Delegate, and in various other areas. Last year SDSU captured two of the five Best Delegate Awards presented.

In addition to his teaching, Dr. Lonowksi has participated as both an observer and panel leader in a number of SDSU faculty development sessions dedicated to improving classroom teaching. He researches concepts and theories of effective teaching and introduces new strategies directed toward fostering more engaged learning in his classes.

As one student commented, "This professor exemplifies the characteristics that drew me to SDSU as a student and that keep me challenged, excited, and engaged by my experiences here."

## M. MICHAEL ROUNDS

#### COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Governor M. Michael Rounds served as State Senator from District 24 for ten years and as the Senate Majority Leader for six years. Born in Huron, South Dakota, and a lifelong Pierre resident, Governor Rounds is a former partner in Fischer, Rounds & Associates, Inc., an insurance and real estate agency.

His past civic leadership includes serving as board president of the Oahe YMCA, Vice President of the Home and School Association of St. Joseph School, President of the Pierre-Ft. Pierre Exchange Club and Exalted Ruler of the Pierre Elks Lodge. Governor Rounds has a degree in Political Science from South Dakota State University.

In his role as Senate Majority Leader, Rounds revised the state aid to education formula, and increased the State's share of funding. He supported reduced property taxes; repealed more than 500 rules, laws and mandates affecting local school boards; funded thousands of acres of public hunting land; funded the largest four-lane construction plan in this state since the Interstate System was completed; and wired schools for Internet access.

Governor Rounds and his wife, Jean (Vedvei), have four children, Chris, Brian, Carrie, and John.

## RICHARD W. LEE

Dr. Richard W. Lee began his career with SDSU in 1978 as Professor and Head of the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication. Dr. Lee has worked tirelessly to design, promote, and build the \$2 million addition to Yeager Hall, where students of Journalism can now be trained in a start-of-the-art facility preparing them for the competitive marketplace.

Dr. Lee has also worked to promote a greater understanding on campus and in the State of American Indian issues. He has encouraged many American Indians to become journalists so that more tribal voices can be heard in the media. In 2002, he was recognized by the Freedom Forum as the Journalism Administrator of the Year.

After faithfully serving South Dakota State University and the South Dakota Higher Education System for 25 years, Dr. Lee retired July 2002. In June 2002, Dr. Lee received the title of Professor Emeritus of Journalism and Mass Communication from the South Dakota Board of Regents.

## PHILIP R. BAKER

#### HONORARY MARSHAL

Dr. Philip Baker has given generously of his time and talents to further higher education since beginning his career at South Dakota State University in 1973. Dr. Baker created the Festival of Cultures event and coordinated its activities for 15 years. This event brings national and international artists to South Dakota to entertain and inspire thousands of students while increasing their awareness of the world.

For 28 years, Dr. Baker has served as originator and editor of *La Llanura*, the newsletter of the South Dakota Chapter of American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese. Dr. Baker received the F.O. Butler Foundation Award for Service to Students and the Dorothy and Eugene Butler, Jr. Award in Recognition of Lifelong Commitment to Human Rights. In 1996 he was recognized by South Dakota high school teachers as an Outstanding Modern Language Educator in South Dakota.

In January 2003, Dr. Baker retired and received the title Professor Emeritus of Spanish in December of 2002.

## THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The Ceremonial Mace is traditionally carried by the University Marshal at all formal academic occasions. The staff, which stands thirty-six inches high from top to bottom, is made of walnut with a mahogany finish. It is trimmed in 14k plated gold. At the top of the Mace is the great seal of South Dakota State University. The engraved inscription reads "South Dakota State University founded 1881." The Mace was presented to the University as a gift from the SDSU Alumni Association.

The Ceremonial Mace has an ancient history as a symbol of authority. In medieval times it was a studded, clublike weapon, made of iron and capable of breaking armor. It came to be associated with the protection of the king in France and England and was carried by the king's sergeant-at-arms. In the thirteenth century it was used for civil purposes and figured in the processions of city mayors and other dignitaries. Eventually the Mace became a symbol also for academic institutions, an emblem of order and authority in the pageantry of ceremonial occasions.



## THE UNIVERSITY PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The University Presidential Medallion, a traditional symbol of authority of the Office of the President, is a 14k gold replica of the University seal, is three inches in diameter, and is cast as a single piece.

The reverse side of the Medallion is engraved with the names the University has formally held since its inception: Dakota Agricultural College, 1884-1889, South Dakota Agricultural College, 1890-1907, South Dakota State College of Agricultural and Mechanic Arts, 1907-June 30, 1964, and South Dakota State University, July 1, 1964 to Present.

The University Presidential Medallion was designed by Sioux Falls artist Jurek Jakowicz and was presented as a gift to the University by the SDSU Foundation. The Medallion is part of the University's heritage and will pass to future presidents. It is traditionally worn by the University president at important ceremonial occasions.

#### THE ACADEMIC PROCESSIONAL

The academic processional which precedes the graduation ceremonies on college and university campuses is one of the old and colorful customs which link 21st century education with its early origins.

To signalize the achievements of their students, American institutions of higher learning conduct a formal ceremony to award the appropriate degrees earned at the conclusion of prescribed study. The action of taking the degree – associate, bachelor's, master's or doctor's – as well as the designation of the day itself – is Commencement.

Various explanations of the term "commencement" are possible. The most likely is that centuries ago the bachelor, originally an apprentice, began his apprenticeship upon that day; and with the degree of M.A. and Ph.D., the masters and doctors commenced their work upon the day their degrees were conferred. So today, the student, having finished his/her preliminary education, sets out on a career.

The academic regalia worn at Commencement is of medieval origin. The scholars of Bologna, Paris, Oxford, Cambridge, Louvain and Heidelberg dressed in a manner to distinguish themselves from the merchants and other townsmen. Since the 11th century, when the rise of the universities began, "learned clerks" robed themselves in gowns, caps and hoods, thus marking a difference between "town and gown."

By this apparel they were recognized as belonging to the teaching guild, which was the Guild of the Master of Arts. In this organization the bachelor was the apprentice of the master. This relationship was the forerunner of today's academic structure, which often includes graduate and/or teaching assistants (usually studying for advanced degrees).

Generally in Europe, a professor wears the type of garment customary in the university where he/she is lecturing. In the United States our tradition differs; our professors continue to wear the gown and hood of the university where they received their highest degree.

The gown, in origin, may have been simply a type of overcoat to protect the teacher from the cold in the unheated buildings; the cut or style seems to be derived from ecclesiastical attire. It has usually been black. The gowns of bachelors and masters are usually without trimmings of any sort, whereas those of doctors are faced down the front with velvet and adorned with three velvet bars on the sleeves.

The cap or "mortarboard" may have come from the squarish cap worn by the masons of the Middle Ages, or perhaps was suggested by the shape of the books which occupied so much of the time of scholars. Attached to a button on the "mortarboard" is a tassel; bachelor's and master's are black or the color appropriate to the subject; those of doctors black or golden. The tassel is worn on the left side by those who are receiving or have received a degree.

The hood, a triangular fold of cloth worn over the back of the gown, is faced with colors which denote the field of study represented by the wearer's degree; the colors of the lining are those of the college or university from which the degree was granted. The length of the hood is correspondingly longer with each degree.

The wide velvet borders extending down the front of the doctoral gown, the velvet bar on the sleeves, and the borders of most hoods are colored according to scholarly field of the wearer. The most usual of these are:
