

Hyde County Population Highlights

- From 1990 to 2000, Hyde County **lost 25 residents**, which was a **1.5% decrease** in its total population.
- From 1990 to 2000, Hyde County **gained 9 residents to in-migration** which was a **.5% increase** in its total population.
- From 1990 to 2000, Hyde County had 34 more deaths than births.
- 25.61% of Hyde County's residents are under the age of 18, while 22.32% are aged 65+.
- Hyde County's **median age is 42.2**. This younger than Hand, but older than Sully.
- Hyde County's **sex ratio is 102.06**, meaning there are about 102 males for every 100 females. This is higher than Hand, but lower than Sully.
- Hyde County's **fertility rate is 68.1** births for every 1,000 females aged 15-44. This is higher than Hand, but lower than Sully.

Hyde County Agriculture in 2002

- Hyde County had **187 farms**, which was a **17.6% decrease** from 1997.
- Hyde County's **average farm size was 2,507**. This is larger than Hand, but smaller than Sully.
- Hyde County's **average net farm income is \$21,372**. This is lower than Hand, but smaller than Sully.

Hyde County Economics in 2000

- Hyde County's **per capita income was \$16,356**. This is lower than both Hand and Sully counties.
- Hyde County's **median household income is \$31,103**. This is lower than Hand and Sully counties.
- **16.0%** of Hyde's residents aged 25+ had **completed a B.S. degree or higher.** This is higher than Hand, but lower than Sully.
- **12.29%** of Hyde County's residents are living **at or below the official poverty line.** This compares with 13.18% for the state of South Dakota, 9.24% for Hand County, and 12.06% for Sully County.
- **10.07%** of Hyde County's **children under the age of 5** are living **at or below the official poverty line.** This compares with 19.77% for the state of South Dakota, 13.64% for Hand County, and 7.78% for Sully County.
- **18.3%** of workers in Hyde County **commute into work from another county**. This is higher than both Hand and Sully counties.
