# NEW SEASON, NEW FACES, NEW OUTLOOK

---

When the 1984 football season opens at Portland State Sept. 1, South Dakota State will have a new offense, a lot of new faces, and some new enthusiasm.

State's traditional ground-pounding offense will take to the air this season, a situation dictated by the quarterbacks currently wearing the Yellow and Blue.

Defensively, graduation took seven starters and 14 lettermen so a rebuilding job is in store there.

New names? State with Mike Busch at quarterback. A Huron High graduate, he played at Idaho State for two years, honing his passing skills for a team which threw the ball 40 or 50 times a game.

"Mike is the best passer we have had at State in a long time," coach Wayne Haensel says. "And he has a good football mind. He understands the game."

A leader maybe? Under pressure, we'll see. But that's something State has been short on for a long time.

While Busch has the inside track to replace Mike Law as starting quarterback, the job won't be his without a battle. Redshirted sophomore Rich Morehouse is also a talented signal caller. And State's lone quarterback recruit, Ted Wahl from Jamestown, ND, is also a thrower.

In front of the quarterback is a veteran offensive line . . . a line which is a year older, a little bigger, and still young. Of the entire group of offensive line candidates, only two are seniors. And there's some quality.

At tight end, Dennis Thomas, 6-4, 236, established himself as a starter last year when he caught 33 passes for 332 yards. This year, he should be an all-conference candidate.

Another all-league possibility is right tackle Mark Diesch, 6-5, 256. He lettered as a reserve after walking on in 1982, then started last year.

At left guard, Doug Pearson, 6-0, 233, returns. Pearson, Thomas and Diesch are all juniors.

**RICK WEGHER**, halfback, leading rusher last year with 685 yards (5.3 Ypc) — had 1,463 all purpose yards, adding 288 on 35 pass receptions and 490 on 22 kickoff returns . . . career has 976 yards rushing, 52 receptions for 463 yards, 71 kickoff returns for 1326 yards, and 14 punt returns for 55 yards . . . 2820 all-purpose yards with 10 career touchdowns.

**MARK DIESCH**, offensive tackle, returning starter

**DENNIS THOMAS**, tight end, returning starter

**TODD YACKLEY**, outside linebacker, returning starter

---

At center, Jeff Mounts, 6-4, 254, started last year. He's just a sophomore this time around.

The two spots left open by graduation both have lettermen. Kim McDermott has grown from a 6-3, 220, backup center last year to a 6-3½, 241 tackle this year. He's another junior. Rick Sweet, 6-3, 228, was a backup at both tackle and tight end last year. Now he's at right guard. He's a senior as is letterman Jeff Thorpe, 6-1, 218, also at guard.

Other line prospects include freshman tackle Dan Tindall, 6-5, 224; plus juniors Dave Pace, 6-3, 235, at center; Dave Cave, 6-2, 225, at guard; and Fred Hrdlicka, 6-2, 256, at tackle. Pace and Cave are junior college transfers who were with the Jacks for spring practice.

The backfield, behind the quarterback, also returns three starters: Rick Wegher, Kevin Skalla and Paul Prout. Wegher had 1,463 all-purpose yards last year, averaging 5.3 yards per carry rushing. All

three have seen considerable action the past two seasons and all three can also catch the ball.

Biggest problem with the backfield will be depth. Rod Riehl, the team's leading rusher in 1982, will miss the entire season after knee surgery last year. Thus, there

are no other lettermen returning. Junior fullback Mike Evenson should contribute this year, but the rest of the depth will likely come from incoming freshmen.

At wide receiver, all-NCC Mike Ethier graduated. Two players who backed up last year will see a lot of

action, Scott Schaefer and trackster Jeff Tiefenthaler.

State redshirted all of its scholarshiped freshmen last season and the area where they will be most noticeable this year is on defense, both in the line and the secondary. There could be a bunch of "freshmen" playing.

Four second-year freshmen—tackles Mike Weiske, 6-2, 215; Ken Kraft, 6-1, 203; and Tom Slattery, 6-3, 242, plus nose guard George Cavanaugh, 6-2, 227—will be counted on to fill holes in the line. In the secondary, leading candidates to start include strong safeties Mark Stanley and Barry Nagel plus cornerback Wade Hoffman, all redshirts.

The only starter returning among the down linemen on defense is Kevin Cade, 6-3, 258, at nose. His backup from last year, 6-3, 227 Jay Sohler, has moved to tackle where he will team with Weiske, Kraft and Slattery to fill holes left by graduation.

Six lettermen graduated in the secondary. Only senior Greg Sorensen has starting experience. He's at left corner. Free safety Rick Wirtjes is the only other letterman.

JC transfer Howard Lansman will battle Hoffman at right corner with Stanley and Nagel at strong safety.

That leaves the linebackers. As a group, the backers potentially are the strength of the team. On the other hand, only one of last year's four starters was a member of the number one unit in spring ball, meaning game experience is lacking.

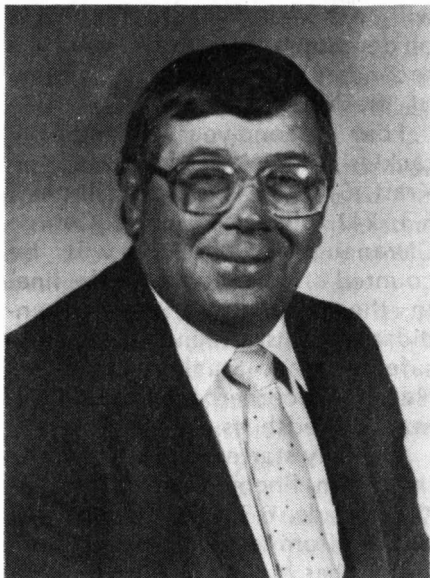
The returnee, is Todd Yackley, 6-4, 217, at left outside backer. Transfer Bruce Klostermann, 6-4, 225, has the edge over returning starter Greg Dralle, 6-2, 221, on the right side.

Inside, Jim Kaufman, 6-1 ½, 208, and Brian Sisley, 6-4, 210, were on the first unit in the spring. Kaufman lettered last year as a reserve; Sisley missed the season and is a sophomore eligibility wise. Behind Kaufman and Sisley are John Lewis, 6-2, 212, a three-year letterman who started last year; letterman Ross Brockshus, 6-1, 215; and transfer Matt Stanley, 6-1 ½, 225.

# HAENSEL NEW HEAD COACH

---



Calling it a new era in South Dakota State football is a misnomer.

Jackrabbit football and the name Wayne Haensel are almost synonymous.

Haensel has been a player and assistant coach at State long enough to know everything there is to know about Jackrab-

bit football—from the winning tradition of his playing days, when the Jacks were atop the North Central Conference more often than not, to the challenge facing him now as the new head coach.

The Jacks haven't won a conference championship since 1962. That's just five years after Haensel was co-captain of the 1957 championship team.

Thus, that becomes the ultimate goal—bring back a championship to the team which has won 14 titles over the years enough to keep SDSU in third place on the all-time list despite the fact that the Jacks haven't won one in the last 20.

But of more immediate concern is installing the Wayne Haensel philosophy into the program. There are some changes being made, believe it!!!

"This isn't the way I wanted to become head coach," Haensel said when he was named boss of the Rabbits five days after John Gregory was relieved of those duties following the 1981 season. "But if I don't take the job, someone else will, and that someone won't have the burning love for Jackrabbit football and South Dakota State that I have."

Haensel has paid his dues, coaching in the high school ranks for 14 years, then spending nine years as an assistant coach with SDSU. From the Little House on the Prairie town—Walnut Grove, Minn. He played for coach Ralph Ginn and earned both all-North Central Conference and Scholastic All-America honors as a Jackrabbit. He was

drafted by the New York Giants, but did not play professional football.

Instead, he became a coach. Seven years at Beresford (1959-66) produced a 47-12-1 record. He went to Mitchell and his teams had a six-year record of 31-20-1, including a mythical state championship in 1971. And he coached one year at Sioux City North, with the team posting a 5-4 record in 1972. He joined the SDSU staff in 1973 as an assistant coach, handling the offensive line until last year when he became defensive coordinator.

All of Haensel's talents haven't been confined to the football field. In 1976, he won the title of Pork Cookout King of South Dakota at the state Pork Producers Association convention in Sioux Falls. That qualified him for the national cookoff.

Haensel has also been a key figure in SDSU's track picture, developing an impressive string of weightmen for the Jacks (SDSU entrants won three straight NCC shot put titles (1979-81) before settling for second the past two seasons.

In 1972, Haensel was the first recipient of the Ralph Ginn Distinguished Coaching Award, an honor created in memory of Haensel's college coach.

Haensel earned his Bachelor's Degree at SDSU, then added a Master's Degree in Biology from Montana State in 1964 and has done post-master's work at the University of Idaho and the University of South Dakota.

Haensel and his wife, Kris, have three children.

## DON CHARLSON . . . DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR, DEFENSIVE LINE

Don was a standout nose guard for SDSU (1975-77), earning all-NCC recognition as a senior. A native of Sioux City and a graduate of Sioux City Heelan (1973), he attended the Air Force Academy prep school for one year before transferring back to SDSU. He earned his Bachelor's Degree at SDSU in 1978 and added a Master's in 1979 before moving on to Yankton College where he was defensive coordinator for two years. He then spent one season as head coach at Westmar, guiding the Eagles to a 5-4 record, winning five of the last six games. Don and his wife, Teresa, have two children.



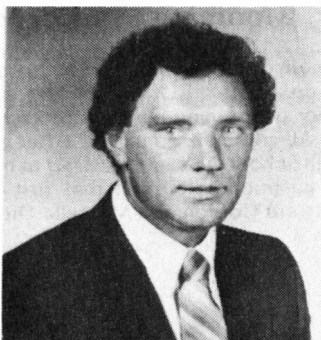
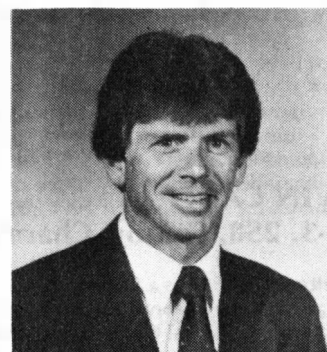


## MARK EKELAND ..... LINEBACKERS

Mark is the newest member of the Jackrabbit staff joining the Yellow and Blue July 1, 1983. He is linebacker coach for football and head baseball coach. Ekeland replaced Erv Huether, who retired after 34 years as head baseball coach at SDSU. Guided SDSU to conference and regional baseball titles last spring as State went 27-13 in his first season. A Rapid City native, he attended Augustana College, earned his Bachelor's Degree in 1973 and added a Master's Degree at SDSU in 1978. Brad is in his ninth year on the Jackrabbit staff, doubling as assistant football coach and head swimming coach. He was head coach at Sioux Falls College for three seasons and counted among his players Rick Danmeier, now place kicker for the Minnesota Vikings. He was working for Gopher Athletic Supply before joining the SDSU staff. A 1962 graduate of Danube, Minn., High School, Hoffman earned his Master's Degree from the University of South Dakota in 1971. Hoffman and his wife, Kathryn, have two children, including son Wade who will be a freshman football player at SDSU this fall.

## LARRY IRELAND ..... RECRUITING COORDINATOR, DEFENSIVE SECONDARY

Larry joined the SDSU staff during the summer of 1981 and was named coordinator of recruiting after Haensel became head coach. A graduate of Scotland High School, Ireland attended Yankton College where he was all-Tri State Conference defensive back three times. After graduating from YC in 1968, he earned his Master's Degree from the University of South Dakota in 1969, then coached and taught at Pierre and Gregory before becoming head football coach at Hot Springs in 1973. His teams there won Black Hills Conference championships in 1974 and 1976, and he was named South Dakota High School Coach of the year for 1974 by the state's sportswriters. From there, Ireland went to Mitchell for one year before coming an assistant coach at Augustana in 1978. His overall record as head coach shows 43 victories against 29 defeats and one tie. Ireland, and his wife, Sandy, have four children.

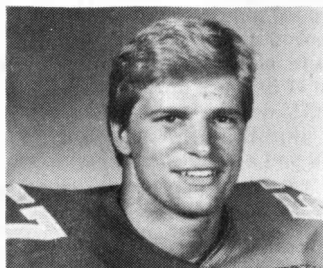

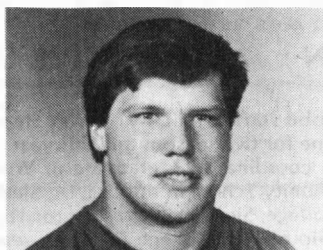


**\*ROSS BROCKSHUS . . . . .LINEBACKER**

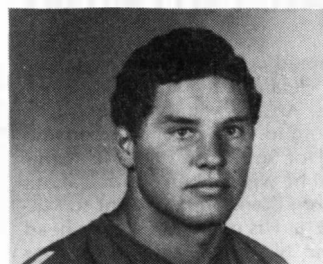
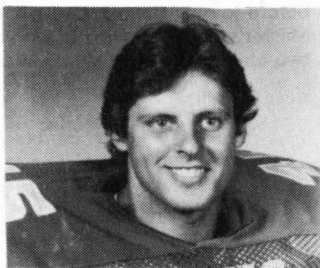


**\*\*MARK DIESCH . . . . .OFFENSIVE TACKLE**

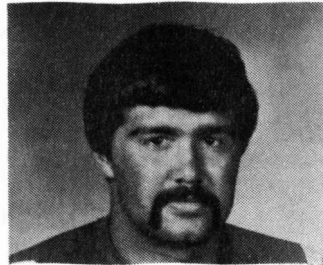
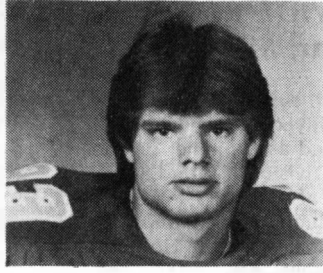
**\*JIM KAUFMAN . . . . .LINEBACKER**

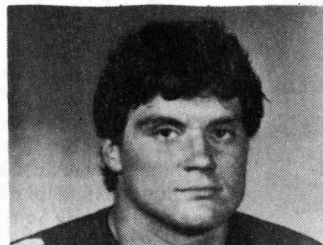
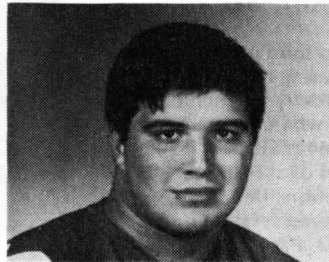


**\*KIM McDERMOTT OFFENSIVE TACKLE

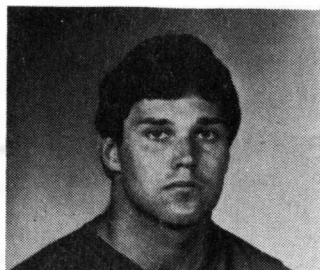
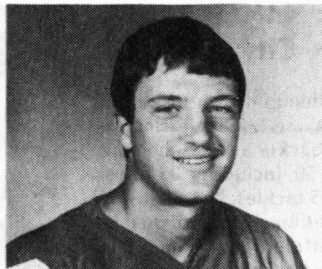
**\*\*PAUL PROUT ..... FULLBACK

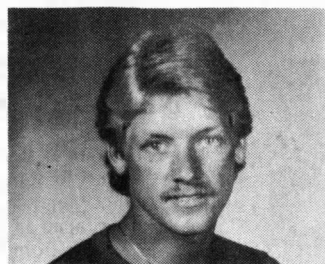
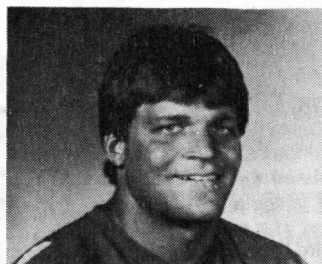


**\*\*\*KEVIN SKALLA ..... RUNNINGBACK**

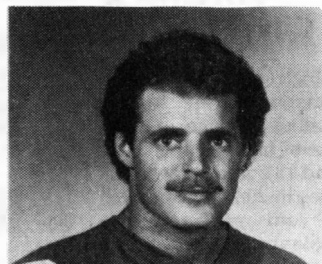


**\*SCOT SCHAEFER ..... WIDE RECEIVER**  
**5-11½, 195, Junior, Omaha, Neb.**

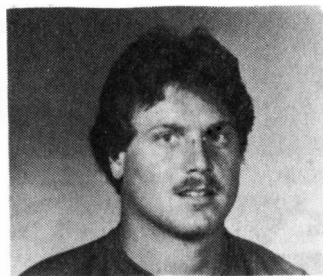

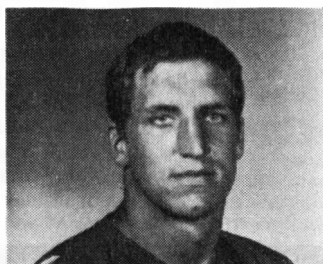
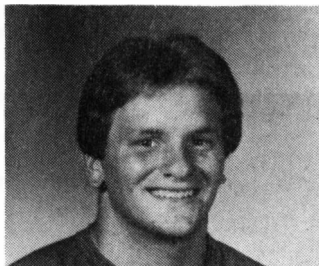


**\*RICK SWEET . . . . . OFFENSIVE GUARD

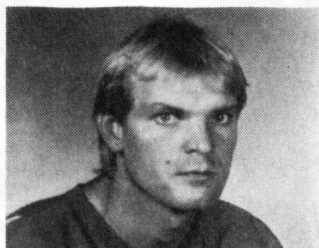
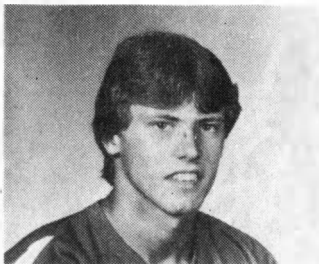


**\*\*JEFF THORPE . . . . . OFFENSIVE GUARD

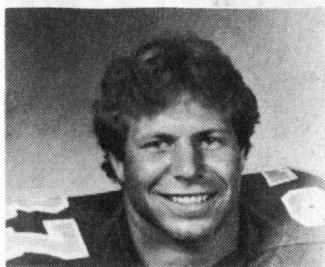
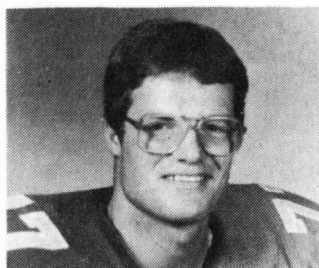


**\*RICK WIRTJES . . . . . FREE SAFETY

## Coughlin-Alumni Stadium Now in 23rd Season

Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, the home of the Jackrabbits, is in its 23rd season.

The stadium opened September 22, 1962, when the Jacks lost a 9-7 decision to Arkansas State College.

Through the first 22 years of operation, there have been 113 SDSU games at Coughlin-Alumni Stadium. SDSU has a record of 60-53 at home during that time and there has never been a tie game at CAS.

The stadium project was started after Charles Coughlin, 1909 SDSU

graduate, donated \$50,000 towards the building of a new stadium to replace State Field. The remaining \$250,000 of the original \$300,000 cost was raised from alumni, students and friends of SDSU.

In the winter of 1963-64, a 46 x 106 foot lockerroom was constructed immediately south of the stadium. That was a \$54,885 project.

In the fall of 1978, a new scoreboard, complete with message center, was installed. The scoreboard was manufactured by Daktronics, Inc., a Brookings-based firm.

The stadium is topped off by an excellent press facility, which was built for \$23,000 in 1962. The press

box is 100 feet long, 10 feet wide and has six three-man booths, four two-man booths plus a 40-foot working press area.

The basic concrete stadium was upgraded in 1982 with the installation of new yellow and blue seat covers in the center reserved sections. The permanent stadium seats 6,044. Additional bleachers behind both end zones and on the east side of the field increase capacity to 16,000.

During the summer of 1984, an underground sprinkling system was added and by 1985, a project to upgrade the east grandstands will be completed.

# SDSU FOUNDED 104 YEARS AGO

South Dakota State University will enter its 104th year of service this fall.

One of 68 land-grant institutions in the United States, SDSU was founded by the Territorial Legislature February 21, 1881. The first building was erected in 1883 and classes began September 24, 1884.

SDSU has the largest enrollment of any college or university in South Dakota, reaching an all-time high of 7,289 in the fall of 1982.

Designated for land-grant status by the Morrill Act of 1862, the Enabling act, admitting the State of South Dakota, approved February 22, 1889, provided 120,000 acres of land be granted for the use and support of the agriculture college. By the Enabling Act of 1889, Congress granted South Dakota 40,000 additional acres in lieu of a grant that had been made to new states in 1841.

In 1923, the institution's instructional program was organized under five divisions: Agriculture, Engineering, General Science, Home Economics, and Pharmacy. In 1956, the sixth undergraduate division, Nursing, was created and in 1957, all graduate work was organized into a Graduate Division. The university organization was formally recognized when the legislature changed the name from South Dakota State College to South Dakota State University on July 1, 1964. At that time, the following colleges were created: Agriculture and Biological Sciences, Arts and Science, Engineering, Home Economics, Nursing and Pharmacy, as well as the Graduate School.

In 1974, the College of General Registration was created to provide assistance to students who are undecided as to a major, are pre-professional or who want one or two years of general personal studies.

In 1975, the Division of Education was created to provide greater recognition of the part the University plays in preparation of teachers, counselors and administrators for primary and secondary school systems and higher education.

SDSU also carries out a vigorous program of research through the Agricultural Experiment Station, organized in 1887 under the Hatch Act of Congress, and also has an ambitious program in continuing education through the Cooperative Extension Service, established to provide useful, current agricultural and homemaking information to the people of the state.

SDSU offers over 125 majors and a wide variety of Master's programs.

Brookings, the home of SDSU, celebrated its 100th birthday during the summer of 1979. Brookings is a growing community of 15,000 people located in east central South Dakota, in the center of some of the best outdoor recreation country around. Hunting, fishing, boating—all types of outdoor sports—are a part of the way of life in the Brookings area.

Athletically, SDSU is a charter member of the North Central Conference and has won more conference championships than any

other current member with 83.

SDSU's success has not been confined to one or two sports. The Jacks have won 16 of 25 NCC cross country championships decided to date; have won 19 indoor track championships (no one else has won more than 9); have won or shared 14 NCC football championships; have won or shared 14 NCC basketball titles (the Jacks have been in the NCAA basketball playoffs 12 times) and, in fact, are the only current member of the NCC to win at least one championship in each of the conference-sanctioned men's sports.

The SDSU wrestling teams have competed in every College Division—Division II national tournament ever held and have hosted the national tournament twice, in 1973 and again in 1979. The Jacks have finished in the top ten in the NCAA wrestling tournament 15 times since the tournament began in 1963. SDSU wrestlers have earned All-America honors 52 times.

SDSU has also been a dominate force nationally in cross country, first for the men and now for both men and women. Last fall, for example, SDSU was second in the NCAA Division II championships for both men and

women. Jackrabbit men's teams won national championships in 1956 (NAIA), 1959 (NCAA) and 1973 (NCAA). Seven other times, SDSU has been runnerup in the national meet.

Last spring, SDSU became just the second NCC member to qualify for the NCAA Division II World Series in baseball.

And that great sports tradition has carried over into women's sports. SDSU started competition for women in 1967, before Title IX, and success has been a way of life there, too.

The Jacks won back to back national titles in women's cross country (AIAW Division II 1980 and NCAA Division II 1981).

In 1982, the women's track team finished third in the nation and last spring was tenth. The Jacks have won five straight North Central Conference women's track titles: indoors 1982 and 1983; outdoors 1981, 1982 and 1983.

SDSU has won NCC titles in gymnastics, swimming, indoor track, outdoor track and golf, and in 1983, won the first ever NCC women's all-sports title. The men have been either first or second in the all-sports race the last eight years with four championships.

# BEHIND THE SCENES

## H. RAY HOOPS ..... PRESIDENT

Ray Hoops became president of South Dakota State University August 1, succeeding Sherwood O. Berg, who retired. Hoops is a native of Clinton, Ill., and a 1962 graduate of Eastern Illinois University. He earned a Master's Degree in audiology and speech science at Purdue University in 1964, then added a Ph.D. in the same area from Purdue in 1966. Prior to being named president at SDSU, he was vice president of academic affairs at North Dakota State. From 1976 until he moved to NDSU in 1980, he was dean of the graduate college at Northern Iowa. Served two years as a special consultant for the United States Department of Health Education and Welfare, charged with the responsibility of developing the long-range marketing and dissemination plan for the Office of Education and coordination of that plan with those of the Division Health, Education and Welfare. From 1970-74, he was associate director for the Office of Grants and Contracts Administration at Wayne State University in Michigan, overseeing a program involving \$24 million in outside funds per year. In 1973, he served as distinguished research professor and senior Fulbright-Hays research scholar for the College of Medicine at the University of Philippines. He served on numerous committees and panels, including the board of commissioners for the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, and has earned numerous awards, including the Distinguished Service award from the U.S. Office of Education in 1978 and again in 1983.

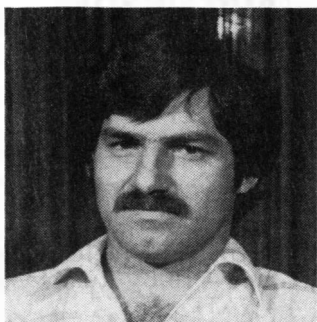


## HARRY FORSYTH ..... ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Forsyth became acting athletic director in June, 1980, following the death of Stan Marshall, then was named to that position on a permanent basis later that summer. He has been on the SDSU staff since 1956. A native of Redfield, Forsyth received his Bachelor's Degree at SDSU in 1951, then returned for his Master's in 1956 and has been here since. He added a doctorate in physical education from Springfield College in 1970. Forsyth was assistant baseball coach for the Jacks for 13 years. He was athletic business manager until that position was changed to assistant athletic director in 1970. Forsyth lettered in basketball and baseball at SDSU after having a pro tryout with the Yankees. He played for Pierre in the old Basin League in 1949. Forsyth was a pilot in Korea during the Korean conflict and is still active in the national guard. His son, Maury, is currently a military pilot.

## MYLO HELLICKSON ..... FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE

Hellickson has been faculty representative at SDSU since 1977, and as such is also chairman of the Athletic, Intramural and Recreation Committee on campus. He has been on the SDSU staff since 1969, serving as a professor in agricultural engineering until he was appointed as head of that department during the summer of '82. His speciality has been in the area of livestock structures and environment with recent emphasis on solar energy use in agriculture. A native of Belfield, ND, he is a graduate of North Dakota State University.



## JIM BOOHER ..... HEAD TRAINER

Jim heads one of the top athletic training operations in the Upper Midwest. He has been responsible for developing the training minor program at SDSU and has had excellent results in placing students when they go on towards their physical therapy degrees. He has been at the Wesleyan team which lost to SDSU in the finals of the NCAA regional at Brookings in 1963 when the Jacks went on to win the national championship. He received his physical therapy training at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn. Booher earned his Master's Degree at SDSU in 1969 and added a Ph.D. from Utah in 1976. He is a graduate of Ashland, Neb., High School.

# SDSU is Charter Member of North Central Conference

South Dakota State is a charter member of the North Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, better known as the North Central Conference or NCC.

The league was formed in the fall of 1921 when representatives of colleges and universities from South Dakota, North Dakota, Minnesota, Iowa and Nebraska met in Chicago to consider the formation of a conference. First official competition had teams from South Dakota State, University of South Dakota, North Dakota State, University of North Dakota, Nebraska Wesleyan, Morningside College, Creighton University, St. Thomas and Des Moines University.

Early competition involved just three sports: football, basketball and track. The NCC now determines championships in 10 sports for men and has an expanding number of championships for women. Men's championships are determined in football, cross country and golf in the fall; basketball, wrestling, swimming and indoor track in the winter; plus baseball, tennis and outdoor track in the spring.

The league has been a model for other NCAA Division II conferences around the nation, not only competitively but also from an administrative standpoint. Athletically, the conference has produced two NCAA College Division basketball champions, USD in 1958 and SDSU in 1963; three NCAA cross-country champions, SDSU in 1959 and 1973 plus NDSU in 1972; and two NCAA wrestling champions. In addition, NDSU won three College Division football championships (awarded via polls), then captured the Division II playoff title in 1983.

The league has had numerous changes in membership over the years, although five charter members are still counted among the teams in the 10-member league.

During the spring and summer of

1981, the most recent changes were made. Mankato State, a league member from 1968 through 1977, was re-admitted to the conference at the league's spring meeting. Then, during the summer, St. Cloud State's application for admission was approved. Mankato and St. Cloud competed in all sports except football and basketball in 1981-82, and will compete for all NCC championships this fall.

The University of Northern Colorado at Greeley was added to the league in 1979, and the Bears won the conference football championship in their first attempt (1980). UNC competes in all conference sports except baseball—they have maintained their baseball program at the Division I level.

Charter members still participating are SDSU, USD, NDSU, UND and Morningside. Also in the league is Augustana College of Sioux Falls, admitted to the conference in 1941; and the University of Nebraska-Omaha, in the league since 1976. UNO was actually in the league from 1935-43 when it was Omaha University—before the university became part of the Nebraska State system.

Des Moines University was the first of the charter members to leave the league, withdrawing in 1926. That university later ceased operations.

Nebraska Wesleyan withdrew following the 1927 football season. St. Thomas and Creighton severed ties in 1928.

The University of Northern Iowa (then Iowa State Teachers College) joined the league in 1936 and left in 1978.

Noel Olson, former athletic director at St. Cloud State, became the league's fourth commissioner during the summer of 1984, succeeding R.D. "Dewey" Halford, who resigned.

The NCC provides weekly statistical reports for the news media from the conference in Fargo during football, basketball and baseball seasons. NDSU sports information director, George Ellis, serves as NCC information officer as well.

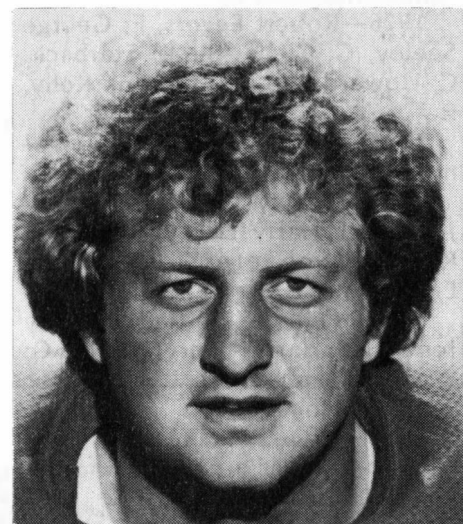

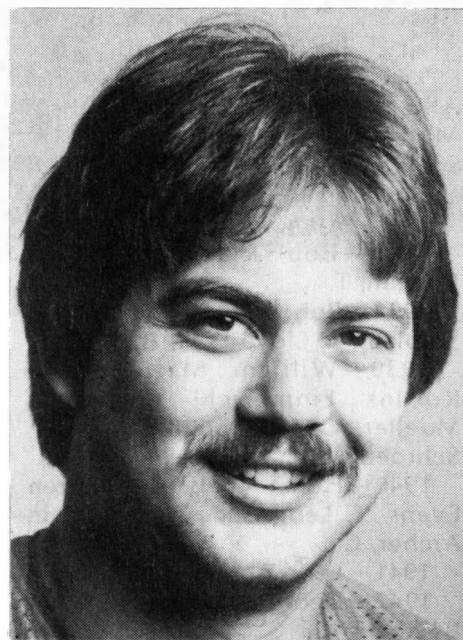

# THE ORIGINAL BEEF BOWL SCORES TO DATE

## SDSU HOSTS THE ORIGINAL BEEF BOWL

SDSU will host the 18th annual Beef Bowl Sept. 22 when the Jacks entertain the North Dakota Sioux in a North Central Conference encounter.

SDSU is the site of the original Beef Bowl, a concept which has been copied by teams all around the country.

The Beef Bowl was started as SDSU's way of recognizing those individuals and firms who donate to SDSU's "Steer for State" program and also as a means of placing special emphasis on the beef industry in South Dakota.

Beef Bowl activities have included a banquet during the week and the famous Beef Bowl barbecue before the game. As part of the pre-game ceremonies, a live steer is auctioned off at the football stadium.

The official Beef Bowl trophy was donated by Bill Zingelberg of Rapid City, a former SDSU student. He carved the trophy from a 40-pound cottonwood log and it depicts a bull in a football helmet.

The past seven years, the media covering the game has voted on the game's Outstanding Player. Winners have been:

1977—Gary Maffett, quarterback, SDSU, who rushed 23 times for 184 yards and completed 4 of 14 passes for another 58 yards, giving him 242 yards total offense as he ran for three touchdowns and passed for a fourth in a 34-2 Jackrabbit victory over Nebraska-Omaha.

1978—Mark Dunbar, defensive end, SDSU, who led the Jackrabbit defense with three quarterback sacks among his nine tackles, a blocked punt which set up one touchdown, and a forced fumble which set up another score in a 41-17 SDSU victory over Morningside.

1979—Bill O'Connor, runningback, from Augustana, became the only non-SDSU player to win the award when he rushed 37 times for 180 yards, including two touchdowns, and in the process became Augustana's all-time career rushing leader. But SDSU, with a late comeback, won the game 28-26.

1980—Marty Higgins, quarterback, SDSU, rushed for 105 yards to spark a

1981—Mike Law, quarterback, SDSU, rushed for 153 yards on 26 carries and completed 10 of 16 passes for another 77 yards giving him 230 yards total offense as the Jacks defeated Nebraska-Omaha 17-10.

1982—Mike Law, quarterback, SDSU, became the first two-time winner of the awards as he scored one touchdown and passed for another in State's 20-7 upset victory over the University of South Dakota. Law had 11 net yards rushing on 12 attempts (33 gained, 22 lost) and also completed 8 of 15 passes for 181 yards including a 75-yard scoring play with John Herman.

1983—Tom Nelson, quarterback, St. Cloud, completed 16 of 29 passes for 233 yards, passed for one touchdown and ran for a second as the Huskies won 28-22 in a battle of two unbeaten teams.

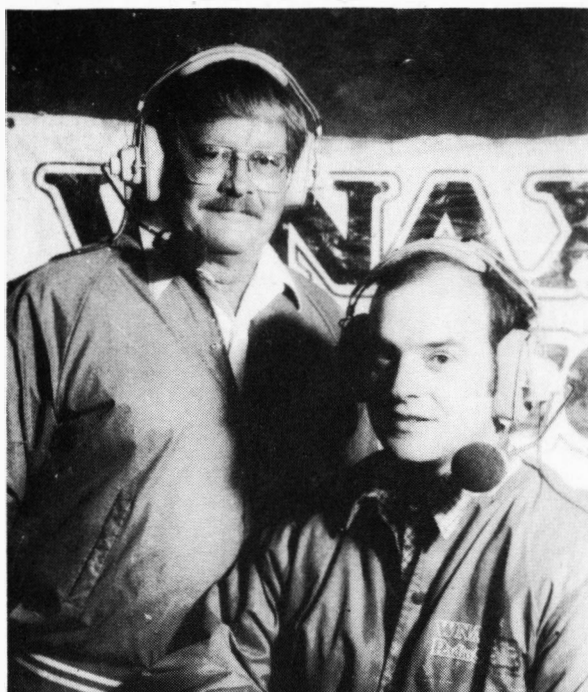

# LISTEN TO THE JACKS ON WNAX

For the 15th consecutive year, all Jackrabbit football and men's basketball games will be broadcast live on WNAX radio.

WNAX is the "Official Station" for SDSU sports.

WNAX is a member of the Roy H. Park Broadcasting group. On the air 24-hours a day, WNAX is a 5,000 watt station which covers much of a five state area (Nebraska, South Dakota, North Dakota, Minnesota and Iowa). It is located at 570 on the AM dial.

"Voice of the Jackrabbits" Norm Hilson will again do the play-by-play with Jerry Oster providing the color commentary. Hilson had open heart surgery in 1983 but was back in the broadcast booth when football season began.

Hilson has been South Dakota Sportscaster of the Year four times, three times as picked by the National Sportscasters and Sports-writers Association and another as picked by the South Dakota High School Coaches Association.

Hilson has been with WNAX for 25-plus years since giving up a disc jockey job in the Twin Cities. A native of Valley City, ND, he is a graduate of Brown Broadcasting Institute in Minneapolis.

He travels about 15,000 miles annually broadcasting sports events, including all SDSU football and men's basketball games. WNAX also carries a full schedule of high school football and basketball, including heavy coverage during the playoff season. And even SDSU home games are a trip for Hilson—it's 270 miles round trip from Yankton to Brookings.

WNAX is the only radio station which has originated play-by-play broadcasts of every game played in the history of the state high school girls basketball tournament.

In addition to SDSU and high school events carried on WNAX, the station is a member of the Minnesota Twins and Minnesota Vikings radio networks; carries some Yankton College football games and also fills in with an occasional Nebraska Cornhusker football game.

This will be the 20th consecutive year WNAX has carried SDSU basketball.

Hilson was Parade Marshall of the 1980 Hobo Day parade at SDSU.
