# SOUTH DAKOTA ART MUSEUM NEWS

## FALL SPECIAL EXHIBITIONS

**The Marghab Linen Auction Collection**, August 28—September 17, includes 78 sets (810 individual pieces) of vintage, hand embroidered Marghab linens from Madeira. The collection was given to the Museum by an anonymous patron and will be auctioned as a benefit to the Museum Endowment on Saturday, September 17, 5:00—10:00 p.m. Auction tickets are available at the Museum. Marghab linens were once sold through such exclusive stores as Georg Jensen in New York, Neiman-Marcus in Dallas, and Bullock's Wilshire in Los Angeles, and are represented in the collection of the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. The complete collection of Marghab articles and designs is at the South Dakota Art Museum, a gift of Vera Way Marghab of Watertown, South Dakota, founder of the enterprise. The linens have not been made since 1978, and are very rare today.

**Carl Milles Sculpture and Drawings**, September 25—November 6, includes 16 bronzes and 18 drawings from Millesgarden, the artist's home and now a museum in Stockholm, Sweden. The tour of this exhibition to American museums was arranged by The Trust for Museum Exhibitions as a celebration of the 350th anniversary of the founding of New Sweden in Delaware. Milles (1875-1955) was hailed in Europe as the successor to Gianlorenzo Bernini as a designer of sculptural fountains. During 1931-51 he was resident sculptor and an influential teacher at Cranbrook Academy of Art in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan, where his elegant figurative work for the campus was the perfect complement to the disciplined architecture of the Finnish-American master, Eliel Saarinen. Museum Members may preview the exhibition and hear an introduction by Sioux Falls sculptor Palmer Eide on Saturday, September 24, 5:00-7:00 p.m.

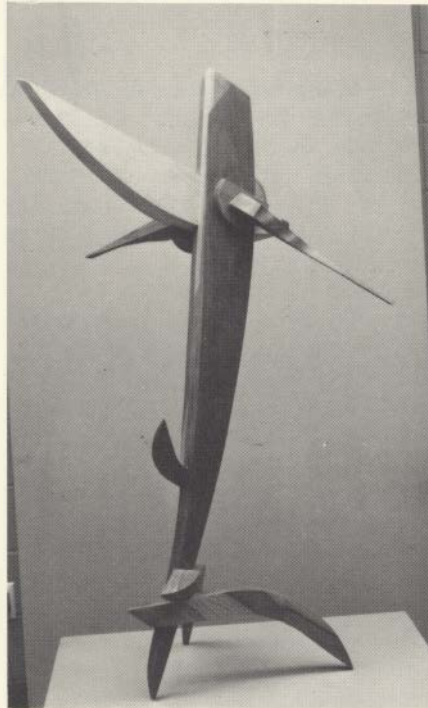

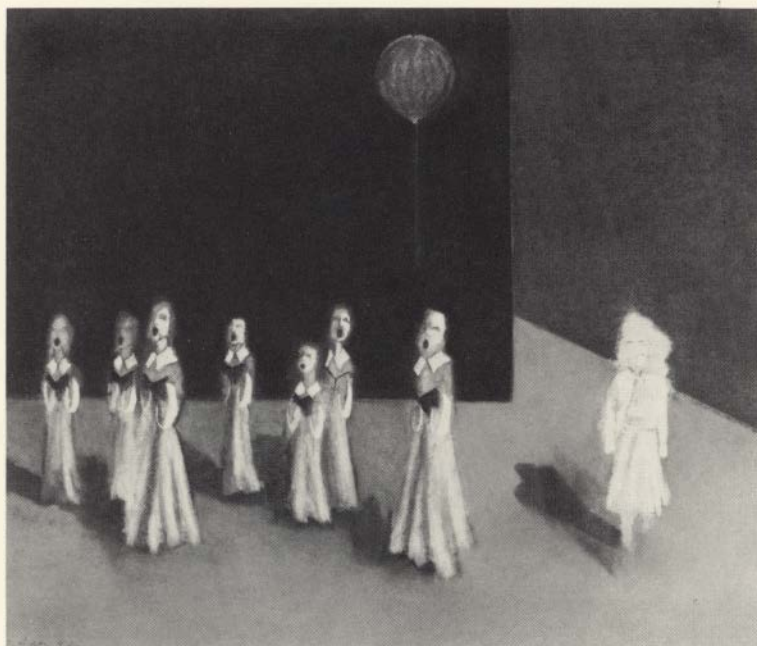

## MUSEUM RECEIVES FEDERAL AND STATE GRANTS

A \$16,980 General Operating Support Award has been granted to the Museum for its 1988-89 fiscal year by the Institute of Museum Services, an independent agency within the National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities. The Institute received 1,311 applications from museums of all kinds and sizes, and granted 402 awards. General Operating Support Awards are granted on the strength and quality of applicant museums, with quality defined as the judicious management of available resources to provide the

best possible services to the community and the general public.

An \$8,160 Challenge Support Grant has been awarded to the Museum by the South Dakota Arts Council with funds from the National Endowment for the Arts. The grant is designed to help the Museum advance the visual arts in the state, prepare for future needs through program and financial planning, and assist in the development and expansion of service to the artists and the public.

## MUSEUM FILM SOCIETY

Fifteen award-winning international films will be presented during the 1988-89 season at the Museum, beginning September 22 with the French comedy directed by Claude Zidi, *My New Partner*. Admission to

the series is restricted to members of the Film Society. Film Society membership is \$15 a year, \$10 to Museum Members. For membership applications and the schedule of films, contact the Museum office.

## MARTENS PRESENTS VISITING ARTIST LECTURE

Christiane Martens will present an illustrated talk on her sculpture at the Museum on Wednesday, September 28, 7:30 p.m., free and open to the public. A native of Liegnitz, Germany, Martens taught at Augustana College in Sioux Falls and South Dakota State University. Her exterior sculpture can be seen at Augustana College and Spitznagel Partners in Sioux Falls. Her first large commission was a 21' high stainless steel work for the University of Alaska in Fairbanks, completed in 1980. This lecture is supported by the National Endowment for the Arts, Augustana College, South Dakota State University, and the University of South Dakota.

## MUSEUM COLLECTION FEATURED IN NATIONAL MAGAZINE

The Museum's Thornburn Collection of Lakota or Western Sioux tribal art was featured in the summer issue of *American Indian Art Magazine*.

"Beaded Bibles and Victory Pouches: Twentieth Century Lakota Honoring Gifts" was written by Barbara Hail, director of Brown University's Haffenreffer Museum. Hail was commissioned to catalogue Native American tribal art in the South Dakota Art Museum's collections in 1987 under a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. Rev. Frank M. Thornburn of Brookings served communities on the Standing Rock and Pine Ridge Reservations of South Dakota for the Episcopal Church during 1931-52, and over the years received a number of special gifts, including beaded bibles, hymnals, and prayer books, beaded and quilled stoles, moccasins, bags, parfleche, and musical instruments. He and wife Abigail gave their collection to the Museum in 1985. Much of it can be seen now in the Museum exhibition, *Sioux Tribal Art*.
