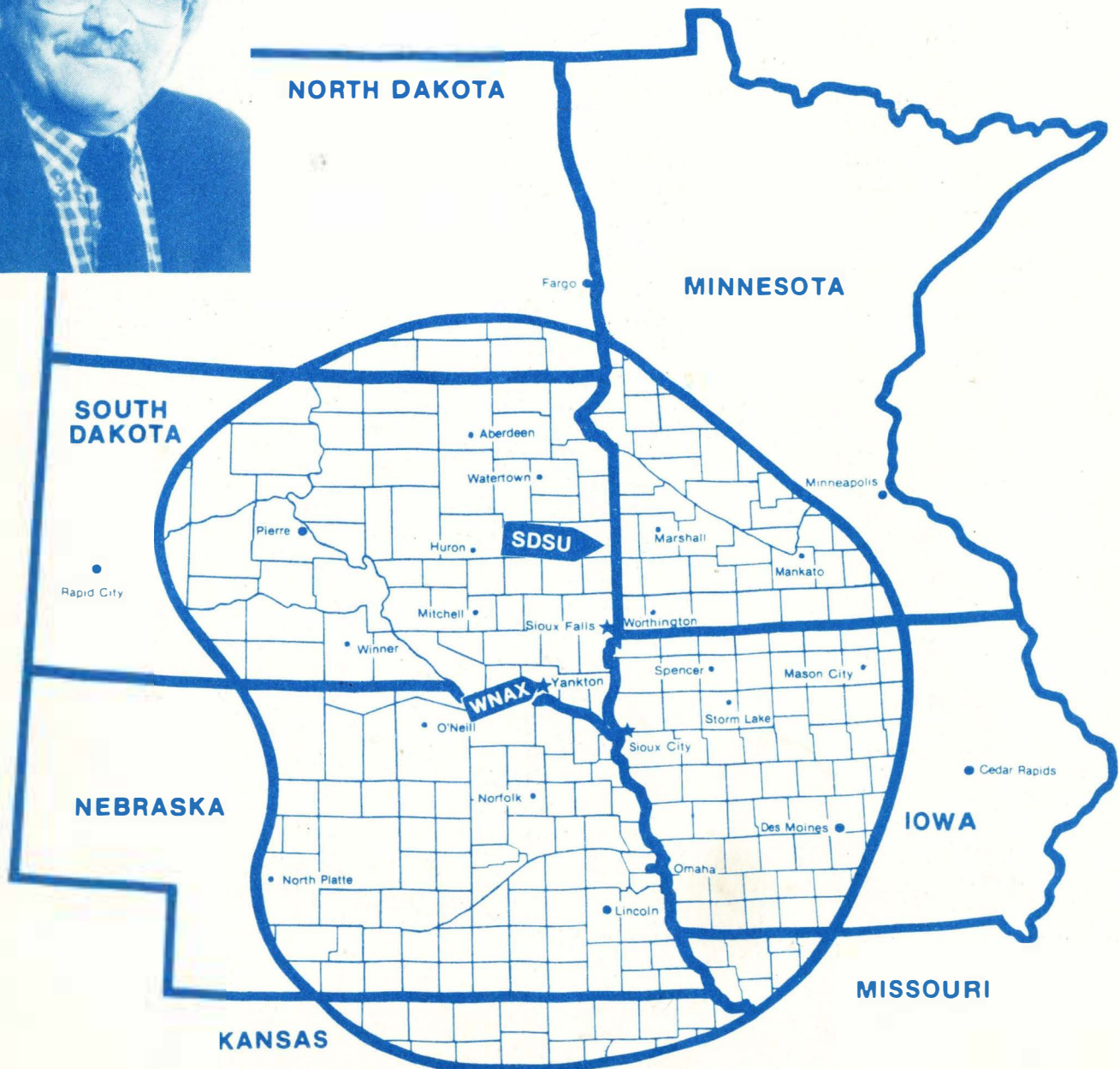
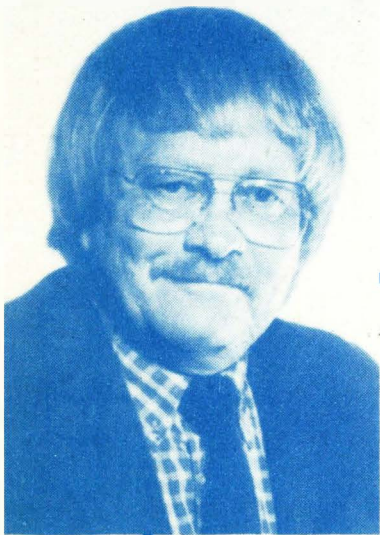

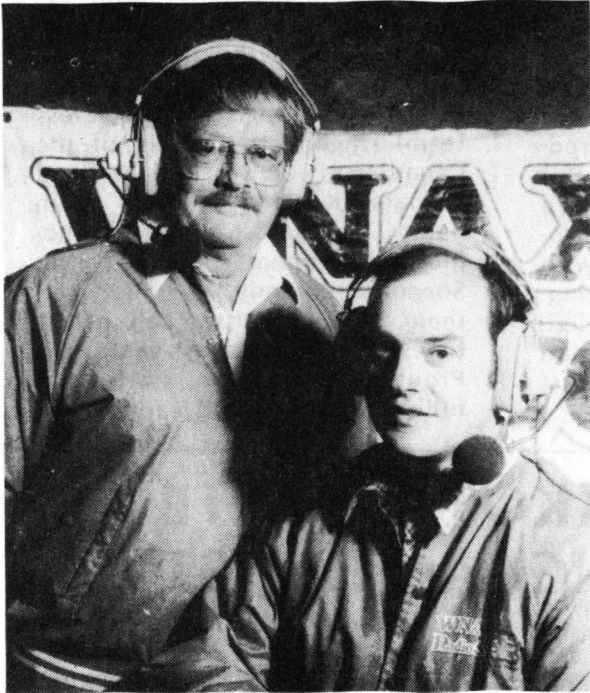

LISTEN TO THE JACKS ON WNAX

For the 16th consecutive year, all Jackrabbit football and men's basketball games will be broadcast live on WNAX radio.

WNAX is the "Official Station" for SDSU sports.

WNAX is a member of the Roy H. Park Broadcasting group. On the air 24-hours a day, WNAX is a 5,000 watt station which covers much of a five state area (Nebraska, South Dakota, North Dakota, Minnesota and Iowa). It is located at 570 on the AM dial.

"Voice of the Jackrabbits" Norm Hilson will again do the play-by-play with Jerry Oster providing the color commentary. Hilson had open heart surgery in 1983 but was back in the broadcast booth when football season began that fall.

Hilson has been South Dakota Sportscaster of the Year four times, three times as picked by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association and another as picked by the South Dakota High School Coaches Association.

Hilson has been with WNAX for 25-plus years since giving up a disc jockey job in the Twin Cities. A native of Valley City, ND, he is a graduate of Brown Broadcasting Institute in Minneapolis.

He travels about 15,000 miles annually broadcasting sports events, including all SDSU football and men's basketball games. WNAX also carries a full schedule of high school football and basketball, including heavy coverage during the playoff season. And even SDSU home games are a trip for Hilson—it's 270 miles round trip from Yankton to Brookings.

WNAX is the only radio station which has originated play-by-play broadcasts of every game played in the history of the state high school girls basketball tournament.

In addition to SDSU and high school events carried on WNAX, the station is a member of the Minnesota Twins and Minnesota Vikings radio networks and also fills in with an occasional Nebraska Cornhusker football game.

This will be the 21st consecutive year WNAX has carried SDSU basketball.

Hilson was Parade Marshall of the 1980 Hobo Day parade at SDSU.

NEW SEASON, NEW FACES, NEW OUTLOOK

When South Dakota State opens fall football camp on August 11, around 110 prospects are expected.

Of those, 62 will either be freshmen or redshirted freshmen.

There will be 18 seniors on the team, but only five of those will play on the defensive unit.

Those numbers provide a hint of what to look for from the 1985 Jackrabbits.

With 13 seniors and 18 lettermen, the offensive unit should be set. More specific, the Jacks will have a veteran offensive line, veteran receivers, Mike Busch back at quarterback, but have a big question mark at the running-back positions.

Defensively, the Jacks face a rebuilding job. But, there is a bunch of good young talent to work with.

A quick glance at the personnel.

OFFENSIVE LINE—The Jacks graduated all-conference guard Rick Sweet, but still have players with starting experience at every position. Senior Fred Hrdlicka (6-2, 264) played tackle last year, and started when Kim Dermott was injured. Now McDermott (6-3, 252) is back and Hrdlicka has moved to guard. Doug Pearson (6-2, 232) is a returning starter at left guard, Jeff Mounts (6-3, 288) is back at center, and Mark Diesch (6-5, 264) will be starting for the third year at right tackle. There is also a letterman backup at each position: Norm Lingle (6-5, 261) at tackle, Dave Cave (6-2, 232) at guard and Dave pace (6-3, 261) at center. Two newcomers who could also help are tackle Lee Stewart (6-3, 275) and guard Dan Duitscher (6-3, 238), both freshmen redshirts.

RECEIVERS—All-conference tight end Dennis Thomas (6-3, 245) returns for his third year as a starter and is joined by returning starters Jeff Tiefenthaler (6-2, 180) at wide receiver and Scot Schaefer (6-0, 185) at flanker. Sophomore Jay Parker (6-5, 240) lettered at tight end last year, as did Dan Convey (6-0, 189) at flanker. Mike Perkins (6-0, 185) is back at wide receiver after being sidelined with a knee injury. He lettered two years ago. Junior college transfer Vince Mendez (5-9, 170, Rio Hondo

JC in this year with Tiefenthaler, Perkins and Mendez.

QUARTERBACK—Mike Busch handled all but three snaps from center last season as the Jacks red-shirted freshman Ted Wahl. But the Jacks lost backup Rich Morehouse when he signed a professional baseball contract with the California Angels last spring. Morehouse had two years of eligibility remaining. Busch re-wrote all the school passing records last year.

RUNNINGBACKS—This is the problem area on the offensive unit. First team All-America tailback Rick Wegher (Associated Press team) is gone to Calgary of the Canadian Football League. And fullback Kevin Skalla has graduated. The Jacks have two sophomore lettermen returning, Dan Sonnek and Randy Jones. Between them, they carried the ball just 12 times for 27 yards last year. Paul Prout, a two-year starter at fullback, was injured early in the

WEGHER SETS NCAA RECORDS

South Dakota State University tailback Rick Wegher finished second in the nation in rushing (NCAA Division II) and put his name in the NCAA record book twice.

Wegher returned 36 kickoffs for 824 yards last season and became the first player in NCAA history to return over 100 kickoffs in a career, finishing with 107 returns for 2,150 yards during his four years at SDSU. That's an all-division record for number of returns.

In the 1984 season finale at Wyoming, Wegher and Cowboy halfback Kevin Lowe co-authored an NCAA record for "Most Yards Gained by Two Opposing Players." Lowe set a Wyoming record with 302 yards rushing, on just ten carries. Wegher had 231 yards on 39 trips, giving the two backs 533 yards rushing in the game. The old record was 495 set in 1978 when Frank Mordica of Vanderbilt and Shelby Ball of Air Force set the mark, with Mordica getting 321 of that total.

season last year and received another year of eligibility as a hardship case. He's back, but did not play spring ball. The Jacks also have JC transfer Ditanyon Johnson (San Gabriel, Calif., JC) but he missed spring ball with a knee injury. Sophomore Burt Lingenfelter played fullback in spring ball. Chances are good a couple of incoming freshmen could contribute at tailback, J.D. Berreth from Delano, Minn., and Todd Peters from Green Bay, Wis. And freshman redshirt John Asplund, could contribute this season as could freshman Kevin Klapprodt from Brookings.

DEFENSIVE LINE—Tackle to tackle, the Jacks lost some people but also have four returning lettermen with starting experience. Tom Slattery (6-3, 240) started early last season but was injured. J.J. Weems (6-4, 221) lettered as a backup as a freshman last season and will battle Slattery for the right tackle spot. Mike Weiske (6-2, 225) alternated with Slattery early in the season last year, then became a starter and is the front runner at left tackle, with redshirted freshman Darwin Bishop (6-5, 242) in the hunt. Kevin Cade is gone after two seasons as starter at nose guard. Letterman Brian Sisley (6-4, 226) is among those in the battle for the starting nod, along with redshirted freshmen Brian Webster (6-3, 218) and Ted Ortale (6-2, 217).

OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS—All-conference Todd Yackley is gone on one side, but Bruce Klostermann (6-4, 226) returns on the other. Klostermann should be set for a big senior season. Redshirted freshman Dan Jackson (6-3, 203) is the front runner on the other side, with letterman Dean Dierks (6-1, 208) in the picture. Others who could play outside include junior Todd Thompson (6-1, 207) and sophomore Barry Nagel (6-2, 195). Nagel alternated at strong safety with Mark Stanley last year before both were injured at North Dakota State.

INSIDE LINEBACKERS—There are three returning with starting experience: seniors Jim Kaufman (6-1, 208) and Matt Stanley (6-1, 225) plus sophomore Darrin Thurston (6-1, 192). Stanley had just joined the starting line last year when he got hurt. Mark Stanley (6-1, 200) may move to inside from the free safety spot, but it's questionable if he will be ready to play anywhere

this fall, depending on how he has recovered from last year's injury. Other inside backers include

sophomore Ken Kraft (6-1, 213) plus freshmen Dan Niehus (6-1, 206) and Greg Farley (6-1, 212).

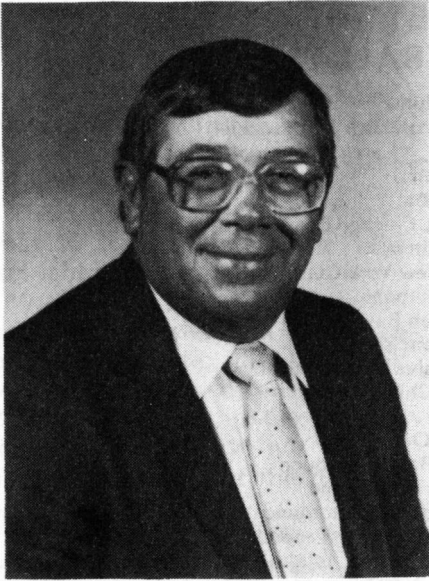
Twenty-two former South Dakota State University players have gone on to play professional football.

HAENSEL IN FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH



Wayne Haensel is in his fourth year as head coach of the South Dakota State football team.

But Haensel and the Rabbits go back a lot farther than just the past three seasons.

Haensel has been a player, assistant coach and head coach at SDSU long enough to know everything there is to know about Jackrabbit football — from the winning tradition of his playing days, when the Jacks were atop the North Central Conference more often than not, to the challenge facing him now as he tries to rebuild that tradition.

The Jacks haven't won a conference championship since 1962. That's just five years after Haensel was co-captain of the 1957 championship team.

Thus, that becomes the ultimate goal — bring back a championship to the team which has won 14 titles over the years . . . enough to keep SDSU in third place on the all-time list of NCC first-place teams.

From the Little House on the Prairie town of Walnut Grove, MN, Haensel played for coach Ralph Ginn and earned both all-North Central Conference and Scholastic All-America honors as a Jackrabbit.

He was drafted by the New York Giants, but did not play professional football.

Instead, he became a coach. The trail has led to 14 years in the high school ranks, then nine years as an assistant before he came head coach at SDSU on Nov. 13, 1981 (if you're superstitious, yes, it was a Friday).

Haensel coached at Beresford High School for seven years (1959-66) with a

47-12-1 record. He went to Mitchell and his teams had a six-year record of 31-20-1 including a mythical state championship in 1971. And one year at Sioux City North produced a 5-4 record in 1972. He joined the SDSU staff in 1973 as an assistant coach, handling the offensive line for all but one season since.

Haensel has also been a key figure in SDSU's track program, developing an impressive number of weightmen. For all but two of the past nine seasons, SDSU weightmen have finished either first or second in the shot put at the NCC meet, and last year Ross Brockshus, who was also a linebacker on the SDSU football team, was national runnerup in the discus.

In 1972, Haensel was the first recipient of the Ralph Ginn Distinguished Coaching Award, an honor created in memory of Haensel's college coach.

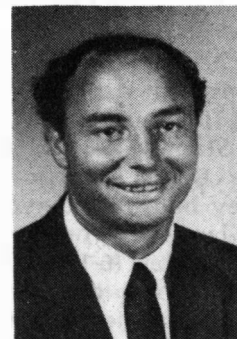
All of Haensel's talents haven't been confined to the football field. In 1976, he won the title of Pork Cookout King of South Dakota at the state Pork Producers Association convention in Sioux Falls. That qualified him for the national cookoff.

Haensel earned his Bachelor's Degree at SDSU, then added a Master's Degree in biology from Montana State in 1964. He has done post-master's work at the University of Idaho and the University of South Dakota.

Haensel and his wife, Kris, have three children including son Tom, a senior on the Brookings High football team this fall.

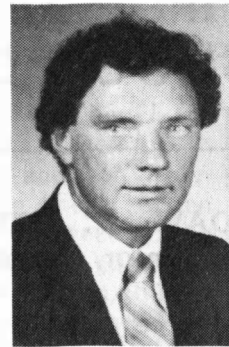
DON CHARLSON DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR, DEFENSIVE LINE

Don was a standout nose guard for SDSU (1975-77), earning all-NCC recognition as a senior. A native of Sioux City and a graduate of Sioux City Heelan (1973), he attended the Air Force Academy prep school for one year before transferring back to SDSU. He earned his Bachelor's Degree at SDSU in 1978, then added a Master's degree in 1979. He served as defensive coordinator at Yankton College for two years, then he became head coach at Westmar College in LaMars, Ia., guiding the Eagles to a 5-4 record, winning five of the last six games. He then joined the SDSU staff in April of 1982. Don and his wife, Teresa, have two children.



GARY HOFFMAN OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR, BACKFIELD

Gary joined the Jackrabbit staff in January of 1980. He was defensive line coach for one year, offensive line coach for two years and is now in his third year as offensive-coordinator in charge of the backfield. A 1962 graduate of Danube, Minn., High School, Hoffman earned his Bachelor's degree from Westmar College in 1966. He added a Master's Degree at USD in 1971. Hoffman has had coaching stops at West Lyon Community School in Inwood, Ia.; Sleepy Eye and Farmington high schools in Minnesota, plus Sioux Falls College, Sioux Falls Washington High and Augustana College, all in Sioux Falls. He was head coach at Sioux Falls College for three years and counted among his players Rick Danmeier, former place kicker for the Minnesota Vikings. He was working for Gopher Athletic Supply before joining the SDSU staff. Hoffman is also adviser for the powerlifting club at SDSU. Hoffman and his wife, Kathryn, have two children, including son Wade, who is a sophomore on the Jackrabbit football team this fall.



LARRY IRELAND RECRUITING COORDINATOR, DEFENSIVE SECONDARY

Larry joined the SDSU staff in the summer of 1981 and was named coordinator of recruiting when Haensel became head coach. A graduate of Scotland High School where he was an all-state basketball player on a team which finished runnerup in the 1964 state tournament, losing to Howard in the finals. He attended Yankton College and was all-Tri State Conference three straight years at defensive back. He earned his Master's Degree at USD in 1969, then coached and taught at Pierre and Gregory before becoming head football coach at Hot Springs in 1973. His teams there won Black Hills Conference championships in 1974 and 1976, and he was named South Dakota High School Coach of the Year for 1974 by the state's sportswriters. From there, Ireland went to Mitchell for one year before becoming an assistant coach at Augustana in 1978. His overall record as head coach shows 4 victories and 19 defeats with one tie. Ireland teaches a popular fishing class at SDSU and last summer, landed a world record (pending) 86 pound paddlefish on an eight-pound test line while fishing in the Missouri River. Ireland, and his wife, Sandy, have four children.



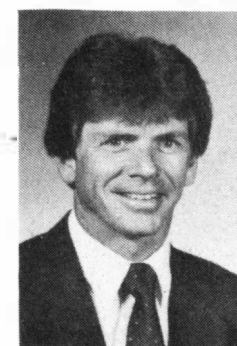
MARK EKELAND LINEBACKERS

Mark joined SDSU during the summer of 1983 and doubles as linebacker coach in football and head baseball coach. A graduate of Rapid City Central High School, Ekeland played on the 1969 state Class A championship basketball team with John Dutton. He played football and baseball at Augustana College, earning honorable mention all-NCC in baseball as a senior. In his first year as head baseball coach at SDSU, the Jacks finished second in the NCC southern division, then won the conference playoffs, hosted and won the NCAA Division II Midwest Regional, and qualified for the Division II World Series. His first two years have seen the Jacks go 27-13 and 27-15, the only 20-victory seasons in SDSU history. He was MCC and regional baseball coach of the year for 1984. Ekeland and his wife, Becky, have one child.



BRAD ERICKSON RECEIVERS

Brad is in his tenth year on the Jackrabbit staff, doubling as assistant football and head swimming coach. He has developed a string of standout receivers including two-time all-NCC tight end Monte Mosiman, two-time all-NCC wide receiver Lionel Macklin, all-NCC wide receiver Mike Ethier and all-NCC tight end Dennis Thomas. In swimming, his 1979 team won the NCC championship for men and his 1981 team won the same championship for women. Erickson is a member of the NCAA Women's Swimming Committee. Erickson is a 1974 graduate of SDSU, where he won three NCC swimming titles, helping SDSU rise from an also-ran to an NCC title contender. He was the first SDSU swimmer to qualify for a national championship meet. Coughlin-Alumni Stadium Now in 24th Season

Coughlin-Alumni Stadium, the home of the Jackrabbits, is in its 24th season.

The stadium opened September 22, 1962, when the Jacks lost a 9-7 decision to Arkansas State College.

Through the first 22 years of operation, there have been 113 SDSU games at Coughlin-Alumni Stadium. SDSU has a record of 60-53 at home during that time and there has never been a tie game at CAS.

The stadium project was started after Charles Coughlin, 1909 SDSU graduate, donated \$50,000 towards the building of a new stadium to replace State Field. The remaining \$250,000 of the original \$300,000 cost was raised from alumni,

students and friends of SDSU.

In the winter of 1963-64, a 46 x 106 foot lockerroom was constructed immediately south of the stadium. That was a \$54,885 project.

In the fall of 1978, a new scoreboard, complete with message center, was installed. The scoreboard was manufactured by Daktronics, Inc., a Brookings-based firm.

The stadium is topped off by an excellent press facility, which was built for \$23,000 in 1962. The press box is 100 feet long, 10 feet wide and has six three-man booths, four two-man booths plus a 40-foot working press area.

The basic concrete stadium was upgraded in 1982 with the installa-

tion of new yellow and blue seat covers in the center reserved sections. The permanent stadium seats 6,044. Additional bleachers behind both end zones and on the east side of the field increase capacity to 16,000.

During the summer of 1984, an underground sprinkling system was added and by 1985, a project to upgrade the east grandstands will be completed.

The largest crowd ever to see a football game of any kind in South Dakota came through the turnstiles on Hobo Day, October 18, 1975, when 15,866 saw SDSU defeat the University of South Dakota 24-22.

SDSU FOUNDED 105 YEARS AGO

South Dakota State University will enter its 105th year of service this fall.

One of 68 land-grant institutions in the United States, SDSU was founded by the Territorial Legislature February 21, 1881. The first building was erected in 1883 and classes began September 24, 1884.

SDSU has the largest enrollment of any college or university in South Dakota, reaching an all-time high of 7,289 in the fall of 1982.

Designated for land-grant status by the Morrill Act of 1862, the Enabling act, admitting the State of South Dakota, approved February 22, 1889, provided 120,000 acres of land be granted for the use and support of the agriculture college. By the Enabling Act of 1889, Congress granted South Dakota 40,000 additional acres in lieu of a grant that had been made to new states in 1841.

In 1923, the institution's instructional program was organized under five divisions: Agriculture, Engineering, General Science, Home Economics, and Pharmacy. In 1956, the sixth undergraduate division, Nursing, was created and in 1957, all graduate work was organized into a Graduate Division. The university organization was formally recognized when the legislature changed the name from South Dakota State College to South Dakota State University on July 1, 1964. At that time, the following colleges were created: Agriculture and Biological Sciences, Arts and Science, Engineering, Home Economics, Nursing and Pharmacy, as well as the Graduate School.

In 1974, the College of General Registration was created to provide assistance to students who are undecided as to a major, are pre-professional or who want one or two years of general personal studies.

In 1975, the Division of Education was created to provide greater recognition of the part the University plays in preparation of teachers, counselors and administrators for primary and secondary school systems and higher education.

SDSU also carries out a vigorous program of research through the Agricultural Experiment Station, organized in 1887 under the Hatch Act of Congress, and also has an ambitious program in continuing education through the Cooperative Extension Service, established to provide useful, current agricultural and homemaking information to the people of the state.

SDSU offers over 125 majors and a wide variety of Master's programs.

Brookings, the home of SDSU, celebrated its 100th birthday during the summer of 1979. Brookings is a growing community of 15,000 people located in east central South Dakota, in the center of some of the best outdoor recreation country around. Hunting, fishing, boating—all types of outdoor sports—are a part of the way of life in the Brookings area.

Athletically, SDSU is a charter member of the North Central Conference and has won more conference championships than any other current member with 85.

SDSU's success has not been confined to one or two sports. The Jacks have won 17 of 26 NCC cross country championships decided to date; have won 19 outdoor track championships (no one else has won more than 9); have won or shared 14 NCC football

championships; have won or shared 15 NCC basketball titles (the Jacks have been in the NCAA basketball playoffs 13 times) and, in fact, are the only current member of the NCC to win at least one championship in each of the conference-sanctioned men's sports.

The SDSU wrestling teams have competed in every College Division—Division II national tournament ever held and have hosted the national tournament twice, in 1973 and again in 1979. The Jacks have finished in the top ten in the NCAA wrestling tournament 16 times since the tournament began in 1963. SDSU wrestlers have earned All-America honors 55 times.

SDSU has also been a dominate force nationally in cross country, first for the men and now for both men and women. Last fall, for example, SDSU was second in the NCAA Division II championships for women and fourth for men. Jackrabbit men's teams won national championships in 1956 (NAIA), 1959 (NCAA) and 1973 (NCAA). Seven other

times, SDSU has been runnerup in the national meet.

In 1984, SDSU became just the second NCC member to qualify for the NCAA Division II World Series in baseball. Last spring, SDSU was runnerup in the NCAA Division II basketball tourney.

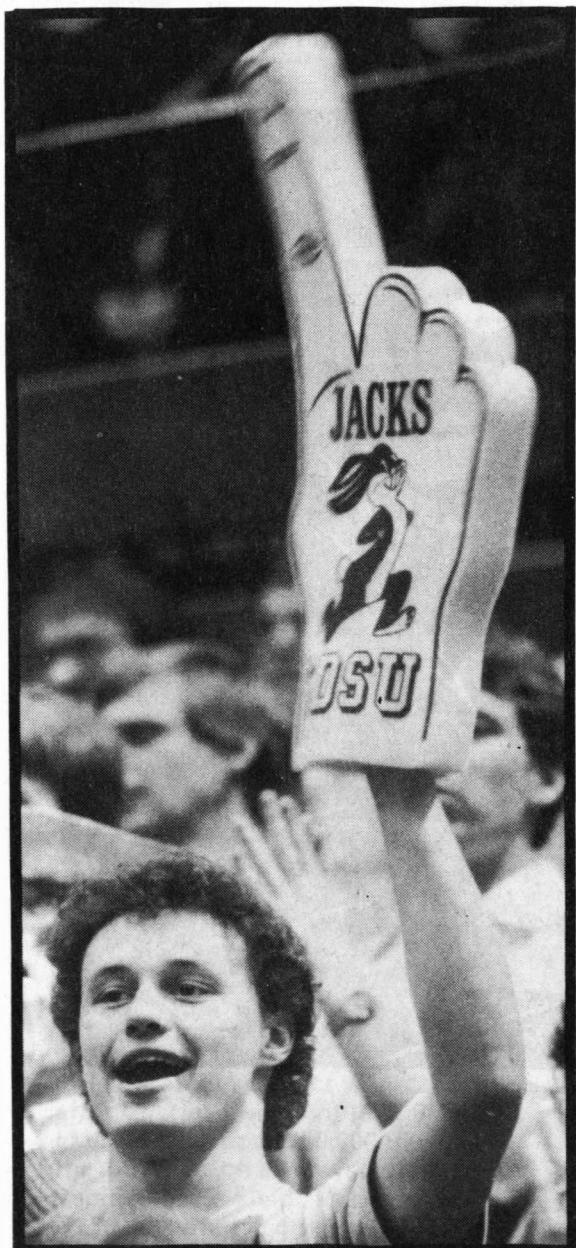
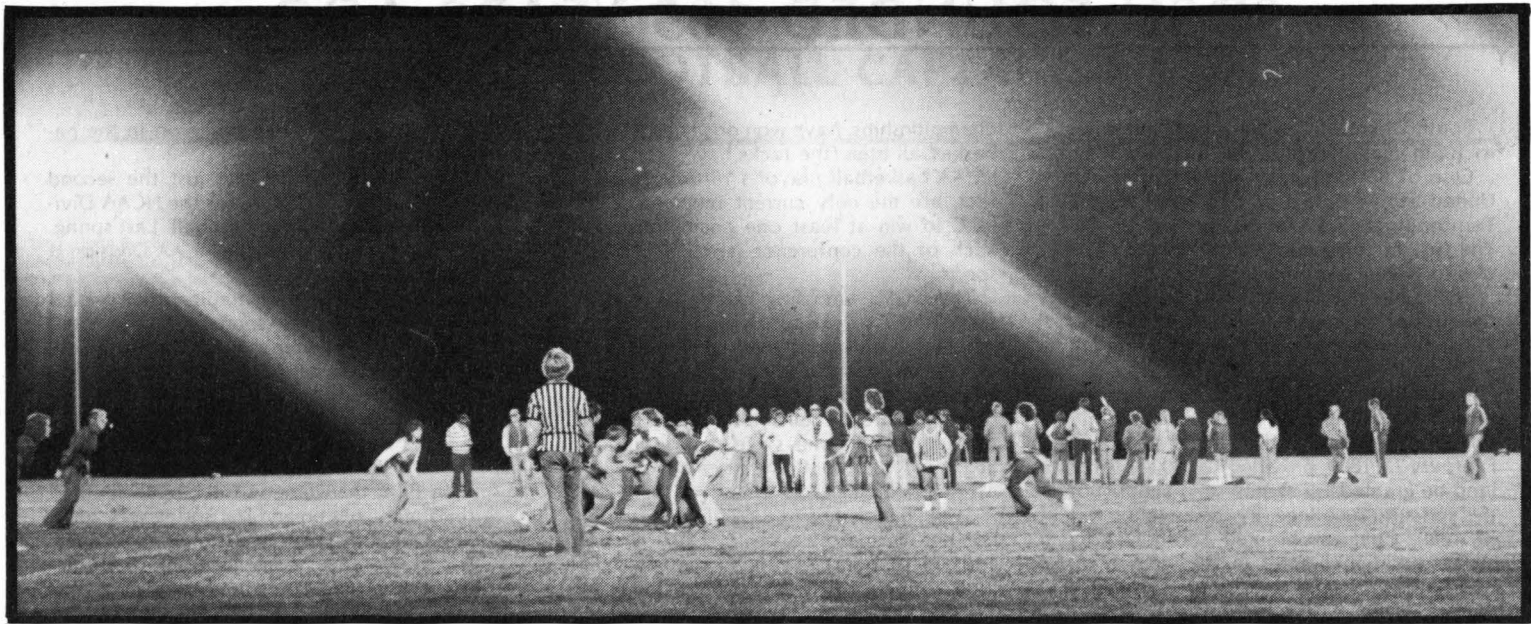
And that great sports tradition has carried over into women's sports. SDSU started competition for women in 1967, before Title IX, and success has been a way of life there, too.

The Jacks won back to back national titles in women's cross country (AIAW Division II 1980 and NCAA Division II 1981).

In 1982, the women's track team finished third in the nation and last spring was tenth. The Jacks have won five straight North Central Conference women's track titles: indoors 1982 and 1983; outdoors 1981, 1982 and 1983.

SDSU has won NCC titles in gymnastics, swimming, indoor track, outdoor track and golf, and in 1983, won the first ever NCC women's all-sports title.

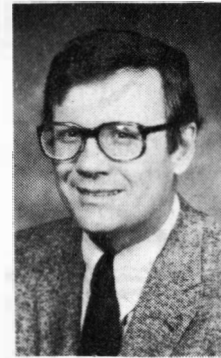




BEHIND THE SCENES

DR. ROBERT T. WAGNER PRESIDENT

Dr. Robert T. Wagner became president of South Dakota State University in May, succeeding H. Ray Hoops. Wagner had been vice president of Dakota State College in Madison. The 52-year-old Wagner is a native of Sioux Falls, a graduate of Washington High School and Augustana College (1954). He is an ordained Episcopalian priest and was rector of the Holy Apostles Episcopal Church in Sioux Falls and later the Trinity Episcopal Church in Watertown before joining the SDSU staff in 1970. He spent 14 years at SDSU, and from 1981-84 was assistant to the vice president for academic affairs. After attending Augustana College, he earned a degree in theology and education from Seabury Western Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill. He added a doctorate in sociology from SDSU in 1972. Wagner has done extensive research on the elderly in South Dakota and on population projections for the state. Wagner's wife, Mary, is a Republican legislator from Brookings County. The couple has two grown children.



HARRY FORSYTH ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Forsyth became acting athletic director in June, 1980, following the death of Stan Marshall, then was named to that position on a permanent basis later that summer. He has been on the SDSU staff since 1956. A native of Redfield, Forsyth received his Bachelor's Degree at SDSU in 1951, then returned for his Master's in 1956 and has been here since. He added a doctorate in physical education from Springfield College in 1970. Forsyth was assistant baseball coach for the Jacks for 13 years. He was athletic business manager until that position was changed to assistant athletic director in 1970. Forsyth lettered in basketball and baseball at SDSU after having a pro tryout with the Yankees. He played for Pierre in the old Basin League in 1949. Forsyth was a pilot in Korea during the Korean conflict and was active in the national guard until his retirement in August. His son, Maury, is currently a military pilot.



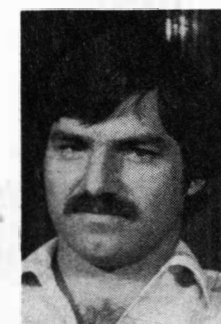
MYLO HELLICKSON FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE

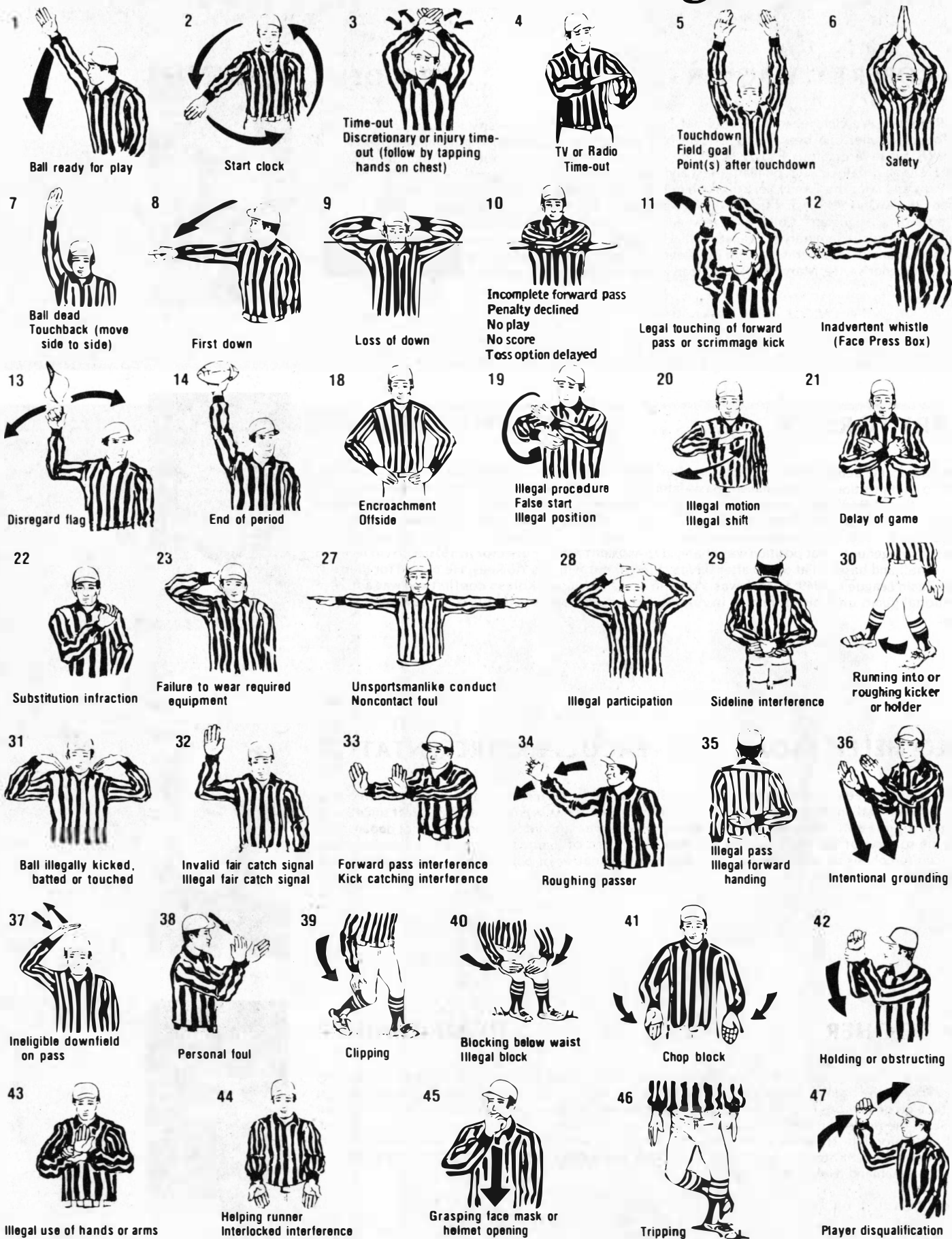


JIM BOOHER HEAD TRAINER

NORTH CENTRAL CONFERENCE SCHOLAR ATHLETE-STAN MARSHALL AWARD

In 1975, the North Central Conference created the Scholar-Athlete Award program to honor the outstanding student-athlete at each NCC member institution.

Criteria for the award requires that a student-athlete be an outstanding performer both **athletically** and **academically**, and that the award go to a senior who is within **12** hours of graduating.

In 1982, the award was expanded to include the Stan Marshall Award, presented in memory of the former SDSU athletic director. All scholar athlete award nominees are eligible, with the Stan Marshall Award going to the individual selected as the outstanding student-athlete from the entire conference.

In 1983, the scholar athlete and Stan Marshall awards were expanded to include both a male and female winner.

Winners of the NCC Scholar Athlete Award at South Dakota State have been:

1975—LYNN BODEN, 1st team Kodak All-American Football player and the only NCC player ever picked on the first round of the National Football League draft. He carried a 2.50 grade point average majoring in physical education.

1976—BILL MAST, football quarterback who was a two-time academic all-conference pick and was twice voted honorable mention on the all-NCC team as a player. Was co-captain in 1975. Had a 3.000 GPA in animal science.

1977—BOB SUNDVOLD, 3.139 GPA in commercial economics, second in NCC scoring race as senior with 16.4 average and led league in free throw shooting at 94.4 percent.

1978—BILL MATTHEWS, 3.654 GPA in dairy science, was a first team All-American both as a player (The Associated Press) and academically. Drafted by the New England Patriots.

1979—BRAD ALFRED, 3.08 GPA in pharmacy, earned seven letters in football and track at SDSU, was All-American in track finishing third in Division II discus in '79; won NCC shot put and discus title

that year; academic all-NCC in football as center.

1980—CHUCK LOEWEN, 3.537 GPA in commercial economics; earned NCAA post-graduate scholarship; first-team Kodak All-American at offensive tackle; only offensive lineman to win NCC Player of Week Award.

1981—JOEL BRANDT, 3.61 GPA in animal science; ran on seven NCC championship teams at SDSU including four in cross country; All American in cross country and track; won six individual NCC titles in track and cross country.

1982—BRIAN COOMES, 3.929 GPA in electrical engineering, four-year letterman in swimming, cap-

tain of 1982 team.

1983—TOM FLANIGAN, 4.000 GPA in mechanical engineering; two-year letterman in basketball after transferring from junior college; top reserve at guard.

1984—DAVE FREMARK, 3.346 ag economics, 4-year letterman, three-year starter at linebacker; Academic All-NCC 1982 & 1983; lead team in tackles in 1982 & 1983. From St. Lawrence, SD.

1985—TODD YACKLEY, 3.21 GPA in ag business, four-year letterman, two-year starter, all-NCC outside linebacker in 1984, led team in tackles, with 122, and in sacks, with seven, as senior.

THE ORIGINAL BEEF BOWL SCORES TO DATE

SDSU HOSTS THE ORIGINAL BEEF BOWL

SDSU will host the 19th annual Beef Bowl September 28 when the Jackrabbits entertain the University of North Dakota Fighting Sioux.

SDSU is the site of the original Beef Bowl, a concept which has been copied by teams all around the country.

The Beef Bowl was started as SDSU's way of recognizing those individuals and firms who donate to SDSU's "Steer for State" program and also as a means of placing special emphasis on the beef industry in South Dakota.

Beef Bowl activities have included a banquet during the week and the famous Beef Bowl barbecue before the game. As part of the pre-game ceremonies, a live steer is auctioned off at the football stadium.

The official Beef Bowl trophy was donated by Bill Zingelberg of Rapid City, a former SDSU student. He carved the trophy from a 40-pound cottonwood log and it depicts a bull in a football helmet.

The past eight years, the media covering the game has voted on the game's Outstanding Player. Winners have been:

1977—Gary Maffett, quarterback, SDSU, who rushed 23 times for 184 yards and completed 4 of 14 passes for another 58 yards, giving him 242 yards total offense as he ran for three touchdowns and passed for a fourth in a 34-2 Jackrabbit victory over Nebraska-Omaha.

1978—Mark Dunbar, defensive end, SDSU, who led the Jackrabbit defense with three quarterback sacks among his nine tackles, a blocked punt which set up one touchdown, and a forced fumble which set up another score in a 41-17 SDSU victory over Morningside.

1979—Bill O'Connor, runningback, from Augustana, became the only non-SDSU player to win the award when he rushed 37 times for 180 yards, including two touchdowns, and in the process became Augustana's all-time career rushing leader. But SDSU, with a late comeback, won the game 28-26.

1980—Marty Higgins, quarterback, SDSU, rushed for 105 yards to spark a Jackrabbit offense which gained 267 yards on the ground in a 21-13 victory over the University of South Dakota.

1981—Mike Law, quarterback, SDSU, rushed for 153 yards on 26 carries and com-
