SOUTH DAKOTA BOARD OF REGENTS CITATION FOR THE HONORARY DEGREE DOCTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE

Aelred J. Kurtenbach, Ph.D.

Dr. Aelred Kurtenbach served as chair of the state advisory committee (REACH Committee), since its incorporation in 1986 and until 2006, for the South Dakota Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR) program, funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF). Not only is this a significant milestone for South Dakota, his leadership in South Dakota also made him the longest serving chair of an EPSCoR State Committee in the nation. During his tenure, he has provided continuity to the state's EPSCoR program and guided it from one that struggled to field a competitive infrastructure development strategy to a position where it is now a funded participant in the NSF, NIH, DoD, NASA, USDA, and DOE EPSCoR or EPSCoR-like programs. He has pursued a strategy of engaging state government and the private sector in the REACH Committee as cooperating partners with the Board of Regents system. This strategy has returned dividends over the last three years in the form of the first specific investments in higher education research in the state's history. And during this time, total grants and contracts awarded to South Dakota higher education have increased more than tenfold.

Dr. Kurtenbach has been actively involved in EPSCoR on the national level, regularly attending national meetings and chairing numerous panels on the role of the state EPSCoR advisory committee in building research infrastructure. As an acknowledgement of his contributions to and perspective on EPSCoR, he was one of only 27 people invited to a roundtable discussion entitled "Vision 2020" organized by NSF in June 2006. The purpose of this meeting was to set the direction for the NSF EPSCoR program in a time of potential NSF budget increases and growing national scrutiny of the role of a maturing EPSCoR program.

RECOGNITION OF OUTSTANDING FACULTY AND STAFF

F. O. BUTLER AWARDS

The Trustees of the F.O. Butler Foundation have established a program to recognize those faculty and staff members whose performance is truly exceptional. This year the Trustees are recognizing four individuals:

EXCELLENCE IN SERVICE ALVARO D. GARCIA

Extension Dairy Specialist/Associate Professor of Dairy Science College of Agriculture and Biological Sciences D.V.M. University of Uruguay M.S. University of Minnesota Ph.D. University of Minnesota Joined the South Dakota State University faculty in 2001

Professor Alvaro D. Garcia has established himself as a well respected Dairy Extension Specialist for small and large dairy producers in South Dakota. His diversified experience in dairying, that includes South America, Europe and North America, has added a unique dimension to his activities and has enhanced his Extension functions at South Dakota State University.

While at South Dakota State University, Professor Garcia has been a lecturer at over 60 events within and outside the state as well as overseas. Professor Garcia designs his Extension programs to empower producers rather than just solve immediate problems. Because many dairies in South Dakota and beyond now employ Spanish-speaking employees, Dr. Garcia's dairy expertise, coupled with Spanish, has undoubtedly played a major role in helping increase the profitability of local producers. His workshops in Spanish have taken the South Dakota State University Dairy Extension program and the South Dakota State University Cooperative Extension Service to a new and unique level of outreach which is also recognized by many in other states

Professor Garcia has added value to his functions by being an active participant in local and national organizations such as the Central Plains Dairy Expo and the National Professional Dairy Heifer Growers Association. The latter has particularly brought national recognition to Professor Garcia's program and the dairy industry of the state in general. Through his collaborations with the Department of Agriculture, the importance of dairying in South Dakota and at South Dakota State University have been well noted.

Professor Garcia has also been active in four volunteer assignments in Honduras and El Salvador sponsored by Winrock International, the University of Florida, and the United States Agency for International Development. These assignments came with the purpose of improving hygienic milk production in Central American Countries. The impact was measured by USAID and showed a 15% increase in milk production in the area where this intervention took place in Honduras.

Alvaro Garcia is a prolific writer and has authored or coauthored 25 Extension Extras and numerous other publications and radio stories. Professor Garcia has been active in translating the publications of the Dairy Science Department into Spanish. These publications have also been reprinted in Spain and Portugal.

In recognition of his outstanding performance Professor Garcia received the 2004 College of Agriculture and Biological Sciences Dean and Directors' Team award for efforts displayed to improve dairy profitability. In April 2006 Professor Garcia was selected for the SDSU Gamma Sigma Delta Extension award.

EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH BONNY L. SPECKER

In addition to her position as Director and Chair of the Ethel Austin Martin Endowed Program, Bonny Specker holds the academic rank of Professor in the Departments of Nutrition, Food Science and Hospitality; Biological Sciences; and Animal and Range Sciences at SDSU as well as Adjunct Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of South Dakota.

Professor Specker is a respected national and international leader in the field of nutrition. Her achievements distinguish her as one of the most highly regarded professors at South Dakota State University.

During her 25-year career, Professor Specker has produced over 120 refereed publications and book chapters. She has delivered 41 invited national and international lectures and has either presented, or been co-author, on over 100 local and regional research presentations. She has generated over \$115 million in competitive grant funding as either principal investigator or co-principal investigator. This outstanding level of research productivity sets Bonny Specker apart from her peers. In 2005, South Dakota State University was awarded a contract from the National Institutes of Health to serve as a Vanguard Center for the National Children's Study (NCS). Professor Specker's role as principal investigator in this effort has created numerous interdisciplinary research opportunities that will continue to grow over the next two decades.

Professor Specker is a dedicated teacher and research mentor with high standards. She is noted as an exceptionally insightful, motivating and demanding mentor. Her dedication to students is evident in her advising of post-doctoral fellows, Ph.D. students, and M.S. students. In addition, numerous undergraduate students have worked with Professor Specker through the Martin Program. Many of these students have gone on to graduate school or medical school.

Professor Bonny Specker's service, both external and internal to the University, is noteworthy. She has participated in several federal advisory panels and numerous scientific review boards. She has held her present position as Assistant Professor in the Department of Biology and Microbiology since 2004. Professor Xu believes that her primary role as a teacher is to ignite the learning engine of each student. Her first consideration is the student, and she makes every effort to ensure success for her students' learning processes. Professor Xu provides clear learning objectives for each topic, makes her classroom amazingly interactive, and provides valuable feedback for the introductory biology classes as well as teaching senior level and graduate plant ecology courses. Dr. Aelred J. Kurtenbach is cofounder of Daktronics, Inc. and currently serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors.

Dr. Kurtenbach holds B.S., M.S. and Ph.D. degrees, all in electrical engineering, from South Dakota School of Mines and Technology, the University of Nebraska, and Purdue University, respectively. He also taught electrical engineering at South Dakota State University and Purdue University. While on the staff at South Dakota State University, he cofounded Daktronics, Inc. in 1968.

Daktronics designs, manufactures, markets, and services large computer programmable displays, primarily scoreboards and large screen video systems, on a global basis.

Dr. Kurtenbach served on the Brookings School Board for twelve years and on the South Dakota Board of Regents from 1984-1986. He served as Chairman of the South Dakota Manufacturers & Processors Association from 1984-1986 and as Director for the South Dakota Chamber of Commerce & Industry. He has also served as Chairman of the Education Committee for the South Dakota Chamber of Commerce & Industry, Chairman of the South Dakota State Junior Achievement Program, and as Chairman of the South Dakota EPSCoR Committee, a program sponsored by the National Science Foundation.

Over the years, Dr. Kurtenbach and Daktronics have been recognized with numerous awards for entrepreneurism and quality. Dr. Kurtenbach was chosen as the Entrepreneur of the Year in 2000 for manufacturing in a national competition sponsored by Ernst & Young. Daktronics, Inc. was named the 1994 Entrepreneurial Success of the Year by the Small Business Administration for South Dakota and the Denver Region. Daktronics was also chosen the South Dakota Business of the Year in 2000, 1993, 1989 and 1987 by the South Dakota Chamber of Commerce & Industry.

THE ACADEMIC PROCESSIONAL

The academic processional which precedes the graduation ceremonies on college and university campuses is one of the old and colorful customs which link twenty-first century education with its early origins.

To signalize the achievements of their students, American institutions of higher learning conduct a formal ceremony to award the appropriate degrees earned at the conclusion of prescribed study. The action of taking the degree – associate, bachelor's, master's or doctor's – as well as the designation of the day itself – is Commencement.

Various explanations of the term "commencement" are possible. The most likely is that centuries ago the bachelor, originally an apprentice, began his apprenticeship upon that day; and with the degree of M.A. and Ph.D., the masters and doctors commenced their work upon the day their degrees were conferred. So today, the student, having finished his/her preliminary education, sets out on a career.

The academic regalia worn at Commencement is of medieval origin. The scholars of Bologna, Paris, Oxford, Cambridge, Louvain, and Heidelberg dressed in a manner to distinguish themselves from the merchants and other townsmen. Since the eleventh century, when the rise of the universities began, "learned clerks" robed themselves in gowns, caps, and hoods, thus marking a difference between "town and gown."

By this apparel they were recognized as belonging to the teaching guild which was the Guild of the Master of Arts. In this organization the bachelor was the apprentice of the master. This relationship was the forerunner of today's academic structure, which often includes graduate and/or teaching assistants (usually studying for advanced degrees).

Generally in Europe, a professor wears the type of garment customary in the university where he/she is lecturing. In the United States our tradition differs; our professors continue to wear the gown and hood of the university where they received their highest degree.

The gown, in origin, may have been simply a type of overcoat to protect the teacher from the cold in the unheated buildings; the cut or style seems to be derived from ecclesiastical attire. It has usually been black. The gowns of bachelors and masters are usually without trimmings of any sort whereas those of doctors are faced down the front with velvet and adorned with three velvet bars on the sleeves.

The cap or "mortarboard" may have come from the squarish cap worn by the masons of the Middle Ages, or perhaps was suggested by the shape of the books which occupied so much of the time of scholars. Attached to a button on the "mortarboard" is a tassel; bachelor's and master's are black or the color appropriate to the subject; those of doctors black or golden. The tassel is worn on the left side by those who are receiving or have received a degree.

The hood, a triangular fold of cloth worn over the back of the gown, is faced with colors which denote the field of study represented by the wearer's degree; the colors of the lining are those of the college or university from which the degree was granted. The length of the hood is correspondingly longer with each degree.

The wide velvet borders extending down the front of the doctoral gown, the velvet bar on the sleeves, and the borders of most hoods are colored according to the scholarly field of the wearer. The most usual of these are:

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The Ceremonial Mace is traditionally carried by a university marshal at all formal academic occasions. The staff, which stands thirty-six inches high from top to bottom, is made of walnut with a mahogany finish. It is trimmed in 14k plated gold. At the top of the Mace is the great seal of South Dakota State University. The engraved inscription reads "South Dakota State University founded 1881." The Mace was presented to the University as a gift from the SDSU Alumni Association and was used for the first time at President Peggy Gordon Miller's inauguration, September 19, 1998.

The Ceremonial Mace has an ancient history as a symbol of authority. In medieval times it was a studded, clublike weapon, made of iron and capable of breaking armor. It became associated with the protection of the king in France and England and was carried by the king's sergeant-at-arms. In the thirteenth century it was used for civil purposes and figured in the processions of city mayors and other dignitaries. Eventually the Mace became a symbol also for academic institutions, an emblem of order and authority in the pageantry of ceremonial occasions.



THE UNIVERSITY PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The University Presidential Medallion, a traditional symbol of authority of the Office of the President, is a 14k gold replica of the University Seal, is three inches in diameter, and is cast as a single piece.

The reverse side of the Medallion is engraved with the names the University has formally held since its inception: Dakota Agricultural College, 1884-1889, South Dakota Agricultural College, 1890-1907, South Dakota State College of Agricultural and Mechanic Arts, 1907-June 30, 1964, and South Dakota State University, July 1, 1964-Present.

The University Presidential Medallion was designed by Sioux Falls artist Jurek Jakowicz and was presented as a gift to the University by the SDSU Foundation. The Medallion is part of the University's heritage and will pass to future presidents. It is traditionally worn by the University president at important ceremonial occasions.
