

HONORED FARMER

The staff of the Little International of South Dakota State University has recognized Ervin R. Dobberstein, Alcester, as the 1979 Honored Farmer.

Dobberstein, 64, has been teaching elementary instruction and vocational agriculture to South Dakota youth from 1934 until his retirement in July, 1977.

New Effington is where Dobberstein began teaching. He taught elementary coursework there until he began attending SDSU in 1936. A bachelor's degree in technical agriculture was conferred on him in 1939, and then he began a long career at Alcester. In 1942, Dobberstein took four years off to serve in World War II but returned in 1946 and remained in the Alcester system until 1969.

In 1961 he received his master's degree in school administration from the University of South Dakota. In 1970, after ending his career at Alcester, he joined the Baltic school system until his retirement in 1977.

Along with his teaching responsibilities, Dobberstein served as high school principal in Alcester from 1952 to 1969, and he was elementary school principal during his entire seven years at Baltic.

Dobberstein and his wife, Mildred, reside at Alcester. Mildred is the public librarian and they both are active in civic and church organizations.

The Dobbersteins have two children and three grandchildren. Daughter Betty (Mrs. Don) Cooke and her husband live and work in the Minneapolis area with their sons, Adam, 5 and Matthew, 9. Mrs. Cooke is an SDSU alumnus and presently an instructor in child development.

The Dobbersteins' son, Arthur, also attended SDSU. He is presently the Transportation Administrator of Lincoln Public Schools, Lincoln, Neb. Mr. Dobberstein and his wife Marjo, have one son, Christopher, 6. Both Mrs. Cooke and young Dobberstein received their master's degrees at the University of Nebraska.

This year's Honored Farmer has worked with youth all his life. Through the Boy Scouts, Future Farmers of America, church organizations, and with his teaching, he has aided South Dakota's youth for almost 50 years.


I would like to welcome you to the South Dakota State University campus and to the 56th Little International and Home Economics Exposition.

LITTLE I HISTORY

South Dakota State University's Little International has grown since its origin in 1921 to be the largest of its kind in the Nation. The student sponsored show was patterned after the Chicago International Livestock and Grain Exposition. The show has been presented every year since 1921 with only three exceptions. The threat of scarlet fever halted the 1926 show and it was cancelled because of World War II in 1944 and 1945.

The staff of the 1921 show included: Lorenz C. Lippert, general manager; Garry Schooler, beef superintendent; George Biggar, dairy superintendent; Leo Mossing, horse superintendent; Marion Bruce, sheep superintendent; Dick Gardner, publicity director, and Gilbert Gilbertson, decoration chairman. Over 100 students are included on the 1979 Little International Staff.

The first show was a livestock show which was held in the stock pavilion. Since then it has grown until it now includes almost every phase of agriculture on the campus. The first addition was an exhibit sponsored by agronomy. In 1924 the departmental booths were made a part of the show. The horticulture department followed by adding classes in vegetables and flowers. In 1948, the agricultural engineers set up the machinery demonstrations and exhibits.

Home economics became the largest division added to the show when they joined in 1949 with competition in clothing, foods, and arts and crafts. Since then it has grown to include a ladies' program with a style show being the main feature. Some of the most recent Little I attractions include the ladies' lead added in 1974 and the ladies' tractor driving contest which was first held in 1977. Probably the most popular feature to be included came in 1974 when the first barn dance was held following the final evening's performance.

Growth of the show is exemplified by a move in 1942 from the stock pavilion to the Barn (current intramural building) and again in 1978 to the newly completed Animal Science Arena.
