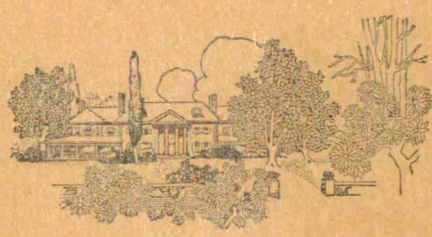

For those who cannot attend the regular college course, and who do not have a high school education, and still wish to take advantage of the training facilities in the different phases of agriculture and home economics, offered at the South Dakota State College, a course of intensive training of four years, each of five winter months, is offered. The township pays the tuition in this course, the same as is required by law for high school.
