A. REVIEW SUMMER COURSE SCHEDULE

1. Please read instructions and information carefully.
2. Review courses/sections.

B. ADVISOR/ADVISEE MEETING

— PIN DISTRIBUTION (By Appointment)

1. Undergraduate students **WILL RECEIVE YOUR NEW PIN FROM YOUR ADVISOR**. This new PIN is valid for Summer and Fall, beginning May 1.

Graduate students — your PIN has not changed. If you do not remember your PIN contact the Graduate School office.

2. List and prioritize your course requests on the Telephone Registration Worksheet. (page 16)
3. Check:
 - a. Course Numbers (5 numeric characters).
 - b. Note that all lectures and labs have different course numbers (5 numeric characters); they must **both** be requested.
 - c. Co-requisite courses must be listed.
 - d. Obtain a Special Approval Form for each course requiring written permission or restricted to specific majors (other than your major). The forms must be signed by the instructor of the course or the department head of the department offering the course and submitted to the Registrar's Office, ADM 208, to complete registration. These courses cannot be registered via telephone.
 - e. If registering for more than 20 credits as an undergraduate student or more than 12 credits as a graduate student, the Overload Registration Authorization Form is required from your College Dean. **You may not register for overload credits via the telephone. You must report to the Registrar's Office, ADM 208.**

2. Telephone Registration Instructions

Telephone Registration can be used to:

- register for classes
- add a class or classes
- drop a class or classes
- listen to your class schedule

Telephone Registration cannot be used to:

- audit a course and/or register for a course Pass/Fail — *report to the Registrar's Office in ADM 208, after Registration Day.*
- register for an overload (over 20 credits undergraduate or 12 credits graduate) — *report to the Registrar's Office, ADM 208.*
- register for a course with a time conflict — *report to the Registrar's Office, ADM 208.*
- register for a course requiring special instructor/department approval — *report to the Registrar's Office, ADM 208.*

What can be done in advance?

PREPARE A TELEPHONE REGISTRATION WORK-SHEET WITH YOUR ADVISOR, LISTING THE COURSES YOU WANT AND POSSIBLE ALTERNATIVES. Having this worksheet prepared in advance and having alternate classes available will save you time and make the process much easier! Undergraduate students see your academic advisor to receive your Permit to Register, PIN, and schedule approval.

EARLY REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Have the following information ready, being careful to keep your PIN and SSN confidential:

- Your SSN (social security number) or Colleague ID
- Your PIN (personal identification number)
- Your telephone registration worksheet including the course numbers (5 numeric characters)

Once you become familiar with Telephone Registration Instructions and the menu, you may press the appropriate key without waiting for the instruction to end.

Telephone Registration Main Menu

Listen to the 6 menu options in the registration process.

1. To ADD a course, press 1.
2. To DROP a course, press 2.
3. To REVIEW your schedule, press 3.
4. To DELETE your schedule, press 4.
5. To CANCEL changes, press 5.
6. To ACCEPT and FILE your schedule, press 6.

Dialing Instructions — Please be sure to call only from a touch-tone phone.

1. Test all buttons on your touch-tone phone. If all keys do not each emit a clear tone, you must use another phone. There may be problems if you are using a cellular phone.
2. Dial 688-5180 (or 1-605-688-5180 if you are calling long distance). Wait for an answer. If you get a busy signal, hang up and try again later.
3. Wait for a voice prompt. Enter your Colleague ID number **or** your Social Security Number.
4. Wait for a voice prompt. Enter your PIN (Personal Identification Number).
5. Select option from the menu. Enter your 5-digit numeric course number to add, drop, or change. The computer asks you to confirm your choice.
6. If correct, confirm as directed. This step is necessary to obtain the class. The computer will state "This course has been added..." or "This course has been deleted..."
7. Add additional classes, drop classes, or change options on classes already selected. Refer to No. 5 above.
8. When you have finished entering your selections, select option 3 from the menu to review your schedule.
9. When your schedule is complete, choose menu item 6 to accept and file the schedule and exit the system.

- May 1 (8:01 am to midnight) and
- May 2 (6:01 am to midnight)

Telephone Registration will close at midnight, Tuesday, May 2.

The Adjustment Period begins on Wednesday, May 3 at 8:00 a.m. in the Registrar's office, ADM 208.

Course Numbers

When you are asked for the **course number** of your class selections, you will enter the five-digit numeric course number found to the left of the section of the course from the Course Schedule Booklet (see example below).

Helpful Hints

- It is your responsibility to protect your PIN and Social Security Number or Colleague ID.
- Complete the Telephone Registration Worksheet in advance, along with alternate courses.
- Listen for important messages.
- For faster entry, you may interrupt familiar dialogue.

Students graduating from a Minnesota high school in 1999 will automatically be coded for reciprocity without needing to complete a formal application. Residency

Add-Drop

Adding or dropping a class can be accomplished June 13-14, 2000, Session 2, (1st 4-week session) and June 13-19, 2000, Session 2 and 3, (8-week session) at ADM 208 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Any additional fees due will be billed; any refunds will be mailed.

Cancelled Class

Financial Aid Information

Students must complete the 2000-2001 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and be enrolled in an SDSU degree program to be considered for federal student financial aid. Also, the SDSU Summer Financial Aid Application (available in ADM 106) must be completed before summer financial aid can be processed. Eligible students must be enrolled on at least a half-time status (six (6) undergraduate or five (5) graduate credits) before financial aid is reviewed. Financial aid disbursement is authorized when the student is in the June term and the student will be enrolled and attending classes on at least a half-time status. Students with financial aid awards must pay their total SDSU summer expenses. Students completing early registration for summer classes will have their financial aid eligibility determined earlier. 



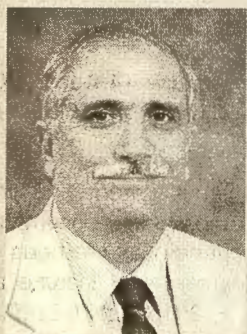

This is an indepth course for nursing or dietetic students who are required to understand the scientific basis of nutrition. The emphasis is the understanding of science of food, the nutrients and other substances therein, their action, interaction, and balance in relation to health and disease and the processes by which the organism ingests, digests, absorbs, transports, utilizes and excretes food substances. The pre-requisite is Chem 108 or Chem 120 or consent.
