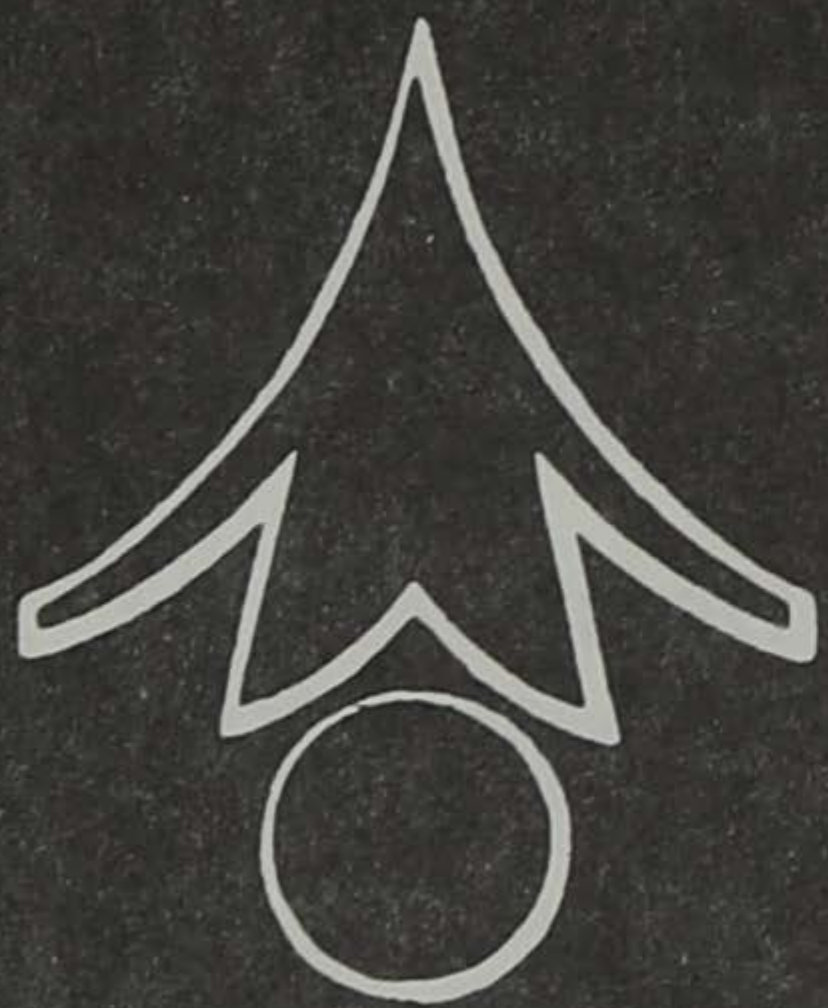

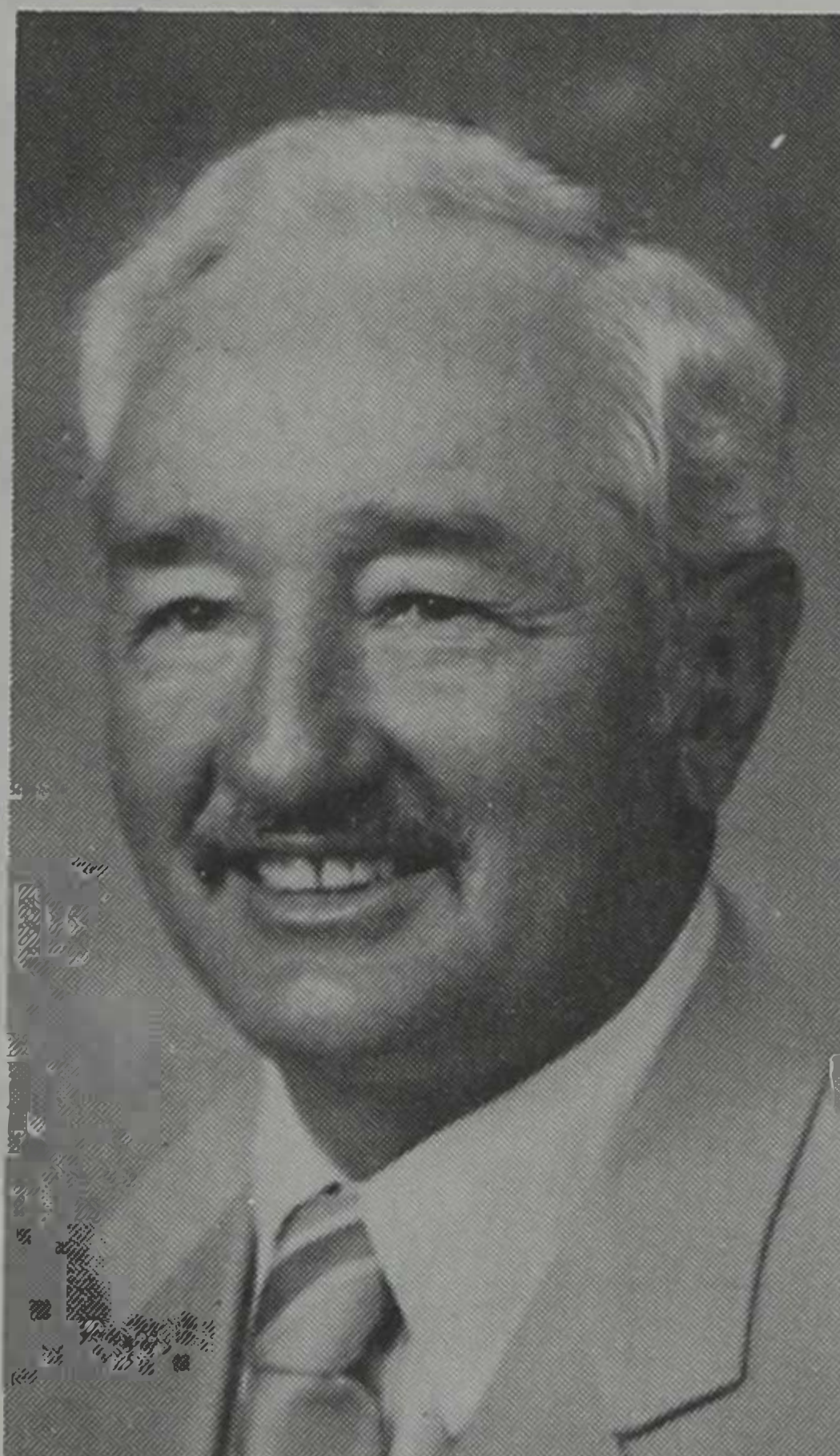
1989 Honored Agriculturalist

Gordon Brockmueller graduated from SDSU in 1956 with a B.S. degree in Ag Education. He belonged to Alpha Zeta, Kappa Delta Pi, Block and Bridle and was named to Who's Who Among Students in America Colleges and Universities. He participated in Little I and served on the staff.

While at SDSU he lettered in cross country, track and wrestling.

After graduation, Gordon and his wife, Shirley took an assignment in Vietnam with International Voluntary Services, Inc. After four years in Vietnam and three years in Washington, D.C., Gordon served with the Department of State in Algeria and Tunisia.

In 1970 the Brockmueller family—now numbering six—returned to take over the family farm near Freeman, S.D. While the children were growing up, Gordon and Shirley served as 4-H leaders and Gordon was chairman of the Hutchinson County 4-H Leaders Association.



In the 1970's, Gordon was a member of the Governor's Council on the Future of Agriculture and served on the SD Agriculture Marketing Commission. In 1975 he was named South Dakota Master Feeder Pig Producer.

The Brockmueller farm is a diversified crop and livestock unit specializing in the production of certified seed and registered Shorthorn Cattle. Gordon served on the board of directors of the State Crop Improvement Association and was recently elected to the board of the American Oat Association. He has long been an active promoter of Shorthorn beef cattle serving on state and national committees and boards.

Gordon is farming in a partnership arrangement with his two sons, Lee and Joe, both graduates of SDSU. A daughter Suzanne and husband, Todd Koerner, also both graduates of SDSU (1988), are involved in the Shorthorn operation. Daughter, Cindee, teaches at Freeman High School and her husband, Tom Evenson owns and operates Turkey Ridge Oil Co.

The Brockmueller relationship with SDSU goes back a long ways and has continued throughout the years. Gordon served on the Agriculture Advisory Committee to SDSU and on the Citizens Review Committee of the SD Extension program. In 1988 he was selected by SDSU to receive the Eminent Farmer Award.

The History of Little International

The underlying purpose of Little International is to give students practical experience in their particular field of study and to demonstrate to the general public the caliber of work being done by "State" students. Public approval and cooperation from administration were automatic when the Little International proved its worth as educational and entertaining.

Little International has been presented every year since 1921 with only three exceptions: 1926 when it was cancelled because of a scarlet fever epidemic, and in 1944-45 because of World War II. In 1943 Little "I" was closed to the "war effort." Awards were in the form of war bonds and stamps with proceeds being divided between direct contribution to the Red Cross and the purchase of war bonds.

In 1948, Little "I" bounced back with its 25th Anniversary. This show was dedicated to the first Little "I" manager, Lorenz Lippert, who by then had a son named Herbert. He followed in his father's footsteps and became manager of the 1950 Little "I".

Home Economics became a part of Little "I" in 1949. A style show, child development, home economics, education, and journalism exhibits and demonstrations in food nutrition and housing equipment are presented by the College of Home Economics.

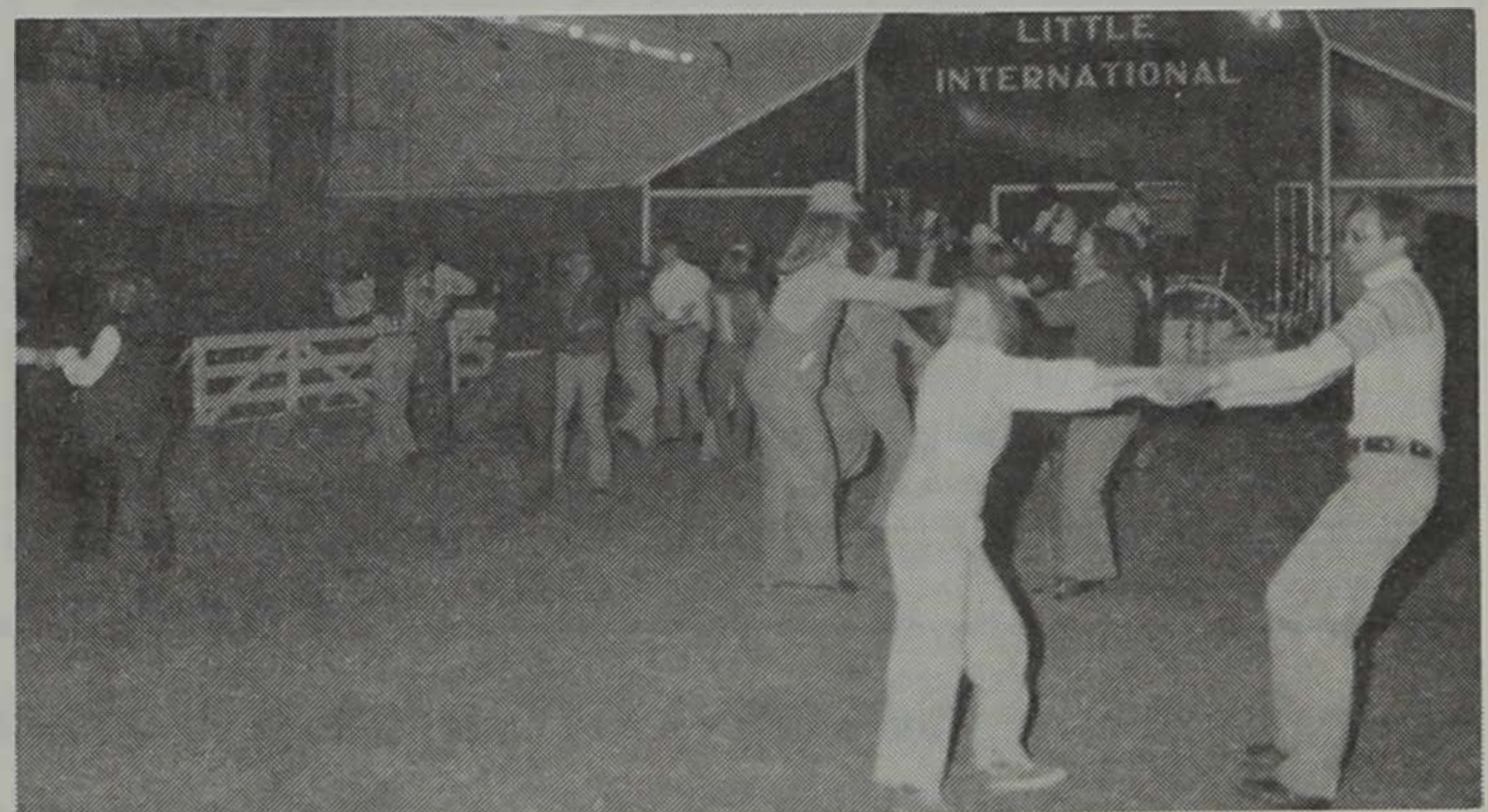
In the past 65 years there have been many changes in the formation of the present Little International Exposition.

The first Little "I," presented Jan. 26, 1921, was patterned after the Chicago International Livestock Exposition. At that time manager Lorenz Lippert, a senior from Crow Agency, Mont., worked

with a seven-member staff and arranged for 100 students to show 80 animals. At that time Little "I" was held in the Stock Pavilion which is now the Agricultural Museum on campus.

In 1952 Little "I" moved into what is now called the Intramural Building. After its debut in 1921 it matured into a two-day event and 387 exhibitors with the addition of the new Animal Science Arena in 1977. Little "I" is one of the biggest student run events in the country with 70 total students on staff. Since 1921 judging contests have been added for high school students to participate in. The contests consist of livestock, dairy, meats, crops, and dairy products. Also salesmanship contests have been added. Many other activities are done to meet the needs of the University as well as the students.

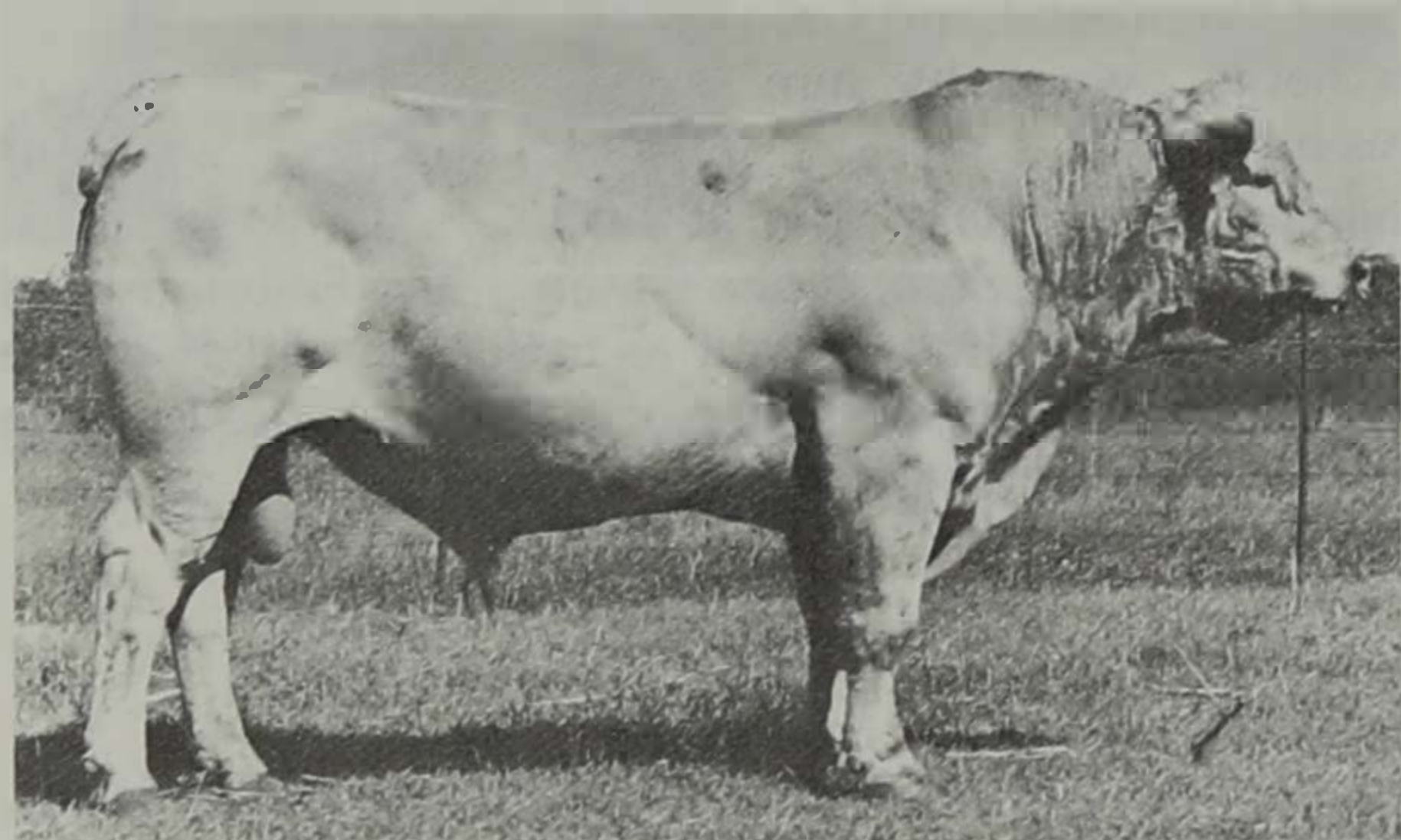

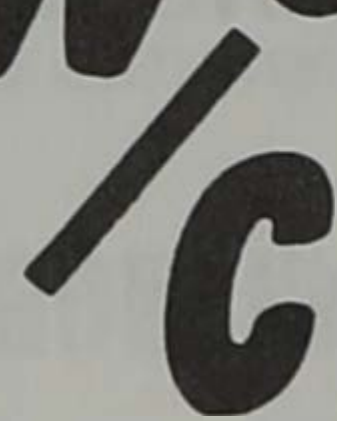

SDSU Beef Breeding Unit

According to Steven Goodfellow, manager of the Beef Breeding Unit, the unit's facilities are used to measure and compare efficiency of various crosses of beef cows. Efficiency is based on feed intake, feed utilization and milk production.

Under the direction of Dr. Don Marshall, the unit is currently housing 220 head of cattle. The 72 crossbred cow herd consists of Simmental/Hereford, Tarentaise/Hereford, and Angus/Hereford. The Antelope Test Station supplies the unit with randomly selected replacement heifers each year.

The cows at the unit are computer fed daily so the feed intake can be recorded. Every 28 days the cows are weighed and milk production is measured. Only a 2% efficiency difference has been found between the breeds over the years.

The feeder calves from the unit are all processed in the Animal Science Meat Lab. Five or six calves will be slaughtered each week beginning the end of April. Data is recorded from the carcasses so the information can be referred back to the dams.

Goodfellow has been the unit manager since August, 1988. He and his wife Arloine, who have three grown children, live by Lake Oakwood.

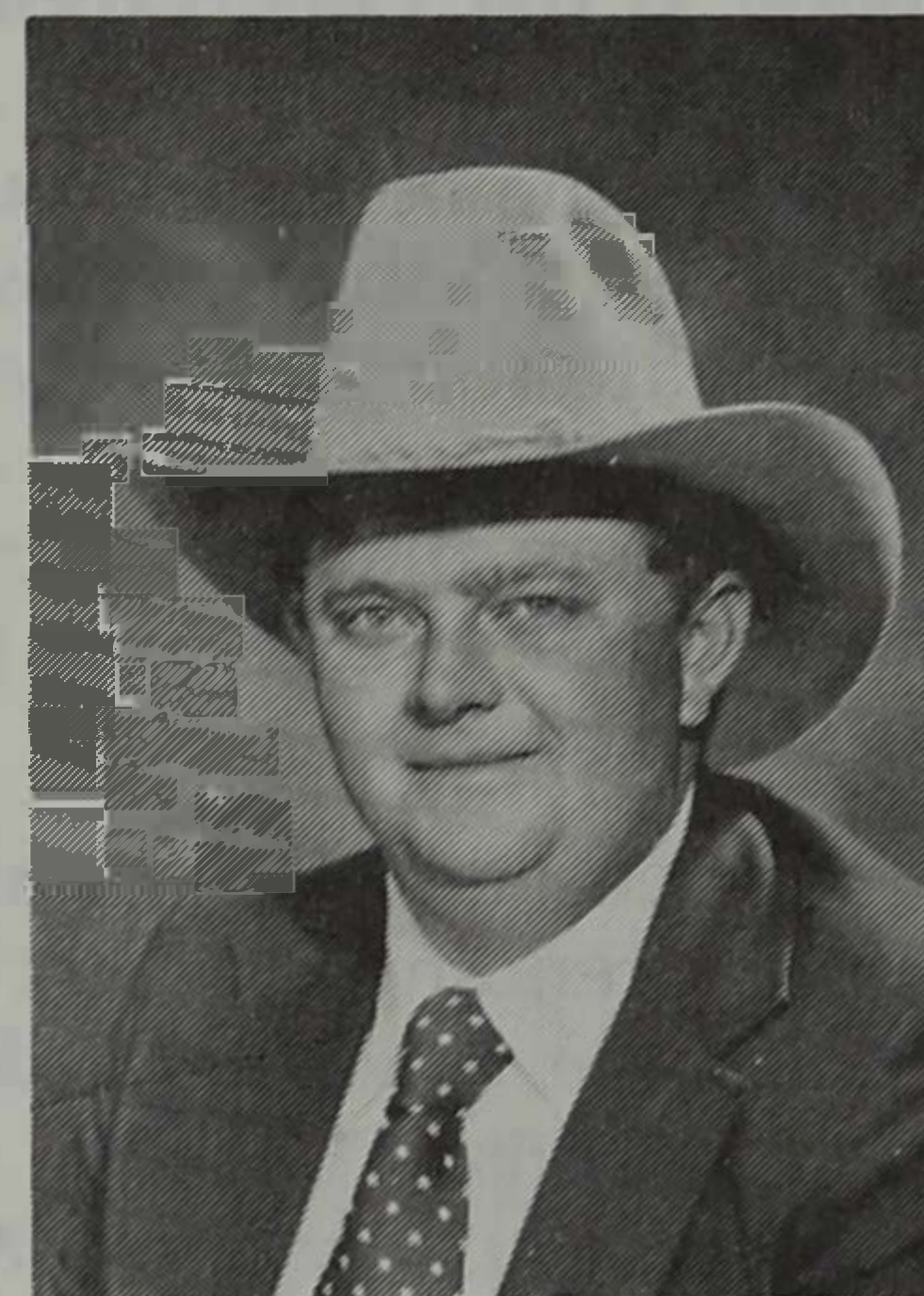


Cow-Calf Teaching and Research Unit

The Cow-Calf Teaching and Research Unit is used for maintaining a purebred herd of Angus and Simmental cows. The herd is used for teaching, research and extension activities. Dr. Richard Pruitt, Assistant professor of Animal Science, is in charge of the unit's projects. Ron Haigh, a 1974 Animal Science graduate of SDSU, has been the manager of the unit since 1979.

This spring 55 Angus and 40 Simmental cows are expected to calve. The cattle shown in Little International were all raised at the unit. The cattle are also used for classroom activities and various field days, as well as 4-H and FFA events. Some of the bulls raised at the unit are used in other research farms in the state, and some are offered for sale private treaty.

Currently, the reproductive physiology research at the unit is under the direction of Dr. Herley Miller.

Lloyd and Mary Alber's generous support of SDSU student activities and national youth activities is sincerely appreciated by the faculty and students at South Dakota State University.

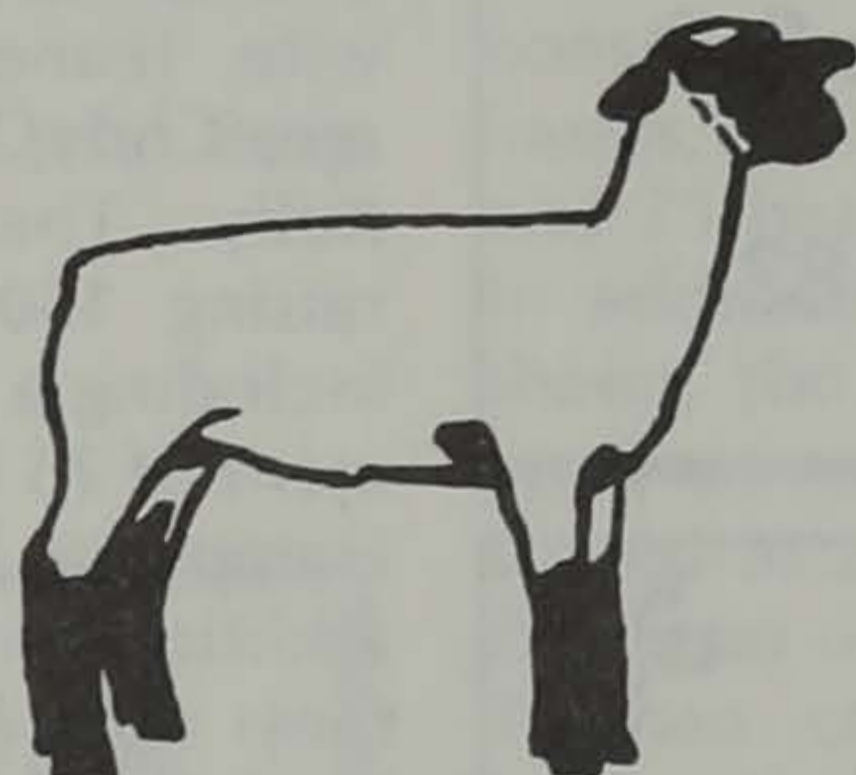

Chris Faller is the SDSU Sheep Unit Manager. He graduated from North Dakota State University in May 1987 with an Animal Science degree and the business option. Chris is a native of Hettinger, N.D., and came to South Dakota State University in August, 1987.



The flock at SDSU currently consists of two purebred breeds, 75 head of Columbias and 75 head of Hampshires. In addition to the purebred sheep, the unit also has 75 head of crossbred ewes involved in a research project, 285 head of Finn, Dorset and Targhee crossbreds, and 20 head of Finn-Dorset crossbred ewes. The purebred ewes are frequently used for classroom teaching and judging schools. Purebred rams are sold by private treaty each year. Lifetime production studies are being conducted on the purebred and crossbred ewes with a farm flock situation. Similar studies are also being done at the Antelope Research Station near Buffalo, S.D. Dr. Lowell Slyter, head of the Sheep Unit, and several graduate students have been doing research on the photo period and how it effects the estrus cycle.

The newest improvement to the unit is a feed line bunk system which was installed last fall.

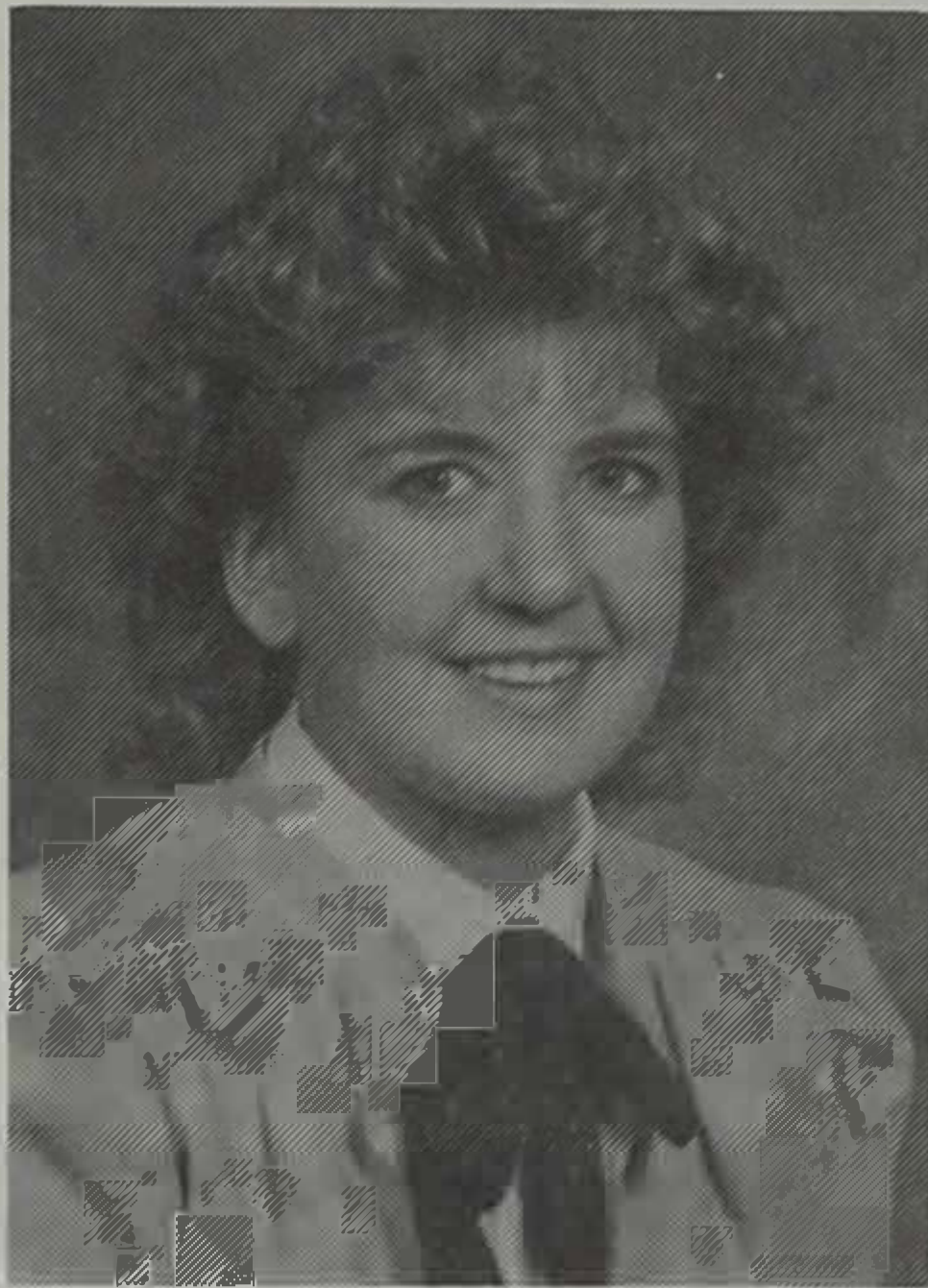


SDSU Horse Unit

The SDSU Horse unit is currently managed by Jodi Dawson, a junior Animal Science major at SDSU. She is assisted by Dr. Larry Insley of the Animal Science Department.

The Horse Unit was built in the 1920's with its purpose to house the draft horse teams that were used to farm the SDSU farmland. Through the efforts of Dr. Jim Kaiser, Animal Scientist at SDSU, American Saddlebreds and Morgans were introduced to the facility in the 1940's. Dr. Paul Kohler took over management of the Horse Unit in 1951 and served in that position until 1985.

The first Quarter Horse brought to SDSU was a 1951 filly named "Gold Duster." She was purchased by Dr. Kohler at the 1952 Denver National Western Quarter Horse sale. This was the beginning of Quarter horse production at



SDSU. Quarter Horses became the only breed at the SDSU unit by the early 1960's.

Draft horses were reintroduced to the unit in 1984 through cooperative efforts with the McCrossan Boys' Ranch, Winfred, S.D. The unit purchased its own team of draft horses in June, 1988.

These heavy draft horses are used in Heavy Horsemanship classes and for special functions of the university. The present Quarter Horse herd is comprised of approximately 35 head. They are used in the light horsemanship class, horse production, and for special campus events such as Hobo Day, Little I, Rodeo Queen Contest, and by the SDSU West Point of the Plains Cavalry Unit.

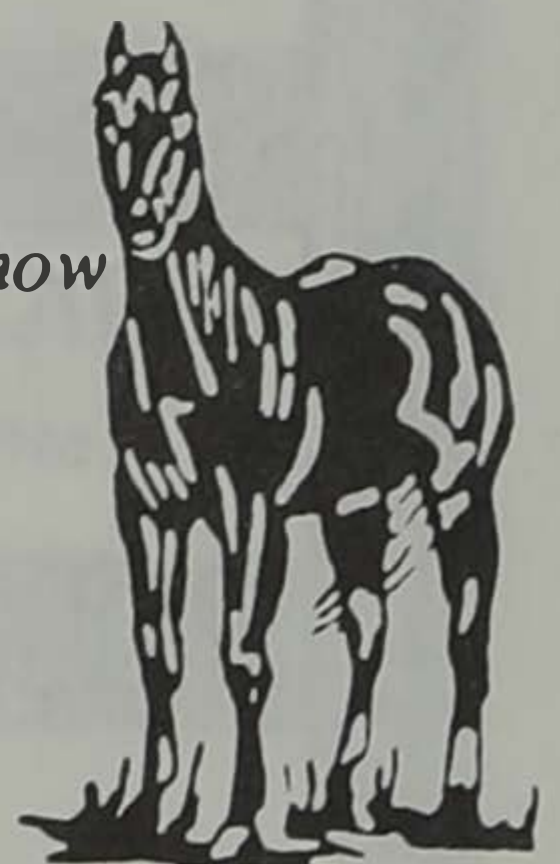

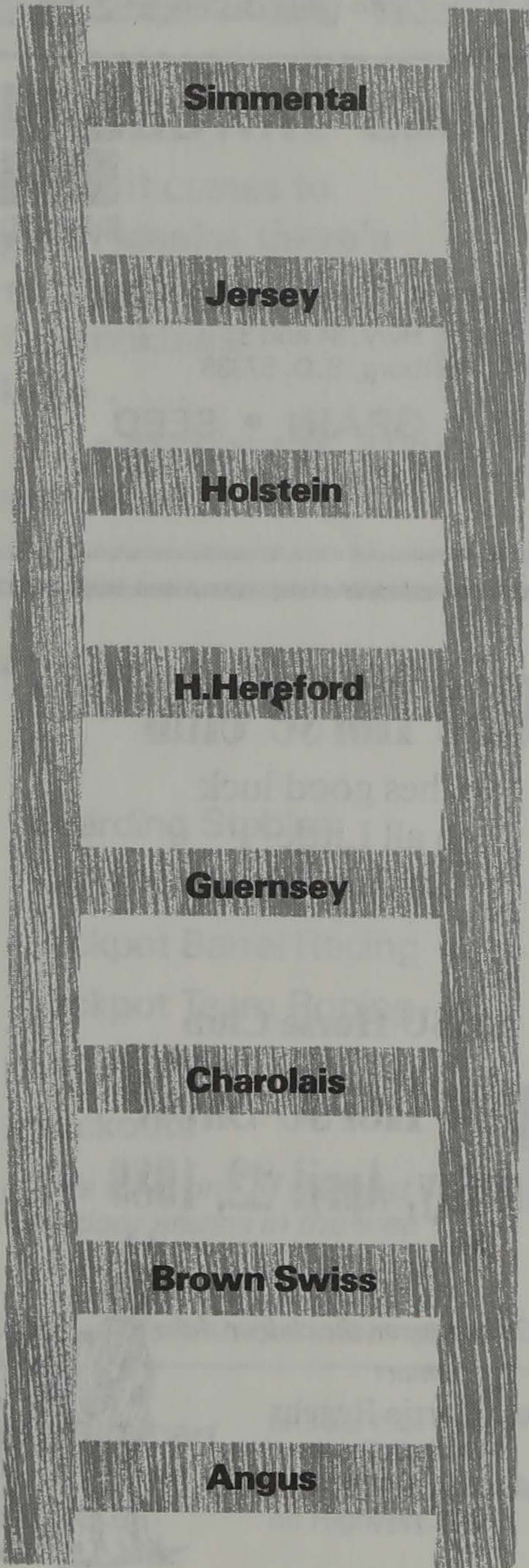

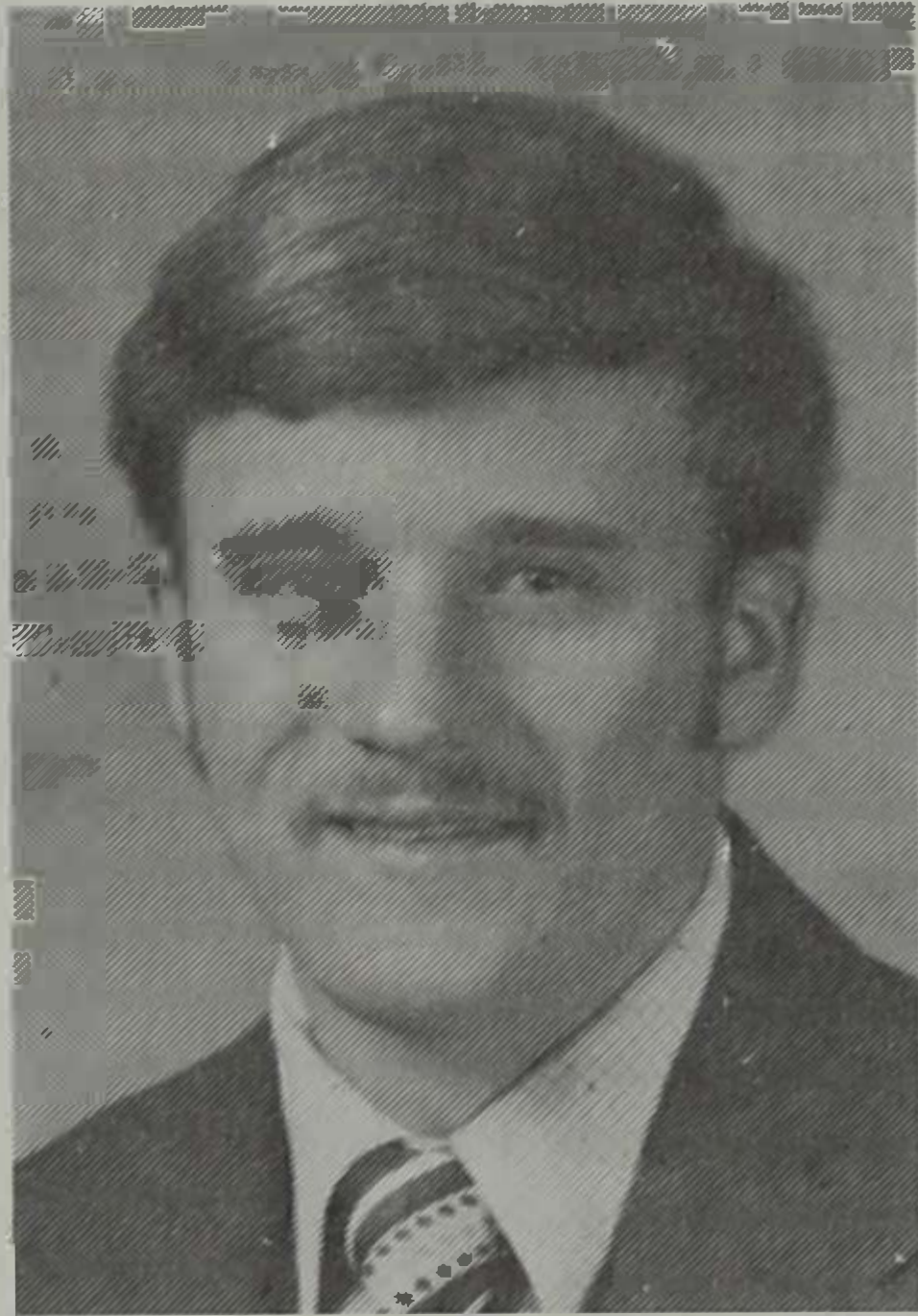

SDSU Dairy Unit

The SDSU Dairy Unit has been managed by Fenton Ludens, a native of Viborg, S.D. for fifteen years. He graduated from SDSU in 1972 with an Agricultural Education major.

Prior to 1964, the Dairy Unit was located where the H.M. Briggs library stands today. The present facilities were built in 1964 and 1965. The SDSU Dairy Unit was appropriated \$5 million from the state legislature in 1988 to build a new barn and parlor. The plans are presently being drawn with hopes to start building next fall.

The herd is comprised of 175 head of Registered Holsteins, 80 of which are milked. Under the direction of Dr. John Parsons, the cattle are used for research, teaching and judging. Some of the research currently being conducted includes a diet where high levels of fat, megalac, are being fed, and a breeding experiment including the use of Bovine Somatotropin.

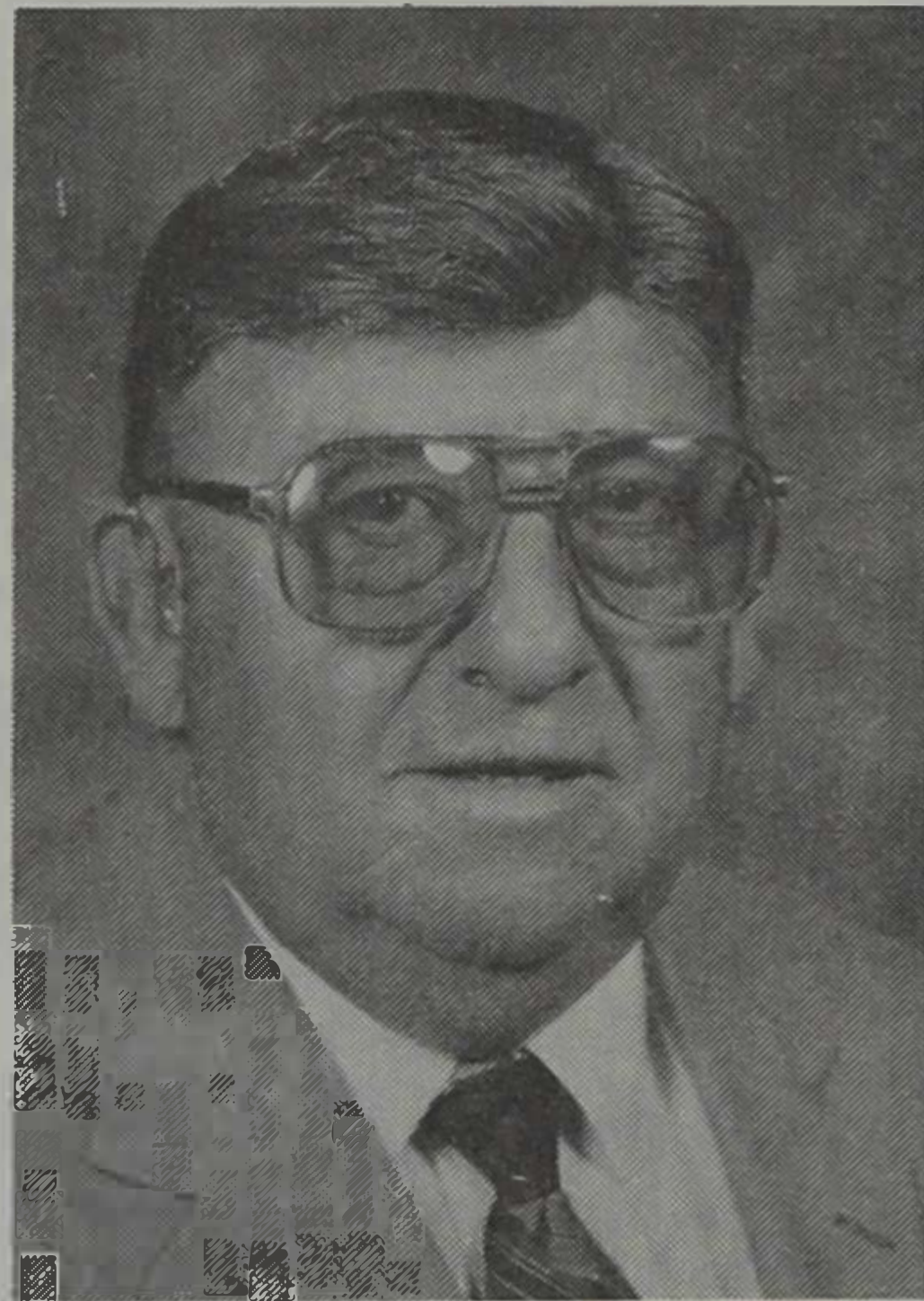

State, Dairy Industry Lose a Friend

The Little International staff sadly reports that Shirley W. Seas, 60, died June 8, 1988. He was Professor of Dairy Science at SDSU where he was actively involved in the Dairy Manufacturing teaching program and managed the Dairy Plant. He started working in the Dairy Plant while an undergraduate at SDSU, and was on the SDSU faculty since 1955.

Professor Seas was best known as an outstanding teacher and as the coach of outstanding dairy products judging teams. Recognitions for his outstanding teaching included: Gamma Sigma Delta Teaching Award (1982), Teacher of the Year for the College of Agriculture and Biological Sciences (1983), American Dairy Science Association Dairy Foods Teaching Award (1983),

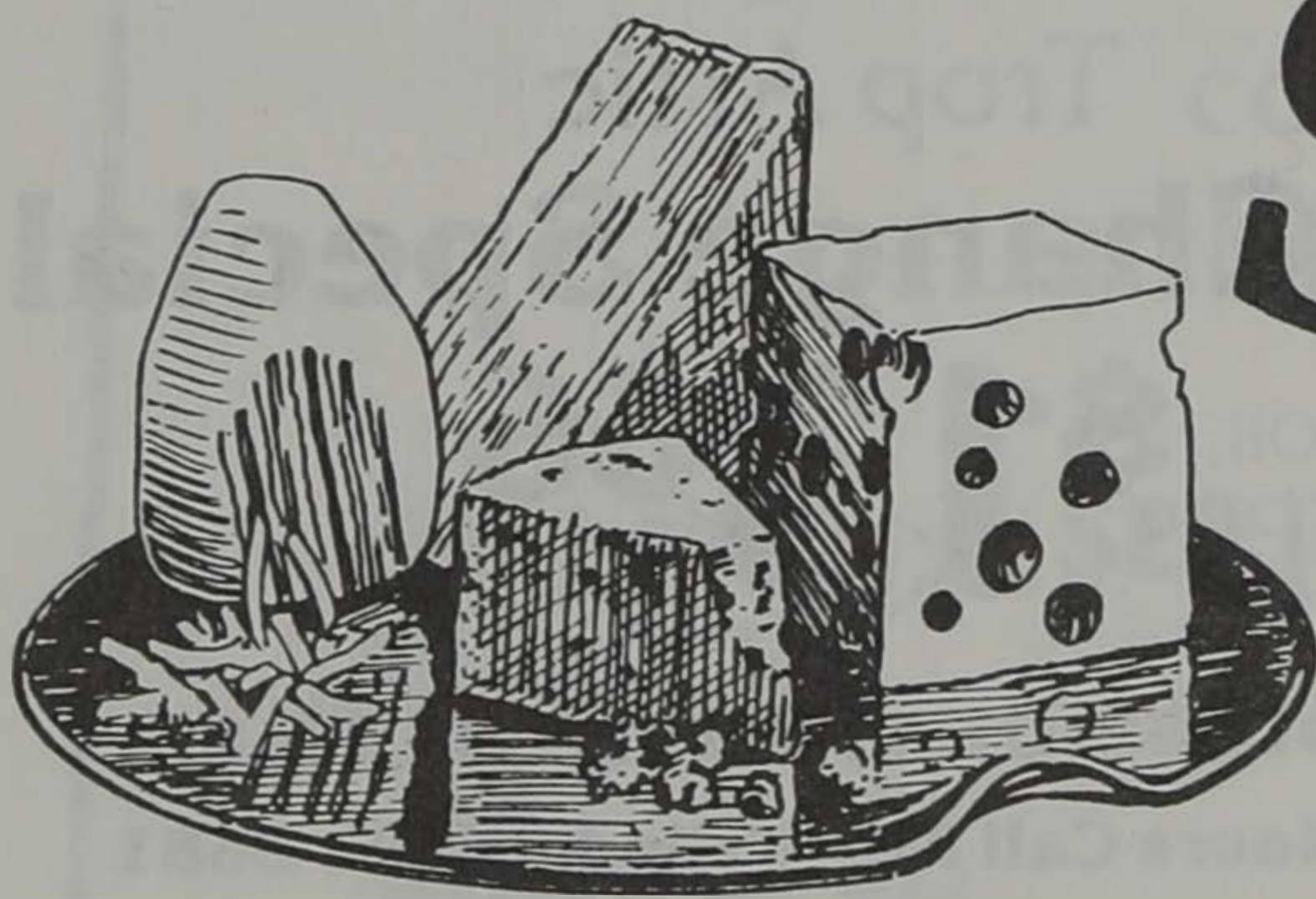


and SDSU Burlington Northern Teaching Award (1987). His dairy products judging teams were always among the best in the nation. The hogs are used for class-room purposes and judging schools. The hogs shown in Little I are from the unit.

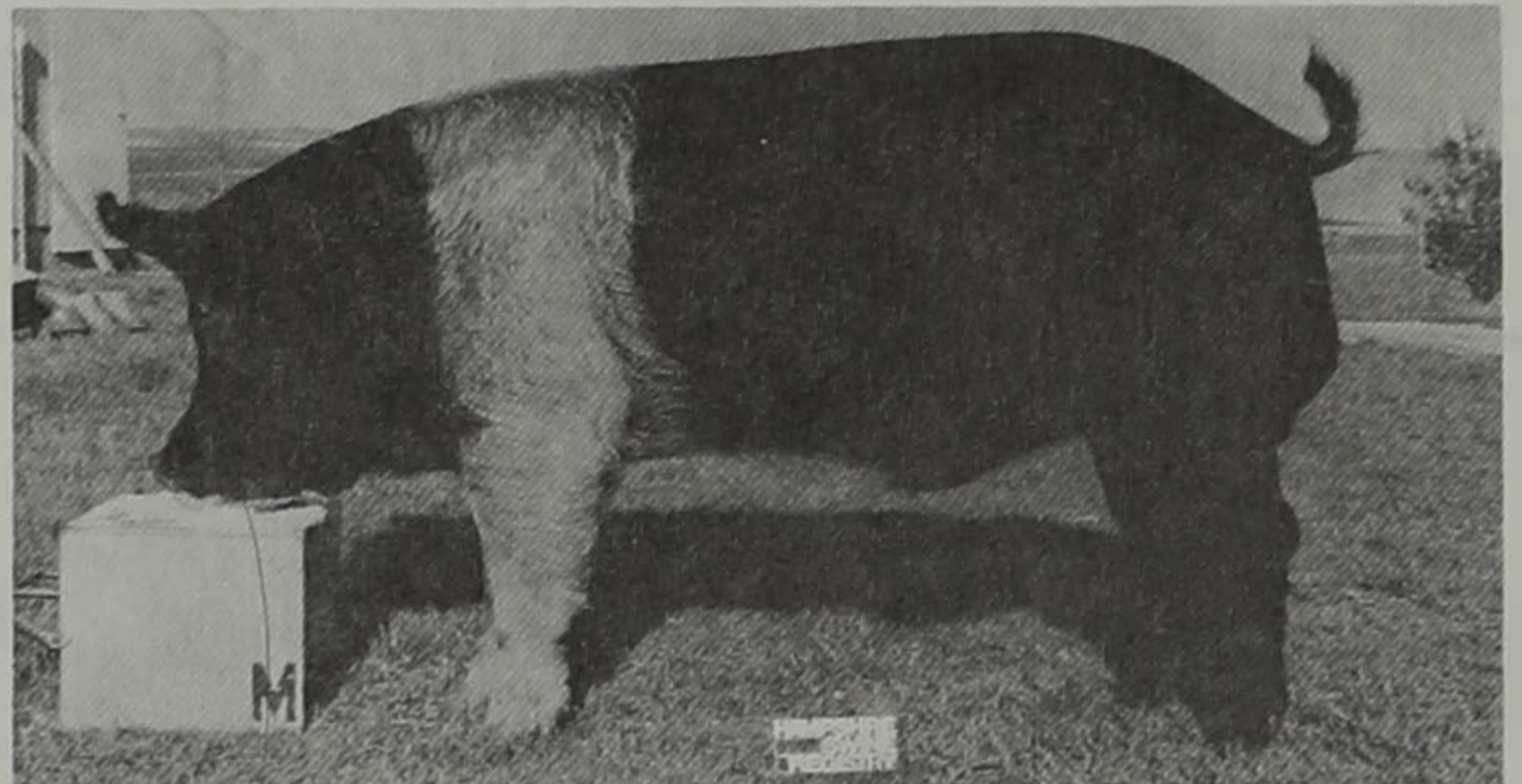
