Ada Caldwell Paintings from the collection continue on exhibition at the Center through the month. The artist was head of the South Dakota State University Art Department during 1899-1936, and during that time had as students such prominent artists as Harvey Dunn, Hubert Mathieu, and Gilbert Risvold. This exhibition is comprised mainly of landscapes, painted during the 1920s and '30s in Brookings, Colorado, Minnesota, and near Woodstock, New York.

The South Dakota Art Faculty Biennial V shows at the Center through January 28 and features recent work by faculty from the colleges and universities in the state. A briefing on this exhibition for Guild and staff members will be held January 8, 9:30 a.m.

A Brief Vacation will show at the Center January 11 at 7:00 p.m. This drama of one woman's liberation from her demanding and ungrateful family is a change of pace for director Vittorio De Sica. This will be the first showing of the Cafe Cinema's spring mini-season, followed by Tony Richardson's Tom Jones (February 1) and The Loneliness of the Long Distance Runner (March 1), and Francois Truffaut's Small Change (April 26). Season tickets are on sale now at the Center and the SDSU Student Union Ticket Office.

Mitakuye Oyasin, the special exhibition of the Clark Collection of Sioux artifacts scheduled for February, will be discussed at a planning session for Guild and staff members at the Center January 15 at 10:00 a.m. People in the community who are interested in Sioux culture are encouraged to attend this session.

Richard Hunt, the internationally known sculptor from Chicago, will present an illustrated lecture on his work in the Center auditorium January 17 at 8:00 p.m. The public is invited to attend. Hunt will be in Brookings to select the commission and cash awards for the Center's National Sculpture Competition. A graduate of the Art Institute of Chicago, Hunt's work is represented in such major collections as the Museum of Modern Art in New York, Art Institute of Chicago, Cleveland Museum of Art, and the National Museum of Israel in Jerusalem.

Center Trustees will meet at the Center January 25 at 10:00 a.m.
